

"At A Moment's Notice"


Levi Sawyer... John Hawks... James Goodwin...

Asa Rugg...Joel Phinney... Do any of those names ring
a bell? These are the names of only a few of the Revolutionary minutemen that
served our country. Although many of their names are not well-known today,
civilian colonists called "minutemen" comprised about a fourth of the militias
during the time of the Revolutionary War. These men were selected from militia
muster rolls by their commanding officers and were typically young men who
were chosen for their enthusiasm, reliability, and physical strength. They were
expected to be ready to assemble and serve at a moment's notice, hence their
designation and title.

I will admit, I am starting to feel the effects of my age and I am not so sure that I can be ready for anything (other than a meal) at a moment's notice, but when I read the verse above, the minutemen are what immediately came to my mind. As the children of God, we should be ready at moment's notice to tell others about the HOPE that is in us. We see God's "minutemen" all throughout Scripture, but I would like to focus briefly on the Apostle Paul and his ministry.

In the opening chapter of Romans, we hear Paul make what has become a very popular statement on the Gospel, and basically lays out the theme of Romans ... the Gospel of Christ. Verse 16 says "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." Paul was letting them know upfront that he was unashamed of the good news of Jesus Christ! The good news of the Gospel has not changed since Jesus' day...and this is what we accept and believe by faith for salvation.

Consider all the great opportunities that Paul had to share the Gospel. In Acts 25 & 26 we see him before rulers such as Felix and Agrippa, yet when given the chance to speak, Paul did not argue or complain, he only spoke to them about



Paul was unashamed to BELIEVE this Gospel. Many in this day do not want to believe the message of the Gospel. They are ashamed to admit that they are lost, separated by their sins from God, and need a Savior. When Paul stood before Agrippa in Acts 26, he was not ashamed to recount how that the Lord had saved Him on the Damascus Road. Are we willing to tell others how we came to believe the Gospel and share with them our salvation experience?


Paul was also unashamed to CONFESS the Gospel. Everywhere he went in his travels, the message was the same.... Jesus! Are we being consistent with the message that we are sharing with the world? Are we ready at a moment's notice to confess to the world this Gospel that we believe? Jesus told His disciples in Mark 8:38 "Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."


And finally, Paul was unashamed to SPREAD the Gospel. In the preceding verse (Rom 1:15) Paul says "So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also." Paul had surrendered to the ministry of the Lord and was bold in his work for Him as he spread this glorious Gospel. This is the place that a lot of Christians stop because it means we must deny ourselves and our desires and overcome the fears of sharing our faith.

In a world that so desperately needs to hear the good news of the Gospel, may we each heed the words of 1 Peter 3:15 and be ready "at moment's notice" to share our faith!

He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His daily control.


Eternity & Eternal Security

Our soul, the essence of our being, was created by God to exist forever. That forever is spent in one of two places: eternally present and in union with God because of His forgiveness and salvation or eternally separated from God because of sin and unbelief. At the moment that our physical body dies, those who are saved are immediately taken to heaven. Those who have rejected God's gift of salvation will spend eternity separated from God in hell. Because God gives man eternal life through Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and eternal power of God that gives this security. (John 3:16; 5:11-13, 10:29; 1 John 2:25; Romans 6:23; Revelation 20:15; 2 Timothy 1:12; Hebrews 7:25; 10:10-14; 1 Peter 1:3-5)

Salvation

Salvation is God's gift of redemption and reconciliation to Himself and is offered freely to all who accept, by faith alone, Jesus Christ as God's only son and receive Him as Lord and Savior. We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.



Our Republic: Can We Keep It? So Far, We're Losing It By Rev. Mark Creech

The story has been told and retold. It's been said that Benjamin Franklin had just walked outside of Independence Hall after the Constitutional Convention in 1787 when someone inquired, "Doctor, what have we got? A republic or a monarchy?" Franklin is said to have responded: "A republic, if you can keep it."

Historians say the quote actually doesn't appear



The story is intriguing, and I see no reason to doubt its historicity or render it as a legend. It also appears in numerous other works. What seems most important is the question believed to have been attributed to Franklin. It asks every generation of Americans: Can we keep this great Republic?

In a speech by Mark Steyn at Hillsdale College and published by Hillsdale's Imprimis, Steyn laments "Our Increasingly Unrecognizable Civilization." He mourns three essential things our Republic has lost: equality before the law, border control, and honest elections.

He notes how a policeman shot a young woman threatening the life of another woman with a knife. Unfortunately, the officer's identity was released to the public for vilification. Yet another policeman shot an unarmed woman in the U.S. Capitol building on January 6, and his identity is protected.

America currently has no southern border, says Steyn, and no plan to get one. Moreover, "dare I bring up the fact that it is a real question whether we can go back to agreeing to have open and honest elections," he asks. "If we don't have open and honest elections, control of our borders, and equality before the law, then we don't have the conditions for politics or free government."

Steyn speaks truth, hard truth! But he didn't stop there; he went on to talk about much more. He seemed especially concerned about "the escalation of so-called wokeness," as he put it.

Here's what he said about that issue:

"If you look at one of the most startling manifestations of this, transgender fanaticism – which involves, after all, the abolition of biological sex and, I'm sorry to have to say it, the physical mutilation of children – one notices that America is farther down this road than any other country in the Western world. In other words, at this moment of crisis for Western Civilization, or for what we used to call Christendom, the leading country of the free world is pulling the wrong way.

"Think of it. Your daughter has been training since she was a little girl to run in school sports. Now at 17, she's in the state high school track championships, and you are forbidden even to notice that she's competing against a woman who is 6'2 with thighs like tugboats, a great touch of five-o'clock shadow on her face, and the most muscular bosom you've ever seen. You're not supposed to notice the craziness of this, and the craziness is at its craziest right here in America.

"We traditionally think of France as being a bit screwy, but today there are French intellectuals who regard themselves as hardcore leftists and yet who think America has gone bonkers on this transgender issue. President Macron himself has said that American wokeness is an existential threat to the French Republic, and he even found bureaucrats in France's education bureaucracy who agreed. There is not a single bureaucrat in the Department of Education in Washington, D.C. who would agree, but there are apparently a few in Paris."

Steyn adds that other countries further east in Europe: Hungary, Poland, and the Czech Republic fear the exportation of America's foolish wokeness.

"But again, even most of our conservative leaders and institutions seem oblivious," Steyn concludes.

He is so right. Never have I read anyone who speaks with more clarity about the danger this nation is facing.

