Be to me my restorer, for you restore my peace and my strength.


Be to me my rest, for You are my resting place.

Families Reaching Families with the Gospel

It's no secret that families all around us are struggling. Finances. Broken relationships. Raising children. Health problems. The pressure can feel overwhelming at times. While there are many programs today that help serve these needs, it is their spiritual need that is often neglected.

How about your own family? How is your spiritual health?

Well, one of the ways to approach both problems is to reach out to another family in need. When we step out of our circle, our comfort zone, to help someone else, we allow our own spiritual health to grow.

Last year, Barna Research released a study on the state of Christian families in our country. They found families who engaged in daily devotional time and regularly invited others into their homes contained a greater "spiritual vibrancy" than families that did either one of those activities alone (Households of Faith, 2019).

As Christians, we often talk about the five means of spiritual growth: Bible Study, Prayer, Worship, Fellowship, and Witness. While the first three can be practiced both individually and together as a family, church, or small group, the last two can only be practiced with other people. In other words, we grow spiritually when we do it together as a community.

So how can your family be more intentional about growing spiritually as a family and reaching others in need?

- 1. Invite another family to your home for a cookout or dinner. Share your story with them about how God has met the needs of your life.
- 2. Help meet someone's physical needs in your community. Then pray for them. Let them know that God cares about their spiritual health as well as their physical needs.
- 3. Offer to study the Bible together in your home or at a coffee shop. Choose a book of the Bible or a study that is appropriate for their situation. Then ask others to join you.
- 4. Invite them to join you at church. Be intentional about connecting them with other families who can form a loving support network around them.

If you have children, include them. Brainstorm as a family about different ways you can help out families in your community. Get creative. Then make a plan. Make your efforts a family outreach. Children can actively participate in all areas of spiritual growth. Plus, it will allow us to model Scripture in our everyday lives.

By actively reach out and engaging with other families outside of the home, we not only have the opportunity to share the Gospel with other families in our community, but we also put ourselves in a position to grow spiritually and to draw closer together. In doing so, we honor God individually and as a family.



Let's Pray

In Psalm 11:3, we see God asking the righteous a question. "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" I read where a news reporter once asked someone the following question, "What are the two greatest problems facing America?" The man replied, "I really don't know---and I really don't care!" Whether the man realized



it or not, he answered the reporter's question. The two greatest problems facing our nation are (1) Ignorance----"I don't know" and (2) Apathy----"I don't care." No two single factors are working harder to destroy the very foundations of our nation than Ignorance----"I don't know." And Apathy----"I don't care." Three thousand years ago King David asked this very probing question when he asked; "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do." We are right now living in a time when many of the moral and ethical values that formed our great nation are crumbling right before our very eyes. What are the foundations that have made America great under God, but are being destroyed right before our

The Foundation of Dignity-v3 Do you know what made America a great nation under God? Human dignity and the value of human life is what made this a great nation under God. But sadly, that foundation has now been destroyed. It was destroyed when the courts in our land ruled that innocent, defenseless, unborn children have no right to life. For some people, these precious little lives are simply globs of flesh, undeserving of any human dignity. The foundation of human dignity and the value of human life is being destroyed right before our very eyes. SO, the words of King David should echo throughout our land and these words should be spoken throughout the halls of Congress and the United States Senate---- "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" Then the second foundation that has made America great under God is:

The Foundation of Devotion- One of the things that has made our nation great is our devotion to God---our devotion to the home---and our devotion to the country. Was not this great land of ours birthed because of our ancestor's devotion to God? Our devotion to God also came from some of our oldest educational colleges. Did you know that each of our nation's oldest colleges was founded by a Bible-based denomination wanting primarily to do one thing----train ministers? Harvard was founded in 1636 by New England Puritans. For years, Harvard was so devoted to God that their commencement addresses were given in Hebrew. Princeton was founded in 1746 by the Presbyterians. The Anglicans founded Columbia in 1754. And the Baptists founded Brown in 1764. And the list goes on and on. But that devotion is no longer found in our colleges and universities today. You would be hard-pressed to even find the Ten Commandments on display at any of these places of higher education today. The foundation of devotion is being destroyed right before our very eyes. SO, King David's question, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do" is a question we should be taking seriously before our devotion to God, our devotion to home, and our devotion to our country, become forgotten words in our vocabulary. Then the third foundation that has made America great under God is:

The Foundation of Duty-One of the things that has set our nation apart through the years has been our work ethic. I'm thankful that I was brought up in a home where I was made to work whether I wanted to work or not. Hard-working people is what has made our country great. But like the other foundations that I have mentioned, this foundation is also being destroyed right before our very eyes. We are now living in the age of entitlements. Duty is crumbling right before us as more and more people feel entitled to live off of some type of federal financial assistance. Hard work has always been the key to success in our country and it always will be. It still does my heart good to see young people who are not afraid to go out and do an honest day's work for an honest day's pay. SO, the words of King David asking the question should be sounded loudly and clearly throughout our land today. It doesn't need to be a whisper. This needs to be shouted and even roared throughout our land. "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" Our duty to get out and work is being destroyed right before our very eyes. Then the fourth and final foundation that has made America great under God is:

The Foundation of Decency-v3 Common decency is being destroyed right before our very eyes. Common decency and basic morality have been the foundation that has made America great under God. But today, common decency and basic morality are being radically redefined. Do you remember seeing the movie "Gone with the Wind?" What's the one line you remember most in that movie? It was where Rhett said to Scarlet, "Frankly my dear, I don't give a damn." Now excuse me for saying that, but I'm making a point here. Back in the day, when this line was spoken it sent shock waves throughout our land. Many people in our land went into an uproar over it and condemned it. YET, today that four-letter word has been replaced with a lot of other four-letter words that I cannot mention in this paper, and these words are looked upon today as being acceptable and even laughable. Most television networks now show nudity and it goes without complaint from anyone. Pornography is now a multibillion-dollar industry. And today, lifestyles that not very long ago were hidden in dark alleys and closets are now paraded proudly down Main Street in almost every American metro city and even in smaller towns across our land. So the foundation of dignity---devotion---duty---and decency are being destroyed right before our very eyes. But we still haven't answered the question, have we? The question again is this: "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" Surely we wouldn't say, "I don't know and I don't care." SO, what is the answer folks? Well, to know the answer we must look at the root of the problem. And the root of the problem is not a political problem. The root of the problem is a spiritual problem. So when the spiritual foundations which made America great are being destroyed right

before our very eyes, what can we the righteous do? I will tell you what we can do. It's three words. WE CAN PRAY. When the foundations are being destroyed all around us, what can we do? WE CAN PRAY.

Let's pray that these great four spiritual foundations---The foundation of Dignity---The foundation of Devotion---The foundation of Duty---The foundation of Decency might be restored before we witness the complete and final fall of our nation spiritually. Let's Pray!

What We Believe

Here are some of the essential elements of our faith at the Blue Ridge Christian News:

God

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He has existed eternally in three persons and chooses to manifest Himself in these three ways: as God the Father, as God the Son, and as God the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and are one God.

Jesus

Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who is fully God and fully human in His incarnation. He lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all humanity by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to heaven and will return again to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. (Matthew 1:22-23; Isaiah 9:6; John 1:1-5; 14:10-30; Hebrews 4:14-15; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; Romans 1:3-4; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Timothy 6:14-15; Titus 2:13)

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the very Spirit of God, fully divine, manifested in the life of every believer from the moment of salvation. He is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His daily control.

The Bibl

At the moment that our physical body dies, those who are saved are immediately taken to heaven. Those who have rejected God's gift of salvation will spend eternity separated from God in hell. Because God gives man eternal life through Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and eternal power of God that gives this security.

Salvation

We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.

What are Human Beings That You Are Mindful of Them?

"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?" --- Psalm 8:3-4 (NRSV)



"What are human beings that you are mindful of them?"

According to the most recent data published in Bloomberg, the Environmental Protection Agency set the value of a life at \$10 million. The Food and Drug Administration declared that life is worth \$9.5 million. And the Department of Agriculture has determined that one life is worth \$8.9 million (Dave Merrill, "No One Values Your Life More Than the Federal Government," 10/19/17).

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them?" Perhaps you never have considered the worth of one human life, whether the life of another or your own life. No doubt, all of us have experienced times when we felt our value was insignificant or overlooked. With everything we have, we often strive to earn and prove our value and significance. But God says we have value and are significant because He made us and we belong to Him. Human life is sacred "from the womb to the tomb" (to borrow a phrase from Shane Claiborne), which is why we should be troubled by the deaths of George Floyd and Ahmaud Arbery. Floyd, a 46-year-old black man, died after pleading for help as a Minneapolis police officer used his knee on Floyd's neck to pin him – unarmed and handcuffed – to the ground for several minutes. Arbery, a 22-year-old black man, was chased down and killed by two white men while jogging in Georgia.

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them?" Psalm 8 is a hymn that echoes the account of creation in Genesis. In comparison with the vastness of the creation – the heavens, the moon, and the stars, humanity appears to be insignificant. Yet, the Creator of the universe takes thought of us and cares for us. God has crowned us with glory and honor. We are made in the image of God and appointed as stewards of the world God created.

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them?" There is awe-inspiring comfort in the message that we matter to God. God takes a personal interest in us. And all we have to do to see the price that He places on the worth of one human life is look to Jesus. "God demonstrates His love for us in this: "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

As followers of Christ, we not only are commissioned to share this good news but also to speak out against injustice. And we pray and work to this end – that the Kingdom of God would come, and that His will would be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Prayer: Lord, help us to see each person through your eyes, and to value them as one created in your image and for whom Jesus gave His life.

"I was in prison, and ye came unto me." (Matthew 25:36) Joseph, Samson, Jeremiah, Micaiah, Zedekiah, Daniel, John the Baptist, Peter, James, John, Silas, Paul, Epaphras, Aristarchus, Junia, and even Jesus himself are listed in the Scriptures as having spent some 'time in prison'.

There are some familiar names included in this list, names that most people easily recognize for their significance in Biblical history. Others are much more obscure,

perhaps even unknown. Their names are more likely included in the "advanced" levels of Bible trivia (only to be heard on episodes of "Jeopardy") and their contribution(s) to the history of God's saving work in this world is virtually forgotten. But they contributed nonetheless...This fact cannot be ignored! While their small part in the dramatic expression of Divine love to the world (See John 3:16) may not have earned them great acclaim, their service in God's kingdom brought them into the permanent record of God's mercy and grace found in the Holy Scriptures.

A percentage of people whose lives are inextricably bound to the testimony of the Bible spent time in prison. I shared this thought with someone recently who responded by saying 'But imprisoned people in the Bible were fulfilling the

will of God in their life'. I responded, "Yeah...Sounds like a plan!"