This year in the North Carolina General Assembly, lawmakers were unwilling to seriously take up the Save Women's Sports Act, legislation that would have prohibited male students that attend public schools from participating in sports designated for females. The leadership wouldn't even allow a vote on the bill in committee. But they are taking-up, and even voting on a measure for so-called medicinal marijuana - a proposal which, if it passes - will undoubtedly give our youth the impression there is something good about the harmful drug and ultimately lead to the passage of recreational marijuana. Surely, that's what we need to focus on - opening Pandora's box for another ruinous legal intoxicant.

I think this kind of prioritizing by our leaders – this failure to discern between good and evil – what's urgent and what isn't – begs the question of whether we really can keep this Republic.

Perhaps what we ought to do this July 4 is to skip the barbecues, the beaches, that trip to our favorite vacation spot, and even the fireworks. America is in terrible trouble! Instead, we should fill our churches to pray this isn't our last Independence Day.

So sorry to be a killjoy, but all the signs are clear. We are losing this Republic.

Marlene's Meditations

The Beauty of Dull

But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light; 1 Peter 2:9

Wandering into the cathedral quiet of Leviticus, the third book of the Bible, I stared at the lofty ceilings. The priceless murals spread in rich biblical scenes for

the length of the room, and top shelves overflowed with rules and rights. Within reach were the beautifully illustrated volumes that connected Leviticus to the New Testament—at least 20 "books" with gilt edging that glimmered in the soft lights.

Studying Leviticus reminded me of my visit to the oldest university in Ireland.

Studying Leviticus reminded me of my visit to the oldest university in Ireland called Trinity College. The vaulted Long Room, one of the library buildings, is over 200 feet in length and contains around 200,000 of the rarest books. The architecture is stunning, and I could have happily lived there. Beautiful Design

Leviticus is like Trinity College Library—a priceless treasure for which we waited an hour to enter our scheduled tour. The third book of the Bible opens up its beauty and holy chambers that offer me an exclusive journey like no other section of the Bible.

While I would normally seek the drama of Esther or the practical life hacks of the book of Ruth, my assignment was Leviticus 25:1-22 for a recent writing challenge. I discovered, to my delight, the chiastic structure that adds harmony, clarity, and emphasis to the whole book. I immersed myself in the harmony of the literary structure. According to https://literarydevices.net/, a chiasmus is: "a rhetorical device in which two or more clauses are balanced against each other by the reversal of their structures to produce an artistic effect" (An example is: "Never let a Fool Kiss You or a Kiss Fool You."). This literary device helps clarify the complicated regulations of Leviticus. Indeed, one scholar considered Leviticus the mother-lode of chiastic structure, and that alone pulled me back into the book. Communication Skills

Leviticus means called out. It's all about communication says Rabbi Elyse Goldstein, a rabbi, and author from Toronto, Ontario, Canada. We, as Christians, are called to extend the Gospel to the world as explained in Matthew 28:19-20. And who today does not need more communication skills in this hyper-sensitive word-driven society of ours? Studying how God interacts with His chosen people will help us polish our engagement skills with others.


While some may try to overlook the stunning architecture or the practical holiness of Leviticus, the unmistakable repetitions and references in the New Testament (ranging from 20 to 39 according to the interpretation of the original language) prove its relevance to us today.

- 1. We are called, thousands of years later, to be holy as the Israelites were instructed (Leviticus 11:44 compared to 1 Peter 1:16).
- 2. We are told to love our neighbor, and this does not change from Leviticus to today (Leviticus 19:18 compared to Mark 12:31).
- 3. God walks with us through life. This was true for the Israelites, and it is true for Christians today (Leviticus 26:12 compared to 2 Corinthians 6:16).
- 4. As saved sons and daughters, we are a priestly people, a precious connection to the Levitical priesthood in the third book of the Bible (Leviticus, chapters 8-9 compared to 1 Peter 2:9).
- 5. Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament sacrificial system described in Leviticus, and this helps us to understand his life, ministry, and death. (Leviticus, chapters 1-7 compared to the Gospels). (from https://bible.org/seriespage/1-learning-love-leviticus)

How relevant Leviticus is to us today!

Go, enter the hallowed halls of Leviticus, and enjoy its beauty and connection to us today. As I immersed myself in the grandeur of Trinity College's Library in Ireland, I realized that the rare books, donated by countries and individuals in answer to Ireland's invitation, were authoritative testimonies to the power of words. John 1:1 says, "In the beginning was the word, and the word was with God, and the word was God." The more I study Leviticus, to some a dull book, the more I delight in its grand architecture, skilled communication, and its significant links from the Old Testament to the New Testament.

God's Security

"I'll always love you" is something I often tell my son. He's only three years old, but I want him to know that no matter what he does I will always love him unconditionally. Nothing will separate him from my love for him. God has the same unconditional love for us.

Paul tells the believers in the city of Rome that they will go through tough times writing, "Can anything ever

separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death?" (Romans 8:35, NLT). Paul tells us about seven things that we will experience: trouble, calamity, persecution, be hungry, destitute, put in danger, and threatened. Paul continues and gives us the assurance we need.

"And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

In these two verses, Paul lists ten things that cannot separate us from God's love. Whether it be death, life, angels, demons, fears for today, worrying about tomorrow, the powers of hell, the sky above, the earth below, or all creation, nothing can sever us from God's love.

(I've always loved Max Lucado's book on Romans titled, In the Grip of Grace: He Will Love You Forever; it's a great description of Paul's letter to the Romans and a book I recommend you read.)

In Franklin Graham's autobiography, Rebel with a Cause, he reveals his crazy lifestyle as a young man smoking and drinking lots of whiskey. In an article with the Citizen-Times Franklin Graham reflected on his rebellious years and talked about his relationship with his father, Billy Graham. "I remember my father saying, 'Franklin, your mother and I love you very much, and we want you to know that no matter what you do in life, no matter where you go, our home will always be your home."

We too should be assured that our Father's home will always be our home. No matter where we go or what we do, He'll always be ready to welcome us home because He loves us unconditionally.

Paul writes a letter to the Philippians, thanking them for the gift they sent him. They were aware he was in jail in Rome. In V.1, Paul's words to "Stand fast in the Lord" are more than encouragement. It is a commandment from Paul. He knew they too faced struggles, persecution and urged them to rejoice, regardless of their present circumstances. Paul spoke those words from his own experiences of serv-



ing God while enduring hardships. In 2 Corinthians 11:23-28, Paul recounts his numerous beatings, imprisonment, receiving lashes, being stoned, shipwrecked, facing hunger and thirst. In his self, Paul could only stand "in the Lord." He suffered for Christ's sake, "For when I am weak, then am I strong." 2 Corinthians 12:10.