During these days that have now become months of absence of volunteers among us who try to bring hope to the incarcerated by investing their time and energy to come inside the prison, I have had multiplied opportunities to preach and teach in an attempt to 'fill the void'. And I have witnessed firsthand the enor-



mous void created by the absence of our usual religious volunteers in particular. Regularly I am asked how our volunteers are doing, when they might be returning and how we as a body of believers 'on the inside' can pray for them.

It occurred to me recently how the choice to visit those in prison puts the people who enter here to serve this population in some pretty notable company. Sure, some volunteers are more well-known among this population than others. But every single one of them contributes to the overall well-being of the men who reside here and ultimately contribute to the good of us all.

And how every single one of them is actually ministering to the Lord Jesus when they come. Every. Single. One.

Thank you to all who have prayed for us through these long and anxious days of the pandemic. Thank you to those who are preparing to enter and join us in this place when the day finally comes that it is safe for you to return to us. Every time that I am gathered together with the men for Christian worship or Bible study, they speak of our need to pray for all of you. And when they do, my heart overflows with gratitude for the foundation of love and care that you have poured into their lives.

You never know how the incarcerated person you minister to is going to be used to further tell the story of the Love of our Creator God and the saving Grace of Jesus Christ, His Son! "Yeah! Sounds like a plan!"



"There was Jesus"










Obedient Heart Fellowship

Out of Bondage

from ancient time, what is yet to come, saying, 'My purpose will stand, and I will accomplish all that I please.'"

Believers who consider themselves "New Testament Christians" should investigate the layers of truth contained in Isaiah 46:9-10. One of the many difficulties of attempting to understand the final third of the Bible without the context of the first two-thirds is that God began explaining the end of our age at the beginning of His book. At a time when many Americans are giving thanks for freedom, perhaps believers should remember God's deliverance from ultimate bondage.

Freedom is the theme of the second book of the Bible. Exodus begins with God's people enslaved to the most powerful nation on earth. The Hebrew word for "Egypt" is "Mitzrayim." It means a "narrow place" or a "place to come out of." More significant than physical bondage was Israel's entrapment in a culture of polytheism. Each of the ten plagues was an affront to one or more Egyptian "gods." The process God used to lead His children out of Egypt bears striking resemblance to prophecies found in the Book of Revelation. Consider a few parallels:

Both events hinge on the work of two witnesses. In Exodus 4:15-16, God instructs Moses that he and Aaron will be messengers to the Israelites and the Egyptians. Both men played pivotal roles in communicating God's instructions and proclamations as the Exodus unfolded. Revelation 11:3-6 tells of "two witnesses" who will speak on God's behalf. These witnesses will have the power to withhold rain, strike the earth with plagues and turn water into blood. These are direct parallels to Moses and Aaron. The comparison is even more striking since verse 8 gives the location of the ministry of the two witnesses as "The great city that figuratively is called Sodom and Egypt—where also their Lord was crucified." The significance of Jerusalem being referenced by two names which are synonymous with sin and rebellion cannot be overstated. The heart of God's kingdom will become a place His children must escape. The work of Satan and his beastly representative will cause Jerusalem to become as morally bankrupt as Sodom and ancient Egypt.

Another parallel between Exodus and Revelation is the first plague. God turned the waters of Egypt into the blood. Egyptians worshipped the Nile. They were forced to learn that their river is creation, not a creator. Similar plagues are found in Revelation 8:8, 8:10, and 16:3-4. No doubt many Egyptians died from lack of water. People around the world will die near the end.

Also common to these passages is a plague of debilitating boils. Some scholars propose that the "furnace" mentioned in Exodus 9:8-11 was an altar for human sacrifice. See also Revelation 16:2. During the Exodus, Israelites did not suffer this plague. In Revelation, it only happens to those who bear the mark of the beast.

A fourth parallel is a wilderness. Moses tells Pharaoh several times, including 5:1, that God wanted His people to travel into the wilderness to worship Him. After the tenth plague, they did. In Revelation 12:14, the woman, who represents the Nation of Israel, is borne into the wilderness for her protection.

Revelation 12 also contains a passage that is key to understanding who will be saved. Verse 17 defines the woman's offspring as "Those who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus." This qualification is stated again in Revelation 14:12 which defines "the saints" as "those who keep the commandment of God and the faith of Jesus." Revelation 22:14 says: "How fortunate are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the Tree of Life and may enter through the gates into the city." "Wash their robes" is a Hebrew idiom which means "obey God's commands."

Exodus is a type and shadow of end-time events. Pharaoh demanded obedience to his decrees, Satan, and his beast will do the same. In both situations, obedience to God's instructions is crucial. Israelites who did not place the blood of the lamb on their door frames did not escape the death angel. Believers who do not obey God's Torah and keep faith in Messiah will have no part in the Millennial Kingdom. Between now and then, we have much to do. Many have heard of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, but few appear willing to follow Him on His terms: turning from sin and obeying scripture. Such obedience requires intimate knowledge of the Bible.

Many prophecies detail the greater exodus God will use to bring His children together at the end of the age. Revelation 11:4 says that the "two witnesses" are "two olive trees." They represent the House of Judah and the House of Israel which will be reunited. The marvelous prophecy in Ezekiel 39:25-29 says that God is going to lead the scattered family of Jacob—which Gentiles are allowed to join through the work of Messiah—out of the wilderness and into the Promised Land. There we will experience the absence of pain and death and sorrow. There we will drink Living Water, eat of the Tree of Life, and walk in the Light of God's presence. Never again will we shed a tear. The key to such marvelous freedom is found in the words of that simple, old hymn: Trust and Obey.

The Difference Prayer Makes

Read Acts 12:1-19a "So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him." Acts 12:5. As we review the events of Acts 12:1-19, a question comes to mind; Why was James killed (see verses 1-2), and Peter delivered? Could God not have saved James as well? There is no question that He could have. Well, why didn't He?



The only answer that this chapter suggests is found in Verse 5. Peter was kept in prison, just as James. But the difference was that earnest prayer to God was made for Peter by the church, and as a result, Peter was set free. You say, What difference does it make? Couldn't God just have set Peter free anyhow? If God determined that James would die and Peter would be set free, what difference did the prayer of the church make? But let us never forget what James (not this James, but Jesus' brother, who wrote The Epistle of James) says: "You have not because you ask not." (James 4:2). In his wisdom, God has designed that His people shall participate in what He does. He is impressing upon His people here that when danger threatens the program of God or the people of God, it is a call to prayer. God will hear that prayer and answer it and set people free when He would not have done so otherwise. This is the great lesson of this chapter. We are not to take the events of our day for granted, as though there were nothing we could do about them. Prayer becomes a mighty, powerful thrust on the part of the people of God, to change events. Prayer is the most natural response of a heart that is dependent upon God. If you are counting upon God to do something, then you will pray about it. You will trust Him; you will communicate with Him. If you are not counting on Him, you will not pray. If you are really counting on something else, or on someone else — if you think that by your own clever maneuvering you can get out of a situation, or if you are trusting other human beings to come through - you will not pray. The basic motive of prayer is a sense of dependence. If you really think that God, and God alone, can work and that there are elements of a situation in which only He can change things — then you pray. This is what happened to this early church. When they realized that James had been put to death and that this vicious attack of the enemy could be successful, it suddenly crystallized in their minds that they had a part to play in God's program. They were to go to God in earnest prayer that Peter might be delivered. And God set him free in a wonderful way. This passage highlights for us what prayer does, and that is basic for us to learn today. God works, in the same way, today as He did in these first-century days, and he will respond to our prayers in very much the same way. Father, teach me how to pray. I don't always need to know what to pray for, but I do so desperately need to pray. I need to pray for others; to pray about the dangers that beset us as a nation and as a world. Help me to open my heart and be honest before you. I know that in the mystery of prayer, a mystery that I cannot fathom, something is happening that makes possible the activity of your Spirit to work in unusual ways, ways that otherwise would never happen. When prayer is worship, the focus is on the character and will of God. Are we learning to worship Him by praying Jesus' prayer: '....nevertheless, not my will but Thine be done'?

Defeating Worry Through Prayer

The last several months have demonstrated the reality that we live in troublesome times. We have witnessed firsthand the reality of the sinfulness of mankind and the shocking actions that many have taken. The times in which we live have manifested themselves in a variety of responses for believers. While some have become more courageous, others have become more fearful.



Worry is a reality that I think every believer battles to different degrees. Its commonality among people has caused some to disregard its sinfulness before God. Worry cripples us spiritually, not enabling us to grow in a manner that is pleasing to God. Philippians 4:6-7 indicates that one of the means by which worry is defeated is through prayer.

Paul issued two commands in Philippians 4:6: "be careful for nothing" and "let your requests be made known." The first command implies action that is already occurring and needs to stop. They were full of care, and Paul commanded them to stop. Worry is the fleshly response to situations, the outcome of which I cannot control. Regardless of how we attempt to justify worry, we must realize that worry is inevitable when I fail to look to God in prayer.

According to Philippians 4:6, the solution to worry is prayer. Using different terms that have only a slight distinction, Paul commands believers to continuously pray while maintaining a thankfulness for each situation God is doing in my life. The result of such prayer is promised in verse 7: "And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." God has promised those who stop worrying and continuously pray that His peace will guard our hearts and minds. Such peace exceeds our ability to comprehend.

Maybe you are worried about something you are facing. Since worry is the opposite of faith, allow me to ask a few questions in closing.

- 1. Is God worthy of my trust? This establishes the faithfulness of God. Until we establish the faithfulness of God in our own minds, we will naturally place our confidence upon that which we believe is reliable.
- 2. Is God capable? This establishes the competence of God. Until we establish the competence of God in our own minds, we will naturally place our confidence in that which we believe is sufficient.
- 3. Who am I in Christ? This establishes the relationship with God. Until we establish our identity as believers who belong to Him and embrace the implications of security that such a position demands, we will naturally place our confidence in that which we believe is secure.

This list is not intended to be exhaustive, but I believe it captures much of the essence of why we worry. The moment I disregard God's faithfulness, God's competence, and my position in Him I will inevitably be filled with fear. Prayer is the means through which worry can be defeated.

NCBAM Hope Line Now Offers Outbound Calls to Seniors

When North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry (NCBAM) began its Hope Line service in the summer of 2019 to address social isolation and loneliness among older adults, no one imagined the societal changes that would occur nine months later. Over just a

few days in March 2020, calls to the Hope Line increased exponentially. To meet the demand, the ministry opened the service on weekends and added two lines.