Many other notables in the Bible continued to "stand fast in the Lord." Young David "hastened and ran toward the army to meet the Philistine." Daniel is another great man who had committed that he would die instead of serving a false God. Moses, Abraham, Stephen, Sampson, and others stood fast because they realized they were not standing alone but in the Lord.

Our standing must always be combined with "in the Lord," for we cannot do it alone. We first stood fast in the Lord when we surrendered our life to Jesus Christ and trusted him for salvation. With Jesus, we never stand alone as we gain strength and courage to overcome our circumstances.

You may be familiar with the Christian hymnal entitled "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus. In 1858, George Duffield, Jr. assisted a fellow minister (Dudley Tyng) in a Pennsylvania revival. Five thousand men attended, with over one thousand converts. Tyng died the following month in a farming accident. Duffield wrote the song based on the revival message and recited the hymn as a tribute to his friend

Stand up, Stand up for Jesus, Ye soldiers of the cross. Lift high his royal banner, It must not suffer loss. From victory unto victory, His army shall He lead, Till every foe is vanquished And Christ is Lord indeed.

Our difficulties are nothing compared to Paul and others in the Bible, as we Stand Fast in the Lord.



Contempt or Kindness?

"Have mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, for we have had more than enough of contempt. Our soul has had more than its fill of the scorn of those who are at ease, of the contempt of the proud." (Psalm 123:3-4)

Recently, my wife and I celebrated our 32nd wedding anniversary. Anytime someone asks us how long we have been married, they look shocked, as if marriages are not supposed



According to an article in The Atlantic, "contempt...is the No. 1 factor that tears couples apart. People who are focused on criticizing their partners miss a whopping 50 percent of positive things their partners are doing, and they see negativity when it's not there. People who give their partner the cold shoulder - deliberately ignoring the partner or responding minimally - damage the relationship by making their partner feel worthless and invisible, as if they're not there, not valued. And people who treat their partners with contempt and criticize them kill not only the love in the relationship but also their partner's ability to fight off viruses and cancers. Being mean is the death knell of relationships.

Kindness, on the other hand, glues couples together. Research independent from theirs has shown that kindness (along with emotional stability) is the most important predictor of satisfaction and stability in a marriage. Kindness makes each partner feel cared for, understood, and validated - loved...A great deal of evidence shows that the more someone receives or witnesses kindness, the more they will be kind themselves, which leads to upward spirals of love and generosity in a relationship" (Emily Esfahani Smith, "Masters of Love," 6/12/14).


In today's passage, the people of God have endured "more than enough" of the contempt and scorn of people who couldn't care less. How do God's people respond? They turn their eyes to the kindness of God. "Have mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us" (v. 3). The repetition of this phrase expresses both the magnitude and seriousness of the situation, as well as the mindset of God's people as we wait in dependence on God to intervene.

In this Psalm, "where real power and real malice are pitched against a righteous cause, the people of God know what to do. They keep patiently on with the task before them; but even more important, they look constantly in prayer to the One who alone is both pledged to uphold the right and able to frustrate the wrong" (Michael Wilcock, The Message of Psalms 73-150, p. 228).

Prayer: Lord, we thank you that you look upon us with eyes of mercy. In a world full of contempt, help us to show kindness to others.





"See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:15-16)

The sign said, "Watch Your Step!", but I didn't see it. Focused on getting from here to there quickly and efficiently without delay instead of the exact placement of my feet meant that I passed by the warning like I had done many times before, with no conscious thought of its



If only we had someone available to remind us of this important safety precaution then we would at least have the potential to miss much of what happens to bring pain, suffering, and loss. "Watch Your Step!" or you could be injured. "Watch Your Step!" or you could cause someone else to be hurt. "Watch Your Step!" or you could soon be in the midst of disaster.

Confessions often shared with the Chaplain offer opportunity to present the gift of this challenge from God's Word. The English word circumspectly is translated from the Greek word akribos (pronounced ah-kree-bose') meaning diligently or exactly. Perhaps a most helpful understanding of this verse would be 'to walk giving careful attention to each step taken.'

Perhaps we have found ourselves facing the consequences of our inattention... It is common in prison and it is common almost everywhere else too.

The apostle Paul is teaching the congregation in Ephesus that when believers are thoughtful and attentive to the implications of their actions, then they can make the most of the moments that make up the years of their lives. Such thoughtfulness leads to the ability to make wise decisions and avoid the consequences of foolish decisions. This truth is of particular importance because the 'days are evil'. The most obvious observation that can be made here is that when we fail to give careful attention to the manner of our daily living, we are prone to get caught up in the less than honorable.

Someone once said, "If we are to redeem the time, meaning buy the time for ourselves, then we must make wise and sacred use of every opportunity for doing good so that zeal and well being are as it were the purchase money by which we make the time our own."

If only every hazard had a warning label...but then that would be too easy! Inevitably human beings cease paying close attention to the potential hazards on our life journey and find ourselves (and often others) in pain as a result. Prisons are full of people who ceased paying attention to the warning signs.

Some might argue that to sound this alarm is a form of judgmental thinking. "How dare you presume to know what is best for me, or what I need to do to watch my step!" But the warning made out of love and compassion is NOT judgmental at all.

It is a privilege to sound the alarm to any who needs to hear it. 'WATCH Your Step!" It's a warning meant to help someone else avoid the consequences of be-

How might this warning be of help to you today? And how could this shared warning benefit others you know and care about today?

Walking Circumspectly

Ephesians 5:14-16 says "... Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light. See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil."



Note the two words from our text that say "walk circumspectly." The first thing I believe we should take notice of is the verb "walk." Since it is a verb there are several aspects of the verb we should notice. The verb of a sentence is where the action is. First, the verb is plural in the Greek New Testament from which our Bible came. That means every believer has a responsibility to walk like a Christian should walk. God expects all (not a few) of his children to walk circumspectly.

Secondly, the verb "walk" is present tense. That tense speaks of continuous or ongoing action. So many Christians live their lives like a yoyo when it comes to consistency in their lives. Maybe one day the believer will live in an upright manner, while another day he may cater to the flesh and not be upright in his walk. God wants us to be consistent, constant, reliable, and steady.

The action word "walk" is also active voice. That means we cannot depend on someone else to walk the walk for us. It is our responsibility. We are to actively live the life God wants us to live.

"Walk" is also indicative, which simply means it is an action represented as certain or realized. All born-again believers can certainly, through the power of Almighty God, live the Christian life. There is no doubt about that fact.

The word "circumspectly", as part of speech is an adverb, which describes and tells us something about the verb. It comes from a word that is translated as "most straightest" in our King James Bibles. The Greek word (akribos), which is here translated "circumspectly" which is translated in our KJV in other places as "diligently" and as "perfectly."

I am going to use the translation of the root word from which "circumspectly" is derived, as the way of describing what I believe the word is saying. It can mean "most straightest" (Acts 26:5). In Acts 26:5 Paul speaks of his past religious affiliation as a Jew as being a Pharisee, "the most straightest sect of his past religion." The word expresses a life that is walking straight in the will of God rather than walking in a deviated path. So many people who say they know the Lord take detours oftentimes from the straight and narrow way.

Why Should We Walk Circumspectly?

You should walk in this way because of expectations. That is what the Lord wants for you. We should always be concerned about what the will of the Lord is for our lives. That is a trait of a true, dedicated believer. Christ saved us not to walk

as a lost world does, but rather to walk as a saved child of God should. Sometimes it seems some people in the world know more about how a Christian should walk than some believers do.

Walk-in this way because of testimony. Your testimony is one thing you do not want to lose. Your life may testify in a good way while others degrade and demean you, saying things about you that are unjustified and not true. The Bible says, "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches" (Prov.22:1). There is nothing that will grieve you more inwardly than knowing that someone has determined they are going to destroy your reputation. Regardless of what others may say about you, your life will speak for itself. 1 Peter 2:15, "For so is the will of God, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men." You silence the ignorance of men by simply doing right. By doing good you reduce to silence the ignorance of men who are unreflecting and unintelligent. Your upright life will bring to nothing the criticism of the uninformed and inaccurate people.

Walk-in this way because of satisfaction. No true saint of God can walk in less than an upright manner and have peace and calm in their hearts. It is when we do what we know we ought to do that we have the peace of God in our hearts. In Philippians 4:9 the Apostle Paul wrote: "Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you." When we do what we should do, it is then we have the peace we desire for our lives. If we go against what we should do to live upright, then there is turmoil and agitation on the inside.

Where Should We Walk Circumspectly?

Everywhere we go we should be the same in our Christian lives. How can we live one way when we are at church, then turn around and live the opposite when we are outside the church? People in the world need to see genuine people, whose lives manifest the way a true child of God should live. Inconsistency in the lives of God's children turns people away from the things of God. Too many believers are like a weathervane, they turn whichever way the wind is blowing.

How Can We Walk Circumspectly?

First, you must realize the evil days necessitate it. There is so much evil that abounds in our day. The Bible says in Eph. 5:16, "the days are evil." Since the days are evil, we need to redeem the time or make the most of every opportunity to do good as we live each day of our lives.

Also, we must realize that it is foolish to live any other way. What is the main mark of a fool? He or she does not want to acknowledge or follow God. The Bible says, "The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God" (Psalm 14:1). That verse cannot be used only in reference to an atheist, but it can be used of an ungodly, self-ruled person who says, "No God for me. I will live my own life the way I want to live it. I do not need God or His Word to tell me what to do." Psalm 14:1 describes the fool as one who is---- corrupt, that does abominable works, and as one who does not practice good.

A very important factor in walking circumspectly is to be filled with the Holy Ghost. We are commanded as believers to be filled or controlled by God's Spirit in Eph. 5:18. As the drunkard is controlled by his alcohol, they believe it to be under the control of the Spirit. Compare Acts 1:8. If we are not Holy Ghost controlled, then it stands to reason you will be controlled by the flesh or the old nature. If that be the case, things will not turn out very well in your life.

It is also important that you have a song in your heart. Ephesians 5:19 says, "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord." It is easier to live in an upright manner if you have a spiritual song in your heart. We need to sing songs about the Lord Himself. I love to sing about Heaven but oh how I love to have a song about Jesus and His salvation in my heart.

Having a thankful spirit also makes it easier to live an upright way. Ephesians 5:20 tells us, "Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." When you grumble and complain, it is as though you are discontented either with the Lord or His providence in your life. The upright person is always moving forward with a thankful spirit.

Live circumspectly and when you will stand before the Lord, it will pay off in eternal dividends.

Godprints

The Lord God called Abram to a special relationship and a special purpose. In Genesis 12:1-3, we hear that covenant calling, "Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country, And from your relatives And from your father's house, To the land which I will show you; And I will make you into



a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And you shall be a blessing; And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed." (NASB)

Skip Heitzig, a popular pastor, teacher, and radio preacher recently wrote an excellent book that also has an eye-catching cover. On the front cover of the book, there is a huge fingerprint printed in red that is centered on the cover and surrounded by two other huge uppercase letters. G on the left and D on the right. Of course, the fingerprint represented the letter O and together they spell GOD. Underneath was written PRINT. The name of the book is Godprint: Making Your Mark for Christ.

In thinking about our own unique call from God to a special relationship and purpose, I have come across many Christians who are confused about that calling and what it means. It reminds me of a young man who was sad, confused, and perplexed about seeing his dad, who claimed to be a Christian acting one way when he was around church folks and completely different when he was outside of that setting. Controlled by anger, rage, confusion, and fear, the dad would fly into cursing fits when the pressure mounted at home and work. He was often consumed by his rage and took it out on anyone and everyone around him. The son confronted him one day and challenged him, "Why are you acting this way? I thought you were a Christian!" The father snorted back, "I'm saved, forgiven, and on my way to heaven! It doesn't matter what I do and how I act!"

Clearly, he got the first part right! By faith, he had placed his trust in God's plan to save him from his sins. He had trusted in Jesus—and the moment that he confessed with his mouth that Jesus was the Son of God, and invited the Lord to be his Savior—God did what He promised He would do! He applied the blood of Jesus toward all payments that were due because of sin. God laid claim to the dad's soul and prepared for him a place in heaven. The first truth is that God frees us from the penalty of sin and death by merit of Christ's sacrifice on Calvary's cross. We are set free!

But the reality of faith begs that we ask several important questions. The first question we must ask is, "Set free from what?" The answer is from the eternal separation from our creator God that was created by our sin.