Now open daily, 9:00 am - 9:00 pm, the Hope Line (866.578.4673) continues to receive more than 100 calls each week from older adults—many of whom have been living in isolation for years. Other callers are new to the experience because of self-isolation measures or stay-at-home orders, many of whom are now alone and also experiencing feelings of fear and uncertainty. NCBAM team members and volunteers trained in evidence-based health coach techniques focus on listening and allowing callers to have a safe space to express themselves.

Knowing that many individuals most in need of a friendly call service may not initiate a call, the Hope Line now offers outbound calls. The service is free and can be requested by calling 877.506.2226 or by emailing ncbam@bchfamily.org. A link will be sent to sign up for the "friendly call" service. Call recipients must be 65 or older and live in North Carolina. Requests can be made by individuals themselves or by a family member or caregiver.

Whitney Brooks, Board Certified Integrative Health Coach through Duke Integrative Medicine developed and teaches the training provided to all Hope Line communicators. When the pandemic brought unprecedented challenges, Brooks responded with extra guidance. "Many of the incoming Hope Line calls are heavy conversations, and when a volunteer has three of these in a row, that can be pretty stressful. We've updated the training to incorporate self-care strategies so that volunteers can learn how to maintain and nourish their emotional health while helping others." NCBAM has also implemented a monthly support group meeting for Hope Line volunteers.

NCBAM's director, Dr. Sandy C. Gregory, began the Hope Line because of the adverse health risks associated with social isolation and loneliness and is now more concerned than ever. "More than one million North Carolinians 65+ are currently experiencing an increased level of isolation – and for an indeterminate length of time. NCBAM wants to help as many as possible by making the Hope Line available for both inbound and outbound calls."

The Inspiring Word

"I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth." Job 19:25.

Here we are in July, I want to begin by wishing everyone a happy and safe Independence Day. I encourage you to take a few moments, reflect on our Declaration of Independence, or better yet read it and remember the faith, dedication, and determination of our founding fathers.



Since March 2020 America has been dealing with one issue after another and it appears to me that many of us have forgotten how to deal with each other. There seems to be a lot of finger-pointing and name-calling. There is killing, violence, rioting, and looting. Some of this comes from evil and some of it comes from emotion. God's word gives us sound wisdom for dealing with what appears to us to be unfair circumstances.

The Bible tells us Job was a righteous man, yet God allowed things to happen in his life that seemed very unfair. My background scripture for this month is Job 19:1-7 & 19:23-29 and my key verse is printed above, Job 19:25.

Within our justice system is the concept of presumption of innocence (also known as innocent until proven guilty). This isn't something invented by America, it goes back many centuries. In the simplest form, it means the burden of proof is on the prosecution to honestly prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt. Yes, this practice allows from time to time a guilty person to walk free, but it is one of the best safeguards to keep innocent people from being unjustly convicted.

Job believed in this type of justice. There was one problem, as far as Job could tell his friends were not extending the benefit of the doubt to him. After seeing Job his friends seemed to presume him guilty until proven innocent.

We may remember going through times like these when it seemed we were being punished for no reason. Through this frustration, we pour out our hearts to God and nothing seems to change. People close to us may think we deserve what we are getting. Family and friends become desensitized to our situation. Never give up, hold on to the hope God will do something about the problem. This is where we find Job.

The story of Job is a lengthy one, if you haven't read it, I suggest you take time and do so, you will receive many blessings from his testimony. From his story we learn that over time Job developed a complaint, how long will this continue? Job was counseled by three friends who gave some very bad advice. They were convinced Job's troubles were of his own making, they accused him of sin and told him God was punishing him.

There is a twofold lesson here. First be careful who you seek counsel from making sure they are capable of giving sound godly advice, free from their personal opinion. Second, you maybe ask at some point to give counsel, if that happens prayerfully take time to understand and be sensitive to the one asking you for help. If you cannot approach the person with an innocent until proven guilty attitude, then you better refer them elsewhere. Then pray for them and yourself as they seek answers.

So how does Job 19:25 fit into all of this? Job was resilient in reaching for hope when there seemed to be no hope. He knew God as a kinsman-redeemer, someone Job needed in his life and that redeemer would be standing when everyone and everything else was gone. Is God your redeemer today? Have you accepted Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior? If not, I want to encourage you to do so, you know He is calling you to salvation, why continue to reject Him. I have talked with many folks who have walked away from church because of circumstances like Job went through. Let me encourage you to be resilient, get back in church, look to your redeemer, and place your hope in Him.

The testimony of Job's faith gives us reason to hope! When it seems as though our world is falling apart, we can draw strength from the fact we have Jesus and His promise to never leave us or forsake us, His promise of a resurrection. If Job could find faith in his day and his situation then we should be able to do the same. We can learn from Job's testimony how to deal with others during difficult times and how to lean on God daily with faith and resilience. What about the other people, the friends of Job? Let God deal with them, Job did, and everything turned out fine. Until we meet again, in person, or print may God Bless you is my prayer.

Habits of the Heart: A Study of the Spiritual Disciplines "Submission"

In this monthly series of articles, I have chosen to survey twelve (one each month) spiritual habits of the heart or spiritual disciplines that we must pursue in our faith in

or spiritual disciplines that we must pursue in our faith journey to maturity in Christ. Richard Foster, in his book Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth (Harper & Row, 1978), divides these twelve into three categories: Inward disciplines; Outward disciplines; and Corporate disciplines. Today, look with me at the spiritual discipline of "submission," which is considered to be one of the outward disciplines. An "outward" discipline seeks to take us from the immediate presence of the Lord and present us as living witnesses of Jesus to the world around us. Each of these is not outward-focused, however—meaning, the focus is not on what we do—but rather, on the attitudes of our heart that find expression beyond ourselves.

James commanded (James 4:7-8), "Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded." He continued in verse 10, "Humble yourselves in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you."

The word "submit" is a difficult word for our modern society, much less the modern-day church. Perhaps it is because individuals have seen and experienced leadership that has misused power and authority and has manipulated and controlled others to get what they want. Or perhaps it is because we are overcome with pride, selfishness, and worldly living.


However, the Word of God is absolutely clear children of God are to submit to God. The Greek word for "submit," found here and elsewhere in the New Testament, is (Hupatágēte—Ύποτάγητε); which literally means "to place oneself under the authority of another." Simply stated, it means that we are to obey. That is, we are to give up our own wishes, wants, desires, and plans and yield them and ourselves to the wants, wishes, desires, and plans of the Lord. We don't lose ourselves nor our freedom to make our own choices—rather, we, by faith and trust, offer ourselves to Sovereign God to do with us as He needs and wishes.

Many, if not most, New Testament Scriptural verses use this word in the Greek middle or passive tense—always indicating that we are deliberately acting or choosing to place ourselves under the authority of the Lord and under His Word. In the deepest sense, we are subjecting ourselves to and we are actively obeying the wishes and commands of God. He is not forcing us to comply. He has not taken away our freedom. Rather, our Savior and Redeemer is asking us to give our hearts, minds, and choices over to His plans and purposes.

Truly, godly submission is a personal and intentional choice. It does not involve coercion, intimidation, force, threat, pressure, or obligation. To submit to God requires faith and trust in the one to whom we are offering our obedience and submission. And we can offer our submission to Him because our God is faithful and true. He only requires of us what will give Him glory, accomplish His plans and purposes, and allows Him to offer us the benefit of blessings from Him. To submit to another believer, in the context of the Body of Christ, the church, requires that I place my faith in God and the working of the Holy Spirit in my fellow brother or sister. To submit to my spouse requires that I offer my very best out of love and sacrifice to my beloved.

Oh, that the spiritual discipline of submission would become a deep and true habit of our hearts! Why is this so important? Look at the life and ministry of Christ Jesus. Jesus lived His whole life in submission to the Father. Paul gives us one of the most powerful glimpses to be found in all of the Scriptures (Philippians 2:5-8), "Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

In this powerful description of Jesus, we find the Son of God giving up all that was rightly His—so that He could willingly be offered as the sacrificial lamb who would take away the sins of the world. Jesus' example and call to follow the way of the cross is the cornerstone of the Christian journey of faith. Our lives, our



In learning to practice the spiritual discipline of submission, we free ours to follow our Savior. In living out God's call to live the Christ-life of submission:

- 1. We are free to give up our rights—which is exactly what Jesus did!
- 2. We are free to value the persons and opinions of others. We are free to allow God-appointed and God-anointed leaders to lead—even though they will sometimes fail or sometimes lead out of unhealthy motives.
- 3. We free ourselves from being responsible for another's choice—which allows them to be responsible for their own choices before the Lord.
- 4. We practice self-denial—which sets us free from bondage to the flesh.
- 5. We are free to follow and obey Jesus' commands—we love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us (Matt. 5:44); we love our neighbor (Matt. 19:19), and we love and serve our spouse just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her (Eph. 6:26).

Whenever you hear Jesus voicing a command, then that command will likely require you to practice submission. Whether it concerns our vertical relationship with Him or our horizontal relationships with others—each requires submission and sacrifice—just like Jesus!

Not only are we commanded to be obedient to the Lord's commands, but we are also commanded to submit to authorities. Paul dealt with that issue in Romans, encouraging the Roman believers to submit to governing authorities. He wrote in Romans 13:1-4, "Every person is to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God..." And Paul commanded the believers living in Rome (Hebrews 13:17) "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they keep watch over your souls as those who will give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with grief, for this would be unprofitable for you."

No study of the spiritual discipline of submission is complete without mentioning that there are limits to submission. Any such limits would have to do with either: (1) a denial of the law of love as taught by Jesus; or (2) an affront to Biblical teachings. Some limits to submission may be readily seen. For example, a spouse demands that their mate beat their child for no reason at all. Or perhaps, an American citizen is asked to violate the laws of the Lord which we find in the Scriptures. One doesn't submit to calls for abuse or to be abused. One doesn't submit to evil. One doesn't submit to destructive pressure, demands, or expectations. In each of these and many other cases, a believer who refuses to submit on the basis of those two limits mentioned above does so in a spirit of meekness and submission—not out of arrogance or pride.

What is submission? Slavery, bondage, or servitude? Absolutely not! The Spiritual Disciple that God desires to become a "habit" of your heart is that which seeks to constantly and continuously offer our obedience, support, and wholehearted investment in the work of ministry and service—which honors and glorifies God. As you seek to serve the Lord, don't neglect the way of submission.

A Broken Nation

In my personal opinion, I call that willful ignorance. They chose to ignore the truth and chose to make up a history for themselves that does not exist.

Second, we as a nation have no moral compass. There seem to be no moral boundaries which can guide our nation as a whole. This began when we as a nation forgot our foundation. When we forsake God and His word then anything goes. When every man wants to do what is right in his own eyes, it leads to moral chaos. Even in the laws of man, some guidelines and laws are there to benefit and protect the general public. A simple example of this is traffic laws. These are put in place to help protect the citizens that travel these roads, not to restrict freedom but to protect. The same can be applied to God's word for us. God has given certain guidelines for us to follow. Verse 4 states this about leaders in government positions: "for he is the minister of God to thee for good." Dear Friends,

As late as March of this year I believed I was a country boy. My home is Hendersonville, NC, a nice town of 20,000+ only 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours away. But my perspective changed dramatically in late March when I came to spend a few months with my friends Doug and Barbara Harrell at Harrell Hill Farm near Bakersville.

Doug and I go back more than twenty years, I was executive vice president for GTE Corporation (now Verizon) and Doug was a technology marketer. A "country boy" who done good is the way I often thought of me.

Well let me tell you, I have learned some valuable and unforgettable lessons since arriving in the real 'country'...I've worked on the farm now for nearly six months and experienced things which could only happen in a Chevy Chase film – or to me.

Anyway, if y'all will tolerate me I want to share some of my hair-raising farm stories. We'll call them "Clint's Chronicles on the Funny Farm" – names will be changed to protect the innocent, and chances are I may exaggerate the facts a wee bit. It will go something like this:

A Beast in The Beans!

'Twas a beautiful day at Harrell Hill Farms, crystal clear sky, a torrid 93 degrees as I headed for the garden to harvest a couple of bushels of blue lake bush beans. I had been nearly devoured by ticks and yellow jackets the day before – the most aggressive microscopic critters on earth. So, I donned my overalls, long-sleeve shirt, and high boots for an adventure in the bean patch.

Now what I found growing there I thought was a string bean but have since learned that there is no longer a string, just a snap. That was a pretty big disappointment to me, although I'm not sure why. Just so many new farm facts in my head these days I can hardly catalog them all!

Doug told me this was backbreaking work -- that I might want to take a three-legged stool along for more comfortable picking. I was hunched over piles and piles of bush beans, enjoying the solitude with the Lord, the land, and the garden. A gentle breeze cooled my sweat-soaked clothes, and I was humming praise songs and talking to Jesus. What a wonderful day He was giving me.

It is important, mind you, that I remain vigilant while harvesting these succulent little pods. For I know that bees, spiders, snakes, and other killer vermin can attack without warning. It's simply one of the hazards of being Farmer Clint, yet one I gladly embrace. I chuckled to myself as I thought of the Scripture, "Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour." 1Peter 5:8. Not that I expected a lion, although a hungry bear was not out of the realm of possibility. Regardless, a farmer cannot be too careful.

Somewhere, about mid-bean-row, I heard a soft rustling in the sorghum cane field. I figured it must be a deer since they had been eating virtually every other crop, we'd planted at Harrell Hill Farms. I never knew deer are such destructive beasts and was praying that he would not come over and eat all the beans. It was such a glorious day, I continued to pick and pray, to pick and hum, to pick and thank God for the joy of being one with the farm.

Then, from nowhere and from everywhere a HUGE monster burst from the perimeter of the cane field...I heard it coming, running, stomping, growling, moaning – inhuman groans akin to those portrayed in Steven King novels. I stood my ground, poised for war, girded for battle, prepared to lose my life for the blue lake bush bean patch...then I FELT IT, it was on me!

My head dropped quickly, so quickly in fact that my straw hat fell to the ground. And there, I mean right there, moving across my steel-toed boots was the ugliest monster I've ever met. It was BIG...it was BROWN...it had teeth like a SHARK...I screamed like a girl...it looked at me, made some guttural sound, and darted away. My friends, while picking beans and praising God I stood shoulder

to shoulder with my very first KILLER GROUNDHOG. (Okay, maybe not shoulder to shoulder but he was a whopper!)

I always thought groundhogs were like prairie dogs, or tiny and cute like Chip and Dale. Well, now I know...they resemble Simba, or Aslan, or King Kong, or any number of other prehistoric beasts. (You laugh yet you are reading



this from the comfort of your easy chair, not staring Godzilla in the face).

I had spilled beans from one end of the garden to the other; lost my three-legged stool, tripping over and destroying many tomato plants, stumbling through young broccoli spears, and squishing most of the tender beet sprigs... I jumped into my farm truck – an 1801 vintage Jeep but that's a story for another day – and slammed the door.

My heart was pounding like a sack full of angry opossums, my blood pressure sky high, I'm not sure I had taken a breath during the battle for the blue lake bush bean patch. Yet after a half hour or so, I again sensed the peace of the Lord; all was well with my soul; the monster had slithered into the woods.

I dismounted my jeep and resumed the harvest of blue lake bush beans – confident that I had survived yet another test on the Funny Farm.



One such day last week fits the bill – pouring rain with dark overcast skies. Through the course of the day, as the hard, driving rain continued to fall outside, inside I continued to work from home at my new-found career. The position at App State is a blessing in and of itself, and in that, there is a testimony that can be shared. But, also, there were the peripheral things of the day that made it bright. That day's evening meal was one of the comfort foods. That evening the family and I sat down to a big pot of ham and beans, greens, and cornbread. For dessert, I had also baked oatmeal cookies from scratch. In a sense, I had returned to my roots; the things in life that make us who we are.

I was blessed in life to be raised by depression-era family members. Again, I could dwell on the negativity of my life, but to be able to look back and be thankful for the journey, regardless of how difficult or challenging it might have been, allows me the vision to look ahead with gratitude. Being reared by those who had little gave me the appreciation for those "roughhewn" things of life. While I've never had the "Best Things" of this world, I certainly have been blessed beyond measure in other things, those that mean the most, God and family. My faith is not polished and practiced of that of a seminary student, but rather that from which I have gleaned from the pages of the Word itself. Like those cornfields of my youth, when we would walk row after row behind the trailer being pulled by Grandpa's tractor, gleaning missed cobs, I have studied the Bible for truth. It is in God's word that one can find comfort and solace even in the lengthiest rain spell, or as now, the longest time of forced isolation known to our generation.

As a farmer, I can tell you that there is a breath of relief, a sigh of thanks that goes up when the rain begins to fall after the fields have been properly dressed with fertilizer when the rows of corn are safely in the ground. Through the replenishing of the earth's moisture it as if the farmer's soul is also renewed. As it says in the 23rd Psalm, "My cup runneth over," is an expression best displayed by the overflow pipes of a farm pond and the satisfaction within the farmer's heart. Yes, even when the rain falls, there is a sense of reward and comfort on the farm where others find dread and gloom. It is a mindset that many fails to notice in the modern world. A connection to nature, and our Creator, has been lost by so many in the pursuit to make life "better."

Should we sit and dwell on wondering if we are the just or the unjust, or should we press onward as the Apostle Paul would say? In my heart, and my prayer for those in this world who are hurting is that we would seek to press on. To find God, to bring him close and to find beauty in even those things that matter little to the world. In the coming day, try to spend time with a friend or family member that you haven't heard from in a while. Reach out to those who continue to find the need to self-quarantine. The worst thing we can do is to leave someone alone who might be feeling lost and hopeless when we ourselves have been blessed. Americans' happiness falls to an all-time low: Three reasons for encouragement and the path to our best life

If you're feeling stressed this morning, know that you're

A recent General Social Survey shows that just 14 percent of American adults say they're very happy, down from 31 percent who said the same two years ago. That year, 23 percent said they had often or sometimes felt isolated in recent weeks. Now, 50 percent say that.

In total, fewer Americans are likely to call themselves happy than at any point since the survey began in 1972. The study aligns with research analyzing words on Twitter, which reported that Americans' happiness in recent weeks was the lowest ever recorded.

According to a new report by the American Psychological Association, more than 70 percent of Americans say this is the lowest point in US history they can remember. And the percentage of Americans who are "extremely proud" of their country has fallen to 21 percent, the lowest since Gallup began measuring this sentiment in 2001.

In response to the discouragement of these days, let's begin the week with news stories that offer trinitarian reasons to be encouraged.

A star so large, Saturn's orbit would fit inside it

Did you see the "ring of fire" solar eclipse yesterday?

Such an eclipse happens only once a year. It's a "ring of fire" event because the moon is at its farthest point from our planet when it passes between us and the sun; its small size in the sky leaves the sun's outer rim visible, making it look like

Parts of China, Central African Republic, Congo, Ethiopia, India, and Pakistan were able to watch the full annual solar eclipse. Those in southern and eastern Europe and northern Australia were able to see a partial annular eclipse. If you live in North America, you were out of luck.

Our moon could cause such an eclipse only because our sun is relatively small. By contrast, researchers have been studying a red supergiant star named Antares. They announced last week that the star is so large, Saturn's orbit would fit inside it. Not just the planet, but its entire orbit around our sun.

Psalm 147:4 proclaims that our Father "determines the number of the stars; he gives to all of them their names." Here's why His astounding omnipotence is so relevant today: verse 3 assures us, "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." And verses 5 and 6 add: "Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure. The LORD lifts up the humble; he casts the wicked to the ground."

Our God created every one of the one billion trillion stars in the observable universe (that's 1,000,000,000,000,000,000,000 stars). He measures them and the entire universe with the palm of His hand (Isaiah 40:12).

Now His power is available to heal the brokenhearted and encourage all who humble themselves enough to trust him.

A watch that costs more than \$1,200,000. I found my Father's Day gift in the news last week: a Vacheron Constantin Celestia watch. It displays the time, local high and low tides, the relative position of the earth and moon to the sun, the length of day and night, the time of sunrise and sunset, and the position of the sun in the signs of the Zodiac. It also indicates equinoxes and solstices. The back of the watch displays a large star map, which makes one rotation a day. The watch can be yours for just over one million pounds (that's over \$1,200,000).

As unique and expensive as this watch is, know that you are even more unique and expensive.

Anna Quindlen writes: "There are thousands of people out there with the same degree you have; when you get a job, there will be thousands of people doing what you want to do for a living. But you are the only person alive who has sole custody of your life. Your particular life. Your entire life. Not just your life at a desk, or your life on the bus, or in the car, or at the computer. Not just the life of your mind, but the life of your heart. Not just your bank account, but your soul" (A Short Guide to a Happy Life, quoted by James Clear).

Jesus' best friend wrote this about our Savior: "If anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation [atonement] for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world" (1 John 2:1–2).

Jesus considered your eternal life worth His tortured and crucified death (Romans 5:8). And He is praying for you right now because He loves you (Romans 8:34).


A boy in Iceland joins a basketball camp in Oakland





If I lay those blocks without something to guide me then those blocks will not be straight, or level and my building will look horrible and everybody who looks at it will know it is not straight. The row of blocks will look like a snake. Someone would even say the person who laid those blocks did not know what they were doing.