The second important question that we must ask (but is all too often seldom asked) is, "Set free to do what?" Most Christians understand the first part. However, many Christians misunderstand the second part of God's plans and purposes. Here is God's truth and plan for each one of us—we have been set free from sin and death so that we are free to choose TO LIVE FOR GOD! God didn't save us so that we would live for ourselves (although we are certainly free to choose to do that). Our choices matter! Your choices matter! What we do, how we act, how we treat others, and how we live our lives does matter. It matters to our loved ones. It matters to those around us. And it matters to God. Our choices are critical and crucial to the plans and purposes of God. We, whom He had claimed as His spiritual children, are invited into a special relationship with Him. We have been adopted as spiritual sons and daughters of the Most High God. And in that special relationship, now unimpeded by the penalty of sin and rebellion, we are called, commanded, and commissioned to live for Him! As Heitzig suggests, we are called to leave a "Godprint" on this world.

"A Christian leaves a Godprint whenever he or she, by the power of the Holy Spirit, positively influences the world for the cause of Christ...[and] every Christian has the opportunity to leave a lasting, God-centered, positive impression upon the Earth," insists Heitzig.

In fact, each of us does indeed leave evidence of our presence and activity in this world. A carbon footprint is an ecological impression each person makes upon the natural world and our planet, for good or for ill, a measure of the impact our activities have on the environment and upon the lives of our fellow citizens.

The concept raises an interesting question for Christians. Are we supposed to leave some kind of mark? Should we care about the impression we leave? Should we be concerned with our spiritual footprint? Our legacy? Our impact? Of course, we should! That's why God called us to salvation and then called us to live for Him.

Heitzig continues, "While I firmly believe we should be good stewards of God's good creation, I think we should have a far greater interest in something more than reducing our carbon footprint. This something is what I call a "Godprint." A Christian leaves a Godprint, a living testimony whenever he or she, by the power of the Holy Spirit, leaves a God blessing upon this world. God informed Abram, you will be blessed as you obediently go "to the land which I will show you" and leave the unmistakable evidence of my presence and love. The gospel writers gave evidence of God's love revealed in the finished work of Christ on the cross.

And so must you and I leave Godprints wherever we go. What a great idea! What a great opportunity? What a fantastic, wonderful journey God has sent us on—to leave Godprints all over this world. Everywhere we go. Everyone we meet. We are touching them and leaving beautiful fingerprints of God all over them. Would you do that today for His honor and glory? Blessings and peace, Pastor Jack.

Thinking about our purpose in life; that being our spiritual journey, a principle of purpose-driven living that each of us can reflect on. God has good, pleasing, and perfect plans for His children. He wants us to be new people with renewed minds, living to honor and obey Him. Reflect on what Paul is saying in 2 Timothy 2:7, "and the Lord give thee understanding into all things." We are to take time and reflect on and seriously consider what we read in scripture. Take time to think about the implications for your life. The Bible says, "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, Will of God" (Romans 12:2). Don't just read, Interact with what you read. Underline it. Write your own thoughts in a journal making it your book. Personalize it! React to what you read, don't just read.

- Point to Practice = Romans 12:2
- Verses to Remember = the most important habit you can begin is to copy verses onto small cards to carry with you and reflect on them when you have a free minute.
- Questions = write down questions about what you have read and discuss with others what you read.
- Spiritual growth = is never isolated. It is produced through relationships and community with other believers. Allow the Scripture to speak for itself.

A life devoted to things in this world is a dead life, a stump; a God-shaped life is a flourishing tree. (Paraphrased from Proverbs 11:28).

It all starts with God. It is not about us. God's purpose in our life is far greater than our own personal fulfillment, our peace of mind, or even our happiness. If you want to know why you were placed on this earth, you must begin with God. You cannot arrive at your life's purpose by starting with a focus on yourself. We must begin with God, our creator. We were born by His purpose and for His purpose. Focusing on ourselves will never reveal our life's purpose. Our attention to God and focusing on His Word leads us out into the open, into a spacious, free life. We were made by God and for God – and until we understand that, life will never make sense. (Reference Colossians 1:16).

Question: Despite all the advertising around us, how can we remind ourselves that life is really about living for God, not ourselves?

What is the meaning of life and the purpose of life? It is a revelation. We can turn to what God has revealed about life through His Word. The easiest way to discover the purpose for our life is to ask the creator: Ask God. Real discipleship implies real commitment – pledging our whole existence to His service. If we try to save our physical life from death, pain, or discomfort, we may risk losing our true eternal life. If we protect ourselves from the pain God calls us to suffer, we begin to die spiritually and emotionally. We lose our intended purpose. When we give our lives in service to Christ, we discover the real purpose of living. When we don't know Christ, we make choices as though this life were all we have. But in reality, this life is just the introduction into eternity. How we live this brief span of life, determines our eternal state. Evaluate all that happens from an eternal perspective, and you will find your values and decisions changing. (Reference Matthew 16:25-26).

The only accurate way to understand ourselves is by what God is and by what He does for us. The key to an honest and accurate evaluation is knowing the basis of our self-worth – our identity in Christ. In Him, we are valuable and capable of worthy service. Don't miss your true value in God's eyes. (Paraphrase of Romans 12:3). Nothing matters more than knowing God's purposes for your life, and nothing can compensate for not knowing them.

- Benefits of Purpose-Driven Living

 1. Knowing your purpose gives meaning to your life.
- 2. Knowing your purpose simplifies your life.
- 3. Knowing your purpose focuses your life.
- 4. Knowing your purpose motivates your life.
- 5. Knowing your purpose prepares you for eternity.

You weren't put on earth to be remembered. You were put here to prepare for eternity.

Living in purpose is the path to peace. "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on Thee: because he trusteth in Thee" (Isaiah 26:3).

Each of us will stand personally before the judgment seat of God.... Each of us will have to give a personal account to God for the choices we make. Something to Think About God may ask:

- 1. What did you do with my Son, Jesus Christ? The only thing that will matter is, did you accept what Jesus Christ did for you, and did you learn to love and trust Him?
- 2. What did you do with the gifts I gave you? Read the parable of the talents in Matthew 25:15-30.

The first question will determine where you spend eternity. The second question may determine what you do in eternity. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6). This life is in preparation for the next. Sadly, many people will have to endure eternity without God because they chose to live without Him here on earth. To God Be The Glory!



The Wasted Years

"The two angels arrived at Sodom in the evening, and Lot was sitting in the gateway of the city." Genesis 19:1a The expression at the beginning of this account, sitting in the gateway of the city, is an Eastern expression that needs to be understood. This does not mean Lot was simply passing



the time of day in the gate. This is a technical phrase that means he was the chief magistrate of the city of Sodom. His job was not only to give an official welcome to visitors of the city but also to investigate the nature of any strangers who might come and also administer justice concerning any quarrels. The nearest equivalent we have today would be the office of mayor. I want to be fair with Lot; I believe he meant to do the right thing. It is clear from the story of his life that though he wanted to get something out of Sodom, he also expected to put something into Sodom. He probably thought to himself, Well, I may do these people well. I may be able to win some of them from evil to faith. I can make money faster here than anywhere else, that's true, but I also may help clean up the city a little bit. It's a wicked place, and perhaps I can improve its moral life.

When Lot moved into Sodom, this is undoubtedly what he had in mind. Before long he became the mayor of the town, the most respected man in the city, the leader of its civic life. I would like to ask Lot a question. Lot, you made a great success out of your life. You've won your way from a nobody to the mayor of the city. You entered as an unknown, a foreigner, and you've achieved both wealth and honor here in the city of Sodom. My first question is this: How has your choice of life in Sodom affected your own inner life? Notice the extent of the evil of this city. This is the reason God visited it in judgment. Verse 4 says that "all the men of the city, both young and old, surrounded the house." All the people of Sodom were involved in homosexuality. As you read this account, you can see that Lot's reaction is disgust and shame. And this is no isolated instance; this was just a common ordinary event in Sodom. Second Peter says "Lot was distressed by the filthy lives of lawless men (for that righteous man, living among them day after day, was tormented in his righteous soul by the lawless deeds he saw and heard" (2 Peter 2:7b-8). This is a picture of discontent, bafflement, and frustration. Lot's soul was continuously vexed. He had tasted enough of the higher things of fellowship with God that he could never be satisfied with these sordid, ugly, obscene, and lewd things of Sodom.

Where are rest and peace and quietness of heart? It is up there with Abraham in his tent under the oak tree. But here in the city of Sodom is this man Lot. What good is it to have luxuries and wealth and every material gain if the heart is continually filled with a great hunger that cannot be fed or satisfied? Lot's answer to that question must be that his own life is grievously thwarted and blighted by the life of the city of Sodom. Lord, deliver me from wasted years where I sacrifice fellowship with You for success in the eyes of this world. In pursuit of worldly success we can seriously damage the inner life of the soul. Do we need to reassess our goals and invest our lives in eternal values?

In fact, pig stem cells are used for research and experiments for cures for humans. More than forty medicines including insulin are made from pigs. Doctors are also able to take heart valves from pigs and use them to replace damaged heart valves in people! How cool is that? There are also several products that we use regularly that come from pigs like weed killer and makeup. The traditional covering for a football is pigskin because their hide is very tough.

Pigs were the very first animal to be domesticated more than 6000 years ago.

The Chinese were the first to raise them for food. Pigs can be found on every continent except Antarctica. The country of Denmark has so many pigs, people there, are outnumbered 2 to 1! Hernando do Soto brought the first pig to the United States in 1539. The world's largest pig, named Big Bill weighed 2552 lbs. He was 5 ft. tall and 9 ft. long.

Pigs are omnivores. They have over 15,000 taste buds on their tongue, while we only have 9,000. Pigs will eat almost everything except

for cucumbers. They will only eat these if they are very hungry and have no other choice.

I don't like cucumbers either, in fact, I often say, "If a pig won't eat them then I'm not going to either." The funny part is that I love pickles!

Pigs can become bloodthirsty. We have had them eat the tails off of a cow that was lying down at the farm.

On average a baby pig weighs 2.5 lbs at birth and grows anywhere to 300-700lbs. Adult pigs usually gain 2 lbs a day. To gain this much weight they must eat 6 lbs of grain a day. They drink a whopping 14 gallons of water each day on top of their massive grain consumption! Even though adult pigs weigh a lot they are still able to run a 7 min. mile which equals up to 11 mph. This is amazing when you factor in their weight and small lungs.

The most piglets born at once on record were 37! Can you imagine having this many children? Momma Pigs, called Sows, are known to sing to their children when they are nursing. Pigs are very social animals and will often sleep nose to nose. They love to snuggle and they have dreams just like we do.


Pigs have tiny eyes and very poor eyesight. However, their sense of smell is phenomenal! They have 1113 active genes for the smell. They can smell so well that they can tell the difference between different kinds of mint with 100% accuracy. They can find food several feet underground and can pick up smells over 5 miles away. Pigs have been used by the military, known as soldier pigs, to sniff out underground mines. Pigs are also trained to find truffles and missing people. Pigs are very clean animals. They will not use the bathroom where they sleep unless they don't have enough space. The reason they wallow in the mud is to keep them cool because they do not sweat, and to keep from getting sunburnt.

Did you know that if a pig becomes loose and is left that way it only takes around one week before its skull starts to change and become the shape of a wild boar? In this short time they are becoming feral (wild.) Overtime (a few months) they will grow out their tusks and snout, and grow hair on their backs and become aggressive. Feral piglets will have stripes on them.

This reminds me of how similar we are to pigs. It only takes one misstep, one backtrack, one sin, to get us off the path and to upset our relationship with God. It is so easy for us to walk away from God and to change into a different person, a different lifestyle. The good news is that no matter how many steps we take away from God He is waiting on us to come back and it is only one step back to get back to Him. Every day we need to pray that we only make minimal mistakes. Pray that God protects us and helps us stay close to Him.

This makes me think of the story in the Bible of the son who wanted his inheritance early. He then went away and spent his inheritance. Eventually, he came home to his father ashamed of what he had done. His father was happy to see him and welcomed him with open arms. That is exactly how God is with us! Isn't that the best news ever? That He will forgive us of our sins and give us another chance no matter what we have done as long as we ask Him to.

Dear Lord, please help us to not turn our backs and become like feral pigs. Guide us to stay the course and live our lives according to your teaching. Help us have a constant personal relationship with you. Teach us to only make minimal mistakes in our life.



Laborers in His Kingdom

Jesus teaches a parable about the kingdom of heaven in Matthew 20:1-16. A parable is an earthly story or example that teaches a heavenly truth. Jesus used everyday examples that people could identify with and used these examples to teach eternal truths. An object lesson so to speak.

In this parable, the owner of an estate goes out very early in the morning, probably at dawn to hire laborers to work in his vineyard. He hires laborers and agrees to "a penny a day" or a denarius, which is a day's wages in that time. He goes back out at 9 am and hires more. At noon, at 3 pm, and 5 pm he does the same. At the end of the day, he gathers all the laborers to pay them their wages for the day. He begins with the last ones to be hired and pays them a penny, or denarius, which again, is a day's wages. This continues down to the laborers he hired at the beginning of the day. Every laborer was paid equally regardless of when they were hired. When the ones hired first saw what everyone was paid this was said: verses 10-12 state: "But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny. And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house. Saying, These last have wrought but one hour and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day." In other words, these men who had started at dawn felt like they should receive more pay even though they had agreed on the wages at the start of the day.