However, when I use a level and a string, I can lay those blocks straight. That string when pulled tight is the guide that I use to lay my blocks in a straight line. And we have a saying in carpentry work, "the string does not lie." The blocks will be laid what we call "true" or straight. I cannot place those blocks in a straight line without that string. The string will continue to keep the blocks straight as I build the garage.

The word righteous or "straight" is the word God uses to describe Himself to us. Righteousness is the moral and ethical standard and course of standard which is the nature and will of God. Therefore, God is completely "straight" or righteous and the standard of which everything is compared to. This is the same thing when the Bible says God is Just and Holy. God is always completely perfect without error or flaw in all that He is and does. And God can never make a mistake or deviate from what is straight and righteous.

So, if God built a garage His garage would be perfect. The reason it would be perfect is because God is perfect, and he cannot make a mistake. My garage would not be perfect because I am not perfect. If I compare my garage to God's garage one could see plainly my garage is flawed.

Therefore, if I compare my righteousness to God's righteousness my righteousness is not straight, it is flawed. My righteousness is off course. The Bible says our righteousness is filthy rags. So, I am not good, I am not straight, and I am terribly flawed. And I cannot correct myself. No matter how hard I try I cannot be

So, what really Matters? Proverbs 14:34 (KJV 1900) "Righteousness exalteth a nation: But sin is a reproach to any people.'

What really matters is my relationship with God. What causes me to love people, love my family, act with kindness, treat others with respect, and act with integrity comes from God. I cannot do these things on my own. I cannot reform myself, I have to transform my heart. Remember my righteousness is flawed so on my own I can never act and do the things that please God. So, I need His righteousness. And the only way to receive it is in Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ died on the cross for my sin and my unrighteousness. When I place my faith in Christ alone, the Holy Ghost at that moment of salvation comes and lives inside me. Giving me now a righteousness that I did not have before. Romans 8:10-11 (KJV 1900) "10 And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. 11 But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.'

The only Hope for our Nation is God. Not reform. The only way to stop violence and murder and stealing and vandalism and rioting and abortion and child abuse and pornography and the many other sins that are destroying our nation will not be solved by tearing down statues or defunding the police or politics. The only hope for our nation and true justice is Jesus Christ. Many people do not want to talk about the true sinful nature of man.

The media does not talk about the source of our sin because if they admitted a moral failure then they would have to talk about God and His solution to our heart problem. So do not expect them to go there or try to explain the truth about the heart of man. We live in a very deceitful world. Many people and young adults and children are being deceived by political movements that are ungodly.

I ask you the Church to wake up and pray and preach the Gospel. The Gospel is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes. The church is absolutely being run over right now. The Bible affirms in the last days people would turn from the truth and believe lies. How many people out there are consulting pastors and what the Bible says about a godless nation? America is drowning in our sin. I often wonder about this Psalm. Psalm 60:1-4 (KJV 1900)

- "I O God, thou hast cast us off, thou hast scattered us,
- Thou hast been displeased; O turn thyself to us again.
- 2 Thou hast made the earth to tremble; thou hast broken it:
- Heal the breaches thereof; for it shaketh.
- 3 Thou hast shewed thy people hard things:
- Thou hast made us to drink the wine of astonishment.
- 4 Thou hast given a banner to them that fear thee,"
- That it may be displayed because of the truth. Selah.
- "Oh Lord help us give us a banner to display truth in Jesus' name" amen.

Do you take quizzes about yourself and share them? To some, they provide fun and entertainment. Here are several of the quirkiest listed on Buzz Feed:

- Design a Mansion, and We'll Tell You What Season Matches Your Personality
- We Know How Many Kids You Will Have Based on Your Design of a Park
- What Kind of Donut Are You?
- Build Your Dream Home and We'll Reveal What Kind of Sneeze You Have Personality and other quizzes seem irresistible and bring a sense of pleasure and identification with others. We crave to know more about ourselves and how others perceive us. And we love to share our results, even when we know they are constructed to make us feel good about ourselves. An article on LeadQuizzes.com says that psychologists believe we fulfill our social, self-esteem, and fulfillment needs when we answer the questions and that quizzes help us to enter and identify with a larger group of people who feel the same.

God created within humans these needs (social, self-esteem, and fulfillment). He then encourages us to know ourselves, describing our pursuit as wise in Proverbs 14:8. The first part of the verse says, "The wisdom of the prudent is to know his way:"

Our social needs include a void that only a relationship with God can fill. He even sent His Son to die for our sins, breaking the barrier of unholiness so that we could fellowship with Him in freedom if we choose.

From these ten brief words in Proverbs, our libraries contain thousands of books and resources about the psychology of knowing ourselves and our businesses. The marketing world plays with the nuances of these needs by creating quizzes designed to engage customers through self-analysis. For them, the ultimate goal, of course, is to sell products.

Although many of these quizzes analyze light-hearted parts of our lives, there are more serious tests that can guide a company to a stronger position in the economy. One of the basic quizzes in my business administration degree's capstone course was an assessment called the SWOT analysis. Here is what each letter means.

Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats

The idea in business is to turn the weaknesses of an organization into strengths and to change the opportunities into business revenue. The threats are to be recognized and diluted or quarantined if possible. The SWOT quiz or analysis for a business reminds me of the many verses in the Bible that address these categories.

Strengths: When our world crumbles and all that is dear to us is attacked, we need strength. And 2 Samuel 22:33 reveals an unending source from which to draw. The verse declares, "God is my strength and power: and he maketh my way perfect."

Weaknesses: When our weaknesses disappoint us, then we can know from 2 Corinthians 12:9 that the Lord can reveal Himself through the cracks of our faults, offering a perspective for future crises. The verse says, "And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly, therefore, will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me."

Opportunities: When God-given opportunities present themselves, we can enthusiastically act. Galatians 6:10 encourages us by saying, "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

Threats: Identifying threats highlights the urgent need for protection. This is true in business as well as in the Christian life. Our largest threat as believers is the devil as 1 Peter 5:8 declares, but his sinister presence is diminished and shielded by our armor found in the wardrobe room located in Ephesians chapter 6:10-18.

When we assess our faith by taking the SWOT analysis, what a delight it is to find solutions in the Word of God. During my earthly crises, a SWOT analysis from the Bible offers peace, perspective, and even pleasure in Jesus' presence.

Taking the quiz called, pick a Photo In Every Color, and We'll Reveal Your Best Quality" might be fun, but knowing who I am in Christ brings me fulfillment, joy, and purpose for eternity.






A Pastor's View

Il Corinthians 4:17 "Encouragement In Affliction"

There is a lot of discouraging news around these days, and many people would say, we need some encouragement! Nowhere can we find more encouragement than in the word Bible for yourself and find these specific words of encour-

of God. I hope that you will take time every day to read the agement that God has for you. In my own Bible reading not long ago, I read II

Corinthians 4:17, which says: "For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory

far beyond all comparison.' This verse gives us at least 3 reasons we can be encouraged in our times of af-

fliction: FIRST, it says our afflictions here are only TEMPORARY. They are "momentary," it says. They don't last forever.

Think about this coronavirus crisis. It may seem like it is really taking a long time. I saw where someone posted last March that it felt like the date was March the 97th! I'm sure to a lot of people, it DID feel like March lasted that long! But in a few years, we will look back on this whole COVID-19 episode as just a very brief time in our lives.

It is the same way with all of our afflictions. They are just temporary. And sure, some particular afflictions may stick with us our whole lives — but even our life here on earth is very brief, compared to eternity. James 4 says we are merely a vapor, that appears for a while and then is gone. We will have all eternity to celebrate and enjoy what God has done for us — and we will see that what we went through on earth was so temporary.

So, God says, take heart; this will be over soon. Our afflictions, the Bible says, are only temporary.

SECONDLY, the Bible says, our afflictions here are "LIGHT."

Now, someone may say, "Well, it doesn't feel very 'light' to me! What I am going through feels pretty heavy!" And it probably does feel that way. We need to understand that Paul doesn't discount the very real sufferings that we go through here on earth. He wasn't speaking ignorantly, from some "ivory tower." Paul knew very personally what it means to suffer here on earth. He shares later in II Corinthians about how he had "afflictions on every side; conflicts without; fears within;" about his "sufferings", and "poverty," and "beatings" and "imprisonments" and "sleeplessness" and "hunger." Paul didn't have his head in the sand. He experienced more real troubles and suffering in his life than most of us will ever know. He knew very well that sufferings here on earth are REAL!

But in the same way, he could say that these real sufferings are "light" COMPARED to the glory that will be revealed to us in heaven. He says, God has a reward waiting for us there, that is WORTH all the suffering we may undergo here on earth.

It's like Jesus said in John 16, "Whenever a woman is in labor she has pain because her hour has come; but when she gives birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy that a child has been born into the world.'

There's probably not much pain in this world greater than that of childbirth. I am pretty grateful not to have experienced it! But every mother I know, says that pain was worth it — because of the unequaled joy of the LIFE that came through it! The pain was nothing; it was "light," compared to the greater privilege of the life of that child.

And so, the Bible says it is with our afflictions here on earth. They seem heavy to us now. But COMPARED to what God has waiting for us, they are "light."

John Newton, the author of "Amazing Grace," said that when we are in heaven, we will look back on all of our trials on earth and we will say, "Is that all we had to go through, to be able to enjoy all this glory?"

That's what Paul is saying here. When we are in heaven, experiencing the glory of God, and the eternal pleasures He has for us there, we will say, "What light things we had to go through, to be able to experience all this glory." No matter how hard it seemed to us on earth at the time, in eternity we will agree with Paul here: our tribulations on earth were "light"!

Finally, Paul says the afflictions we experience now have a PURPOSE: they are "producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison."

Most of us are willing to work hard and endure hardship when we see that there's a good reason for it. But there's nothing more frustrating than doing something that doesn't seem to have any purpose.

I recently read about how a certain man went into the military, and since they didn't have anything for them to do at the camp, the new recruits were told to move a pile of dirt from one end of the camp to another. There wasn't any purpose in it; it was just to kill time and keep the men busy. There's nothing worse than feeling like you are just doing "busy work" that doesn't have any purpose.

Now, we may sometimes feel like our afflictions are just useless "bumps in the road" that don't have any meaning or purpose, but God says NO! Everything that happens to you DOES have a meaning; it DOES have a purpose. No life experience is wasted with God. He is using it all to bring His ultimate purposes for you

And here He tells us what that purpose is: He says our affliction is producing in us an eternal weight of glory! God is using our afflictions for His purposes: to strip us of our sins and impurities; to build our character; to make us like Christ; and to grant us a reward in heaven that is an "eternal", "weight" of "glory"!

Our sufferings are not "wasted." We aren't just "moving dirt from one end of the camp to the other." God has a purpose for everything we are going through. Our affliction has a purpose.

SO: our job in the meantime is to endure the afflictions God has allowed to

come into our lives, and to believe what He says here: that our afflictions are only "momentary"; they are "light"; and they are being used by God for His purposes — and that there is an "eternal weight of glory," far better than anything we had to go through, waiting for us on the other side!





Neuropathy

Oddly enough, all 3 were men in the '80s, had been under medical care for several years, taking medications but symptoms progressively getting worse.

My favorite part is that all 3 were not ready to give up. Their main goal was to remain active and they had gotten to the point where they could not do anything without severe pain.

Interestingly all 3 were ultimately told different things, one (we'll call patient A) was very dismayed over the fact the doctor basically told him there was nothing more could be done, and he would have to live with it and control the pain as best he could with medication. Another (patient B) was given an option of several thousand dollars' worth of injections and medications but considered experimental so Medicare would not likely pay for it. The third (Patient C) was not happy with the pace at which the doctors were moving as appointments were made for testing and specialists, which would drag out for months, and in the meantime, nothing is being done.

Every neuropathy patient I have ever seen has also had chronic back or neck pain to go along with it. So that needs to be addressed as well, keep in mind that the nerves going down the legs and arms start in the spinal cord usually in the same area the back and neck pain is.

All my patients start with a thorough examination and possibly x-rays to determine the cause of their complaints, then we have them return the next day to review the findings and talk about our options for treatment and the costs. In most cases I will recommend something they can do at home that may help; this was done in all three cases above. The recommendation was to use an ice pack over the area of pain in the spine which was the low back in all 3.

Patient A could not believe how much better he felt the next morning after having used the ice, best he felt in a year were his words. Patient B felt little difference and patient C noticed they were able to move around better the next morning which was usually difficult for the first few hours.

The two that had a positive response from the ice had obvious inflammation in the spine which was causing much of the pain and quite possibly irritating the nerves causing the neuropathy. By the way, they are continuing to make excellent improvements as of this writing which is 2 weeks later. Patient B is making slow improvement but his is much more complicated as we will discuss.

Neuropathy involves the nerves as we see by definition, what is causing the nerve damage is what can complicate things. For nerves to be healthy they need good blood supply which means good circulation, they need oxygen and stimulation as well as good nutrition in the form of certain vitamins and minerals and glucose.

It has been my experience that just giving medications for neuropathy brings short term relief at best. The best long-term relief comes with a comprehensive plan involving all the above necessities. Circulation issues must be addressed, nutrition must be addressed including any blood sugar issues. Oxygen levels and anemia must be examined. Some sort of exercise needs to be part of the recovery process and lastly, the nerves must be examined for possible mechanical irritation coming from the spine.

If you have been diagnosed with neuropathy and find the results of your treatment are unsatisfactory, you should be discussing these issues with your doctor and if they are unwilling or unable, then find someone who can guide you through the complexities of getting your health back.

Spending time in prayer, asking for a favor from your health care provider to listen to your needs and guidance from the holy spirit to find the best course of treatment.



The Shoes of Peace

In the last few months, we have been examining each piece of the armor that Paul described in Ephesians chapter 6. Each piece is essential; no piece can be left out if we plan to have victory as followers of Christ.

We have learned that the belt of truth must be worn, positionally, and intentionally so that our core is protected. Everything else hinges on this foundation of truth. We must



The Roman soldiers wore sandals made of leather with straps that wrapped around the calves up to the knees. Soldiers could walk up to 25 miles a day without blisters because of the soft leather and open-air design. A strip of metal was built into each shoe for stability. Each shoe had two different sizes of metal studs on the bottoms which provided traction when walking, running, or standing firm while fighting. Soldiers needed to be able to stand firm, especially if the ground was slippery and these spikes kept them on their feet.

We must stand firm concerning the gospel of Jesus Christ. In our culture, it seems as if we are on a slippery slope concerning the good news of Jesus and His sacrifice for our sins. The narrow road of only one way to heaven is under serious attack, but it always has been. We must always be prepared to share the gospel of peace.

Gospel comes from the Greek word 'euangelion' and it means good news or good tidings. Jesus, Himself, came preaching the gospel.

Mark 1:14-15 states that "...Jesus came into Galilee preaching the gospel of God, and saying 'The time is fulfilled and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel'".

Jesus also commissioned his followers to preach the gospel. Luke 9:2 says 'And He (Jesus) sent them (His disciples) out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing'.

Although Jesus is the Prince of Peace, sometimes the gospel seems anything but peaceful. When the message is received with faith, the hearer is immediately at peace with God through the sacrifice of Jesus. However, those who reject the truth of the gospel are immediately in conflict with sincere believers. Light and darkness cannot coexist.

Jesus was quite honest concerning this tension between those who receive this message of peace and those who do not, even in one's own family. Jesus instructed His disciples in Matthew 10:34-36 concerning these things. "Do not think that I came to bring peace on the earth; I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I came to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and a man's enemies will be a member of his household". Those are strong words for the gospel is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes and that power produces radical transformation. Old things pass away and new things replace the old. There is a cost to following Jesus, yet it does not compare to the price He paid for our redemption. Paul reminds us in the first few chapters of Ephesians that we have redemption through Jesus' blood and the forgiveness of all our sins. We are reconciled to our heavenly Father and we have peace with Him through Christ Jesus. Therefore, we must put on our shoes of peace and spread the good news of the gospel.

One thing to note is that our feet are not shod with the gospel but with the readiness of the gospel. John Piper says he thinks this means 'let your feet be ready to move with the gospel'. Paul probably had Isaiah 52:7 in mind as he thought about the running feet of people bringing the good news of peace.

Peter challenged all believers to be ready to answer the hope that is within. Our salvation story is the tool that the Holy Spirit will use to draw others to the Savior. The Shoes of Peace

We must stay prepared to share the gospel; to hurriedly herald this good news as God gives opportunity. The phrase, 'gospel of peace', is a Greek phrase for 'gospel of bliss'. Bliss means perfect happiness or great joy. We are to have our feet shod with the readiness of the gospel of perfect happiness or great joy. The good news we carry has so much more power than we can imagine. People in our world are desperate for peace. In describing the armor that every believer must wear for spiritual victory over the enemy, peace takes center stage.

The devil has an agenda but our God has a greater agenda. The devil's agenda is to steal, kill, and destroy. God's agenda is that we have eternal life as well as abundant life. Peace in abundance is our birthright through Jesus, and this good news is certainly worth sharing. We are called to be agents of reconciliation, just as Paul referred to himself. But it is not an easy assignment. Most of the time, the devil has us convinced that no one is interested in hearing the gospel, which is not true. People are desperately seeking peace, hope, joy, and love. They just do not realize that all these qualities are found only in Jesus Christ. Our responsibility is to listen and then share the gospel of peace in love. But if we are going to impact the lives of those around us, we must be people who allow the peace of God to rule and reign in our hearts. He is to rule and we are to rest.

The recent shelter-in-place order, based on the uncertainty of the Corona Virus, has drained the peace of many, including God's people. We cannot allow the enemy to replace our peace with fear for we cannot share the gospel of peace under a yoke of fear. On the heels of the virus has come racial unrest, another opportunity for our enemy to steal our peace. Just hours before Jesus would suffer on the cross for our sins, He said these powerful words to His disciples, 'Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you, not as the world gives do I give to you'. We must not allow the enemy to deceive us for Satan's objective in these unprecedented days is to weaken our witness. The Holy Spirit gives us the fuel of faith to speak words

of spirit and life as we remain ready to share the gospel of Christ. Those words of peace will bring rest and satisfaction to all who receive them.

Hebrews 4:3, in the Amplified Version says: "For we who believe (that is, we who personally trust and confidently rely on God) enter that rest (so we have His inner peace now because we are confident in our salvation, and assured of His power)". Believing and receiving the gospel message is what allows us to enter the rest of God. Jesus said from the cross, 'it is finished'. Why? Jesus did all the work necessary to secure our peace with God. In the words of the Old Testament, we have entered into a permanent Sabbath. We have ceased striving and now rest in the finished work of the cross, a place of inner soul peace testifying to the world of the amazing grace of God.

Our responsibility is to spread this gospel of peace wherever we plant our feet and to do so in an attitude of peace and rest. Let's get ready and stay ready! The shoes are just our size!

The NC State Board of Community Colleges, meeting on Friday morning, affirmed the decision of the McDowell Technical Community College Board of Trustees to name Mr. Ryan Garrison as Interim President of McDowell Tech effective July 1, 2020.

The decision comes after Dr. John Gossett announced in late March that he would be leaving his role as McDowell Tech's current president at the end of June to assume the role of president at AB-Tech in Asheville.

God's Revelation "Where Are You?"

"Thus, saith the Lord the King of Israel, and His redeemer the Lord of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last, and beside me, there is no God" (Isaiah 44:6).

There is no authority beyond and above God our Father. Our responses to Him can reveal at times that we have forgotten Who is truly in charge. We can see God's power throughout all of Scripture and if we look back, we can also see that His presence and His power has been at work in our life already. The prophet Isaiah challenges us to think rightly about who God is. God is in control. He isn't fretting or worried about anything. At times it may be hard for us to trust and believe that God is in charge and can be in control of our care when we're called to place our trust and hope in Him and Him alone. But we can.

We should not fret or worry about things we cannot change but instead, we should pray. Although we may be strong in body, if we fail to heed God's nourishment and fail to soak in His Holy Word; our daily bread of guidance, leadership, and God's Will in our life; then we become faint in our walk with God and in seeking His nearness. We should pray for strength, wisdom, protection, and courage to face whatever struggles are currently in our lives or are to come. Our worrying should be turned into prayers lifted up through faith in Him. Through our prayers and trusting our life in His care, we can rest in His blessed assurance that He is in charge of all our circumstances and that we also have a beautiful inheritance awaiting us. So, what does God want to reveal to us?

- We need to be healed from the ongoing sin in our lives.

It means we are trusting that God is better than whatever lifestyle we are currently clinging to. If we are willing to say yes to needing help with our troubles and trials of circumstance, if we look inside ourselves and see that being healed means departing from situations we are trying to fix and work through ourselves, or worrying about circumstances we cannot change; and move forward into the unknown with Jesus; it is then He is willing and we receive our Revelation. It is His Will to provide solace and comfort: in times of grief, loneliness, and heartbreak. It is His Will to lessen the hurting and pain in health and feelings of distraught and despair in each of our lives. Whatever the process may be ...the process may be long, but the healing will come. All we have to do is accept what God promises. He can and will bring healing and comfort if we put our trust in Him and Him alone. You can be at peace in God's arms and His loving

The Rebirth of Israel

The rebirth of Israel as an independent nation in 1948 is one of the most significant events in world history.