The owner of the vineyard responds to them in verses 13-15: "But he answered one of them, and said, Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny? Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee. Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine? Is thine eye evil, because I am good?" These laborers were not wronged in any way by the one who hired them, he paid them and the others what was agreed upon. And besides that, he was the owner of the vineyard and could do with his own what he wanted. Jesus ended this parable with this statement in verse 16: "So the last shall be first and first last: for many are called, but few chosen."

Remember, this parable is to teach us about the kingdom of heaven and salvation. The owner who hires the laborers is representative of God. The laborers who are hired represent believers. God offers to each one to become part of His kingdom. The ones He calls to believe have the choice whether or not to agree to be "hired" or believe. Once they believe they become laborers in His vineyard, His kingdom. They entered only because of His grace! He does with His own what He wants! Whether we come to salvation early in life, late in life, or in the middle of our lives we all receive the same gift of salvation. Those who may have served Jesus for many years are not "more saved" than those who were saved yesterday! We all are in His kingdom by His grace and His grace alone. To think that any of us are better than someone else because we have been saved longer is a work and attitude of this world and sinful flesh. To think we have an advantage over someone who has only just recently been saved is just plain wrong. The statement Jesus makes about the last being first and first being last isn't about switching places, or rewards, or having an advantage over someone else. It is about being equal. It's about the fact that we all have entered the kingdom of God by grace, we have all been chosen to labor in His kingdom by grace, we have all received the gift of eternal life by His grace, and He by his grace has bestowed upon us all as sinners the gift of eternal life!

My friends, rejoice not in how long you have been saved and rejoice not that you have been saved longer than someone else. Don't think that you or I have some sort of advantage over another because we've been saved longer. Rejoice in the fact that God through Christ has saved us period! We rejoice not in how long we have been saved but in the fact that we have been saved! Thanks be unto God for His unspeakable gift! Thanks be unto God that we are laborers in His kingdom!







Darryl Strawberry

Freedom Life held its Darryl Strawberry event on a beautiful evening at Big League Camp on June the 17th. There were approximately 1400 community and area gatherers who came together in support of this event.

Some of you may still ask, "who is Darryl Strawberry?" Though Darryl was extremely successful in his major league baseball career, his personal life was

Today, Darryl's purpose and passion are serving the Lord Jesus Christ by speaking a message of hope and helping others transform their lives through the power of the gospel. Darryl travels the country speaking and bringing a message of hope and restoration in Christ. Most recently he has been with Franklin Graham speaking at events sponsored by the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association.

Freedom Life invited Strawberry to come and speak to the community about overcoming his addiction. "The more we can share stories of overcoming addiction, the more those in addiction can understand it can be done," Jim Smith, Development Director. "One of our goals through this event was to bring more awareness to our community that hopelessness in addictions can stop and a new life can begin," Danny Hampton, Executive Director.

Freedom Life works with clients that are and have been incarcerated. Many of these clients also are addicts and Freedom Life begins working with many clients right in jail.

Over 150 volunteers came together to aid in parking, preparing the bbq meals, the VIP dinner, and the popular kid's zone. The Kids Zone was a hit for our young ones with inflatables, a water slide, snow cones, face painting, and balloon animals.

Many volunteers are or have been clients of Freedom Life. Some of these clients are part of a very special Federal Second Chance Act Program awarded through the Department of Justice. This program gives formally incarcerated individuals the intensive support and resourcing needed for a prolonged period to gain and maintain new life capacity and sustainability. These special volunteers took pride in setting up / cleaning up and supporting many of the guests who came to the event. "It was such a blessing to see them feel ownership and pride in giving back to the community that at one time they had been afraid of, and in their past – they had been so afraid and to face." Danny Hampton. "I am enjoying giving back to my community by being part of something bigger than me," Tim B. Another client made white corsages to give to those in attendance that had lost friends or family to addiction. This event turned out to be just as much of an "inreach" as an "outreach."

The VIP event was inside where pitching and batting practices happen. Darryl met with those in attendance and took a photo with each table.

Many local human services agencies participated in the evening. It was a joy to see so many agencies along with the Emergency Management, Sheriff, and Marion Police teams all participating.

Darryl began to speak, referencing having a praying mom. "My early years were a real struggle because I grew up in a very broken, dysfunctional home. My dad was a raging alcoholic and he would come home night after a night drinking and be very loud and, you know, disturbing the whole house, waking us up in the middle of the night.


And when I was fourteen, he woke us up one night and he was drunk. My older brother Michael said, "Why don't you just get out of here and leave us alone?" And he pulled out a shotgun and said he was going to kill the whole family at that particular time. And had it not been for my wonderful mother getting us boys out of the house—because we went into action, we were very serious about protecting our mother, it would have been a tragedy in my life.

We were young, but at the same time, we were hurting, you know, because of what was happening, the pain was real. And I think a lot of people don't understand that brokenness is real. Lawlessness brings about brokenness and brings broken generations one after the next.

And from that point there, my father was never around after that night. And the next day, my mother decided that she would move him out of the house and she would go on to divorce him. So she saw her kids responding in such a way she'd never seen us respond," said Strawberry.

"She was dying at the age of fifty-five. And we found this journal under her bed, which was incredible. She was praying to God, writing about all her kids, all five of us saying, "God save them, save them from the drugs, save them from their lifestyle, save them from this, save them from being [in] the sinful lifestyle." And she went on home to be with the Lord. And we saw that afterward. And I was heartbroken because my mother was a sweet woman that raised five of us by herself and took care of us with no man and only God in her life."

"And I ended up being a heathen and living a heathen lifestyle from this beautiful woman who lived a faithful life serving the Lord Jesus Christ. And to come to a place of getting healed and getting well was going to be a process for me. But it was her prayers. I know it was her prayers, you know because God kept me. Because when I think about it, you know, I say a heathen lifestyle—womanizer, alcoholic, drug addict, sinner, ended up in a Florida state prison with a T17169



"God would save me. And He would eventually use me to lead my entire family to get saved. And my sister, when she was dying at age fifty-one, I had to rush to the hospital to lead her in The Sinner's Prayer to be saved. God sends me to see my father in a hospital after He saves me and He sends me to repent to my father, for me keeping him out of my life. And He speaks to me: "How dare you not forgive him when I forgave you."