Never before has an entire race of people been without a homeland for so long without assimilating into surrounding populations.

However, no other conquered race had the promise of God to "give all this land of Canaan to you and to your offspring forever." Genesis 17:8 (NLT)

The scriptures prophesied that Israel would be dispersed among the nations then brought out from among them in a gradual process that would culminate in the establishment of Israel as a nation in a single day.

And that's exactly what happened.

The Bible also foretold the exact year in which this would happen.

Those who study the Word of God recognize the restoration of Israel as the primary sign of the end of the age. Jesus promised the generation that witnessed this event would also witness His return. Matthew 24:34 (NLT)

Long ago the Bible predicted these events would transpire in the last days:

- 1) The gathering of the Jews into their homeland
- 2) The rebirth of Israel in a single day
- 3) The rebirth of Israel in the year 1948
- 4) Israel's possession of Jerusalem
- 5) The nations of the earth aligned against Israel
- 6) The war of Gog and Magog
- 7) The rebuilding of the Jewish Temple

Five of these seven prophetic events have already been fulfilled, and the final two are certain to follow.

The Gathering of the Jews

Numerous biblical prophecies foretold of the re-gathering of Israel as a nation. Approximately 2,700 years ago, God revealed to the prophet Ezekiel a "Valley of Dry Bones" (Ezekiel chapter 37). God spoke of these bones (the Jews) gathered together and covered with flesh and muscles (re-gathered from the nations) with life being breathed into them (a dead nation brought to life once again).

"Then he said to me, 'Son of man, these bones represent the people of Israel. They are saying, 'We have become old, dry bones - all hope is gone.' Now give them this message from the Sovereign Lord: O my people, I will open your graves of exile and cause you to rise again. Then I will bring you back to the land of Israel. When this happens, O my people, you will know that I am the Lord." Ezekiel 37:11-13 (NLT)

Beginning in the late 19th Century, the birth of the Zionist movement culminated in the gradual emigration of Jews from all over the world to resettle the land of Israel. Each decade the number of returning Jews increased until finally, the nation of Israel came to life once again in 1948.

Israel Becomes a Nation in a Single Day

God foretold long ago that after He brought His scattered people out from among the nations, He would declare them to be a nation in a single day: ""Who has ever seen or heard of anything as strange as this? Has a nation ever been born in a single day? Has a country ever come forth in a mere moment? But by the time Jerusalem's birth pains begin, the baby will be born; the nation will come forth. Would I ever bring this nation to the point of birth and then not deliver it?' asks the Lord. 'No! I would never keep this nation from being born,' says your God." Isaiah 66:8-9(NLT)

This is exactly what happened on May 14, 1948. Having been brought to the brink of extinction by the horrors of the Holocaust, facing persecution around the world, and surrounded by their enemies, the Jewish people gathered together in Israel and declared themselves a nation in a single day. The United States recognized Israel as a nation on that same day, and Israel's victories in the wars since have solidified their place among the nations of the world.

Israel an Object of Scorn in the Last Days

The prophet Zechariah noted the following would be true of Israel in the last days:

"I will make Jerusalem and Judah like an intoxicating drink to all the nearby nations that send their armies to besiege Jerusalem. On that day I will make Jerusalem a heavy stone, a burden for the world. None of the nations who try to lift it will escape unscathed." Zechariah 12:2-3(NLT)



The rebirth of Israel in 1948 has been accompanied by constant war and conflict with surrounding Muslim nations. It's a cool, sunny Friday afternoon and we are both off work and free. Life is good. We are so blessed with health and places where we can escape the confines of the house amid a pandemic and social distancing. We choose to go mountain biking. Exercise clears the mind and brings peace to the soul.



Freedom, fresh air, flying down the hill – and suddenly a flash of the handlebars, a bone-jarring crunch of head and neck ... and then it went dark. Life changed as I knew it in the blink of an eye. Why am I in the dirt and not on my bike? Why is it so hard to breathe? I kept trying to call out for my wife, but no words would come. Denial, they say, is not just a river in Egypt, but more of a male trait in the face of reality. Hence, I refused a trip to the ER at that moment, put on my cracked helmet, and walked/rode my bike out of the woods.

God in His infinite grace and mercy gives us wives – aka common sense – to keep us from an early demise. I found myself sitting in the emergency room Saturday morning being asked if I wanted something for pain. I said I wasn't hurting that much. To which he mumbled something to the nature of being tachycardic, diaphoretic, hypertensive, and thrashing around in the bed, ... and that I was, in fact, in pain. (See Egyptian River above). 'Common sense' had to wait in the car due to the pandemic.

After IV's, CT's, and some sweet nectar in the veins that made the world a better place, I listened to the doctor's report.

"You have a displaced fracture of C2 right foramen (a small opening thru which vital things pass), a nondisplaced fracture of C7, as well as a fracture of the right first rib."

"Can you even break that rib?", I thought to myself. I'll skip over the brain concussion as 'common sense' is questioning the existence of one to concuss. Post-concussive syndrome has its benefits though; I can now walk in the kitchen and have a legitimate excuse for forgetting what it was I was after.

I am now in an Aspen collar which makes me look like a turtle straining to see over a log. The dogs all laughed when I returned home wearing the equivalent of the 'cone of shame' we put on them to save them from themselves.

The reality of what I had done and survived began to sink in over the next few days, as well as how much I had to be thankful for. We know of another man with a similar injury who was not so fortunate and is faced with life challenges beyond imagination.

In the movie Overcomer, one man asks the other, "Who are you? What is your identity?"

To which the other replies, "I'm a coach, I'm a history professor, I'm a father," and finally, "I'm a Christian."

"Why is it so far down your list?" he asks.

Just before the unforgettable blink, I was a clinician, a runner, a biker, and now I sit in the house unable to work, run, bike, or even lift much of anything.

It is so incredibly hard to come face to face with our mortality and how quickly life can change. One minute healthy, and in the blink of an eye, you have a broken neck and are out of work. Why would God allow this, and to what end? How does this hardship bring glory to God? How often do we wrestle with God when we don't understand the things that happen? When we perceive that our prayers go unanswered, or that He has somehow forgotten us. When we allow our identity to be tied up in who or what we are, or for that matter what we have accomplished, and not with the one who created us.

We were made to hear the phrase "Well done good and faithful servant." The problem is most of us spend every energy of our lives longing to hear that from a lesser master.



Since reconvening the short session on April 28th, the legislature has been focused on providing relief from Gov. Roy Cooper's shutdown orders, which have created financial burdens and other hardships to citizens in our state. Following is legislation passed by the General Assembly this past month to move forward in reopening our state:

H 594 – Temp Open Gyms/Health Clubs/Fitness Ctrs. ¬authorized existing indoor or outdoor exercise and fitness facilities, gyms, health clubs, and fitness centers to open and resume operations, provided specific conditions were met. At the time this bill passed, gyms and fitness centers in all four surrounding states had reopened. The bill was updated to give Gov. Cooper the flexibility to reclose these businesses provided he obtained the concurrence with his Council of State. Unfortunately, Gov. Cooper vetoed this bill nine days after it was presented to him. An attempt to override the veto in the House failed on June 24.

S 599 – Open Skating Rinks/Bowling Alleys authorizes existing skating rinks and bowling alleys to open and resume operations, provided specific conditions are met, and temporarily allows minor league baseball stadiums with existing food and beverage establishments to have outdoor seating up to ten percent (10%) of the permanent seating capacity of the stadium provided certain conditions are met. This bill was presented to Gov. Cooper on June 22.

H 258 – Open Amusement Parks/Arcades/Venues authorizes amusement parks and gaming and business establishments with video games and arcade games, existing on March 10, 2020, to open and resume operations, provided specific conditions are met. It also authorizes existing venues for receptions or parties to resume operations, provided specific conditions are met. This bill was presented to Gov. Cooper on June 24.

H 686 – Freedom to Celebrate the Fourth of July was ratified on June 24 and is awaiting action from Gov. Cooper. The bill states, "The Governor shall not prohibit parades or firework displays discharged in accordance with Article 54 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes, scheduled to occur between 5:00 P.M. on July 1st and 5:00 P.M. on July 10th."

Other bills aimed at easing the difficulties placed on North Carolinians resulting from the pandemic include:

H 158 – COVD-19 New Driver Response waives the road test requirement to obtain a Level 2 limited provisional license until DMV resumes administering road tests. It also provides accommodations for students enrolled in a driver education course in the spring semester of 2020. This bill was signed by the Governor on June 19.

H 118 – COVID-19 Liab. Safe Harbor would for a limited time, in claims arising from contraction of COVID-19, provide immunity from liability for any act or omission not amounting to gross negligence, willful or wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing. This bill was presented to Gov. Cooper on June 24.

S 730 – The No Patient Left Alone Act ensures that hospitalized patients can designate at least one visitor to be with them in accordance with hospital rules. This bill is in response to tragic instances of hospital patients being completely alone during their hospital stays and for many, even dying alone, without the comfort of having spouses and family members close by and saying last goodbyes to loved ones. This bill passed both the Senate and the House on June 25 and will be presented to Gov. Cooper. State Legislature Approves Funds for Western Campus of NCSSM

As some of you may know, the budget vetoed last year included funds to allow the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics to begin operations and ramping up for the opening of its new western campus under construction in Morganton. Due to the resulting budget stalemate, the NCSSM opening had to be pushed back from August of 2021 to August 2022. Fortunately, the General Assembly has again delivered the needed operating funds. I was pleased to be the lead sponsor of a House bill to provide these funds. The NC House of Representatives unanimously passed the new bill on June 4. The same bill then passed the North Carolina Senate on June 10. I am grateful that Senators Warren Daniel and Ralph Hise took the lead there. Having passed both legislative branches, the bill now goes to the Governor for his signature to become law. It is my understanding that he will sign it. This bill will allocate roughly \$3.3 million to NCSSM for operating funds, purchase of equipment and supplies, and to establish 46 new positions at the Morganton campus of NCSSM.

Assuming the Governor's signature, the bill will become effective July 1. With this money, the western campus will be able to open and welcome its initial enrollment of 150 students who will enter as high school juniors. If all goes as intended, the second class of 150 should enter in August of 2023. This new campus of NC's School of Science and Math represents a visionary education investment by the legislature as approved by the voters in the ConnectNC Bond package. As we continue to create an economy that attracts the cutting-edge jobs of the future right here in North Carolina, NCSSM-Morganton provides another promising pathway to success for hundreds of students in our state.

After hearing numerous heartbreaking personal stories of constituents and citizens from across our state that have been prohibited from visiting hospitalized family members, I was inspired to file S730, the "No Patient Left Alone Act" in May during the NC General Assembly Short Session. This proposed law requires licensed hospitals to ensure the opportunity for at least one visitor to visit a patient admitted to a facility during a period in which a disaster, emergency, or public health emergency has been declared. It provides for a minor who is admitted to a licensed hospital the opportunity to have at least one parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis the opportunity to visit and be present while the minor is receiving hospital care. Visitors are still subject to normal visitation policies and will also have access to a waiting area when the visitor cannot be in the room with the patient due to medical procedures. Licensed hospitals may require visitors to submit to health screenings and may restrict visitors who do not pass the screening or who test positive for an infectious disease. S730 allows hospitals to require visitors to adhere to infection control procedures, including wearing personal protective equipment (PPE). The bill passed the Senate in a 40-4 vote and will be taken up by the NC House this week.

There are two other pieces of legislation that I have worked on recently. First, S562 Senate Bill 562, the "Second Chance Act" would expand the eligibility for the expunction of certain offenses committed by 16-17 year-olds; remove most of the limitations on getting a charge that was dismissed, or resulted in a not guilty, expunged and expand the eligibility requirements for someone to get a nonviolent offense expunged. S562 has passed both the House and Senate and was presented to the Governor on June 18. Once it becomes law, the Second Chance Act will help a lot of people who made mistakes when they were young clear their criminal record and get a second chance. Also, where a person is found in possession of small amounts of illegal drugs, House Bill 511, the "First Step Act," would allow a judge to impose a sentence of lessor duration where there is clear and convincing evidence that the defendant was not involved in drug trafficking. The bill will also allow a narrow band of people serving an active sentence for drug trafficking to petition the court to be resentenced if they have no other felony convictions. H511 passed both the state House and Senate and was sent to the Governor on June 17.

Do you have any idea what the most popular bird in the whole wide world is? There are more of this bird than any other, more than 50 billion are born a year. This is more than the entire population of people that live on the earth. Do you know what this bird is?



It's a chicken!

Chickens are pretty smart animals. Did you know that a chicken can remember more than 100 faces of animals and people? They also have their own unique language made up of over 30 different sounds! Chickens were domesticated in South China around 6000BC. The tropical Red Jungle fowl is believed to be the direct ancestor of the domestic chicken. Originally, they were domesticated for cockfighting. Now they are bred for meat and raised for eggs. Approximately 97 chickens are killed every .05 seconds in the world for food. Humans consume more chicken a year than beef. Domesticated chickens also cannot fly far.

A chicken's life span is 5-10 years, or less if it's raised for meat. The oldest living chicken recorded was named Matilda who lived 16 years!

Chickens are omnivores they can taste salty foods but not sweet food. They will

also eat their eggs if they are not happy with or lacking something in their diet. They have 3 eyelids and can run up to 9 mph! Their hearts beat 220-360 beats per sec. while the human heart beats anywhere between 1-2 beats per second. The color of their ear lobe tells you what color their eggs will be: Redbrown eggs, white- white eggs, and gray- colored eggs. The Americana and Araucana, and Easter eggers, lay green, blue, or pink eggs.



Eggs have the same nutritional value no matter what the color they are. You can trick a hen into

thinking the day is 28 hours long with special lights. The result in this is bigger and

An average hen lays more than 300 eggs a year. She will turn each egg around 50 times a day. Seven eggs are the record number of eggs laid by a single chicken in a day. Three hundred, seventy-one holds the record for the most eggs laid by a hen in a year! A hen must eat at least 4 lbs. of food to be able to make a dozen eggs. Mothers can talk with their babies while they are still in the egg. The largest chicken egg weighed 12 oz. and had 2 yolks inside. The record for the most yolks found inside a single egg has been 9.

We think of chickens as a common and pretty reasonable animal to purchase. However, in Indonesia, there is a rare breed that is sold for over \$2500.00 each! Due to hyperpigmentation, these birds are completely black including their internal

Well, several years ago my children and I raised some chicks from the time they were two days old. We had one Americana and eleven Barred Rock pullets (female chicks). The Americana had golden-brown feathers while the Barred Rocks had black and white feathers. They grew up together but when they got older, I noticed that all of the black and white chickens started being mean and picking on the only goldenbrown chicken. She wasn't allowed to eat any of the grain until after everyone else was finished if she tried before this happened, she was pecked and chased back into the chicken coop. We had to build another chicken coop to put her in where she would be safe and free of being picked on. She was allowed to eat what she wanted to, not just the leftovers.

Did you know that God deemed it that there is only one race of people? We are all direct descendants of Noah, we all have the same color of blood, and Jesus came here and died for all of us, no matter what color our skin is. Not only that, but there also is not a pure bloodline left in any person. For example, I consider myself a Heinz 57, meaning my ancestors came from all over the world even though my skin is white.

Did you know that God mentions loving others many times in the Bible? It is so important that He commands us to do so.

Dear Lord please help us be kind and to love one another. Help us see past the color of other people's skin and look at what is inside. True beauty is inside not on the outside. Help us remember that Jesus even loved those that killed Him, and He died for us all. In Jesus's name, I pray AMEN.

Burke County Schools, Blue Ridge Healthcare Foundation Unveil Food Truck

During a ribbon cutting ceremony today at the Olive Hill Resource Center, members of the Burke County Board of Education, along with officials from the Blue Ridge HealthCare Foundation and Carolinas Health-Care System Blue Ridge, declared the new Burke County Public Schools food truck open for service.

The 20.5-foot, state-of-the art, professional-grade food truck rolled into town on Wednesday and on July 7 will start rolling into neighborhoods to feed students. On the outside, the truck is outlined with bold teal and orange that match the district's logo. The dominate design on the truck is the logo and tagline: Igniting Learning for a Brighter Future. Abstract art splashes in a rainbow of hues dot the ends of the truck. The serving side of the truck features differ from the driver's side in that it includes the Blue Ridge HealthCare Foundation's name and logo. Part of the Foundation's proceeds from its annual gala in 2019 helped purchase the food truck as the Foundation donated \$42,500 to Burke County Public Schools. The inside of the truck is a chef's dream kitchen on wheels complete



with everything needed to meet any foodie's taste buds.

The truck will be used most immediately as part of the district's summer feeding program. During the regular school year, it will travel to field days, sporting events and



other special school events. It also will serve as a classroom on wheels for high school culinary students and pop up around town to serve the public at festivals

Burke County Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Larry Putnam said, "With the popularity of food trucks, we saw this as a way to relate to our students and provide mobile food options that will allow us to travel out into the community. We are grateful for our friends at Carolinas HealthCare System Blue Ridge and the Blue Ridge HealthCare Foundation for their willingness to partner with us on this venture that will truly have an impact on students' lives. The food truck will serve our students not only by providing meals, but also by providing the real-life work experience for high school culinary students."

Burke County Public Schools Child Nutrition Director Daniel Wall said, "In a typical summer, we feed about 600 students at two elementary schools. We are in different times now with COVID-19 and are feeding kids grab-and-go style through car rider lines at five of our schools and off one yellow bus. We have been able to double the number of students served so far this summer and expect that to only increase with the arrival of the food truck. This truck is an opportunity for kids to access meals they might not be able to get otherwise."

Carolinas HealthCare System Blue Ridge CEO Kathy Bailey said, "I'm happy we could be a part of this and provide educational material for the kids. The food truck is a fun way for them to learn about healthy eating and making lifestyle changes such as cutting back on sugar and eating more fruits and vegetables. The truck also addresses an unfortunate need in the community -feeding hungry children. We hope our partnership with the school system continues to grow and we find creative ways to meet the needs of our community."

Blue Ridge HealthCare Foundation Executive Director Traci Riebel said, "The Blue Ridge HealthCare Foundation finds it an honor to be a part of this special project that will reach numerous children within the community during the summer months. We will be providing information on important health topics as well with some fun giveaways."

Hospital representatives and Board of Education members enjoyed the first meal served off the food truck. The menu included shrimp and grits, pork sliders and chicken mozzarella ciabatta.

Starting July 7, the truck will replace the yellow school bus that has been delivering meals on Tuesdays and Fridays to three Morganton locations. The food truck will serve free meals to children 18 years old and younger on Tuesdays and Fridays at 11 a.m. at Hillcrest Elementary, 201 Tennessee St.; at 11:45 a.m. at PPG Paint Store, 511 Burkemont Ave. and at 12:30 p.m. at Walker Road Baptist Church, 100 Walker Road.


Retirement Resource Solutions

Why and How to Give

For those of you who regularly read my column thanks. This month will be a little different. I want to share a way to help non-profit organizations with your qualified retirement plans (IRA,401(k), and 403(b)). But first I would like to share why the YMCA is such an important organization to me and how you can help them.

In full disclosure, I have a long history with the YMCA. I also help them raise funds to support communi-

If you are age 70 or older this is important to know if you make charitable contributions. With the Trump tax laws came the increase in the standard deduction to \$12,200 per person for 2019 or \$24,400 per couple. This made tax filing much easier, but also minimized the impact that charitable contributions have on your taxes. Before every contribution was taken from the amount of your income that was taxed, with the change it only makes sense if your contributions and interest exceed your standard deduction. This change has had an impact on charitable organizations. But what is not widely known is that if you are over 70 and have a qualified retirement plan you can still claim your standard deduction and a gift from your Qualified plans to benefit from both. Normally any distribution from

your IRA for example is subject to income tax and up to this year you had to withdraw a certain amount of money to satisfy your required minimum distributions (RMD's) starting at age 70 1/2. With the SECURE Act, this age was moved out to age 72 if you had not reached age 70 ½ by January 1, 2020. These distributions often created additional tax consequences for money that was not needed. Here is where you can benefit from what is known as qualified charitable distributions (QCD). This allows you to directly give to a qualified charity without having it characterized as income. So as an example. Let's say that you want to give \$10,000 to the YMCA to help develop young leaders. If you don't take advantage of the QCD you would give the \$10,000 and if it is less than \$24,400 for a couple receive no additional tax break. If you pull it out of your IRA you will pay the taxes and still get no further benefit on your taxes. So, in essence, your gift costs you the taxes you pay on the gift to the YMCA. Now if you are over age 70 you can still get your standard deduction and if you gift it directly from your IRA you do not have to pay the taxes on the money. This saves you money, helps a great organization and you still get all your standard deduction. The net result is you can give more without any tax consequences. There is a limit to this of \$100,000 per year, but if you want to give more give me a call and I can connect you with people that can help structure your gifts to minimize your taxes. Is this not a great deal? If you have questions please feel free to reach out to me. I am glad to help you give to the YMCA, your church, or any other charitable organization.