I asked my father to forgive me, and he did. A tear came out of his eye and he said, "Yes." And I just lost it. I just laid in his lap and cried so hard and then God says, "Raise up." Then I raised up and He says, "Lead him in The Sinner's Prayer." And there was the man that rejected me and beat me that left me scarred and wounded. God uses me to lead him in The Sinner's Prayer to lead him to the Lord.

God released me from any anxiety, depression, and everything because God made me understand that the forgiveness was not for [my father]. It was for me. God made it clear that two wrongs don't make a right. So two wrongs in a situation you can't bring right to it. You can't bring healing to it. And there was my life of who I was being transformed and all the broken pieces that were in my life that God would put them back together." "God made me understand that the forgiveness was not for my father. It was for me." – Darryl Strawberry

Stormy Weather

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration National Weather Service reports that about 1800 thunderstorms are happening at any given time, resulting in about 16 million storms per year. Most last thirty minutes or less and are typically about 15 miles in diameter, with the greatest threats being lightning and flash flooding. Tornadoes and hurricanes occur less frequently but are much more



powerful, often destroying homes, businesses, and lives. Summer storms are quite predictable and the rainfall is much needed for crops and plants. Thankfully, modern technology offers early warnings for severe storms allowing residents time to prepare or even evacuate if necessary. Unfortunately, the storms of life usually arrive with little warning. No one can forecast their length or intensity and evacuation is not an option.

Whether a storm is mild or severe, there are at least three Biblical truths that can serve as anchors for the soul; the sovereignty of God, the sacrifice of the Son, and the seal of the Holy Spirit. Meditating on and clinging to these three principles will ensure that our faith remains rooted and grounded during difficult times. The first anchor necessary to survive any storm is the foundational truth of the sovereignty of God. Our God created the heavens and the earth by His Word. "All things were created by Him and for Him and in Him all things hold together" (Colossians 1:17). "Not one sparrow falls to the ground unnoticed and even the hairs on our head are numbered" (Luke 12:7). "Nothing can touch our lives that is not first filtered through the loving fingers of our heavenly Father. The plans that He has for us may be painful and confusing but He promises that they are not for evil but for our good" (Jeremiah 29:11). The fiercer the storm, the stronger the tree. In God's economy, difficult times are essential for maturing our faith and conforming us to the image of Christ. Isaiah 43:1-3 says, "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are Mine! When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they will not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be scorched, nor will the flame burn you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior". In the darkest storms of life, our Father promises that He will never leave us or forsake us. The sovereignty of God is a sure anchor in every circumstance of life. The second anchor necessary for survival is the sacrifice of Jesus. The Father proved His love for the world by sending His only begotten Son so that no person need perish (John 3:16). Romans 8:32 emphatically states: "He Who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things?" Jesus willingly emptied Himself and became a servant, offering Himself as a ransom for whoever would receive His gift of eternal life. When the winds of life threaten destruction, remembering the unfathomable sacrifice of Jesus will anchor the soul and bring peace and hope. The third anchor that guarantees survival is the seal of the Holy Spirit. When we place our faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior, our body becomes the temple of the Holy Spirit. Ephesians 1:13 promises that we are now sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise. The Spirit witnesses with our spirit that we are truly the children of God. He is our guide, our comforter, our counselor and so much more. The Spirit will consistently shine the light of the promises of God into our hearts and minds. During seasons of extreme pressure, amid multiple fears and doubts, the seal of the Holy Spirit is a sure anchor for the soul. He is the guarantee that God will give us the heavenly inheritance He has promised to all who believe. Storms are common in the human experience, but there is no need for panic if we utilize our soul anchors; the sovereignty of God, the sacrifice of Jesus, and the seal of the Holy Spirit. Regardless of whether our storm is mild or severe, we are hidden with Christ in God; no one can snatch us



What About The Children?

All humans start out being born under sin. Psalm 51:5, "Behold I was shapen [guilt] in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me." This is the Word of God, but don't fret thyself, read on. Psalm 51:6, "Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward parts: [the seat of the mind and thoughts] the hidden part thou shall make me know wisdom." Isaiah 44:24," thus saith the LORD, thy redeemer, and he that formed thee from the womb, I am the LORD that maketh all things, that stretcheth forth the heavens alone; that spreadeth abroad the earth by myself." Job 33:4, "the spirit of God hath made me, and the breath of the Almighty has given me life."

Certainly, those who love the LORD have great awareness that we live in a time of great spiritual trouble. As concerned parents of any age, or as grandparents of our children who have children; we listen to the comforting words of the LORD; "If thy children will keep my covenant [contract between God and man] and my testimony that I shall teach them, their children shall also sit upon thy throne for ever more;" Psalm 132:12.

We know that the LORD is our strength in times of trouble. In the Old Testament book of Psalms, we read; "give ear, O my people, to my law: incline your ears to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable: I will utter dark sayings of old: Which we have heard and known, and our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from our children, shewing to the generations to come the praises of the LORD, and His strength, and the wonderful works that he has done; for he established a testimony in Jacob, and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers, that they should make them known to their children: that the generation to come might know them, even to the children which should be born; who should arise and declare them to their children; that they might see their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments;" Psalm 78;1-7. "If ye love me, keep my commandments;" John 14:15.


We see great reference to children as "children" are given special attention in the Bible. Of course, we who love the LORD recognize that we are His children, He is our heavenly Father. We also know that many times as adults we're referenced as children in the Scriptures; God speaking to Moses; "Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt;" Exodus 3:10. "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God; heirs of God, and jointheirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together;" Romans 8:16&17.

Children are a "heritage of the LORD". Heritage refers to taking possession or occupation. In a God-fearing family, God owns our children! They are God's heritage, His people. That's why we are told in Proverbs 22:6; "*Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.*"

"Lo, children are a heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb his reward; as arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are the children of thy youth. Happy is the man that has a quiver full of them: they shall not be ashamed, but they shall speak with the enemies in the gate;" Psalm 127:3-5.

Arrows, bows, and spears are modern-day guns and bullets. All are weapons of war used to physically threaten, wound, or kill an enemy. The spiritual arrows of God are lightings, evils and calamities inflicted on men. A quiver is a place of hiding the arrows that rattle when the quiver is struck. Also, the arrow makes a stridulous noise [Latin for a harsh sound] as it travels through the air.

The rattling of the arrows in the quiver just before the flight of the arrow through the air is a threatening sound. The arrow can symbolize a shot as heard



The Word of God both saves and destroys. "Who whet their tongue like a sword [God's Word] and bent their bows to shoot their arrows, even bitter words;" Psalm 64:3.

Jehovah is mighty in battle. The children of a God-fearing family become "mighty adults" – as they speak God's Words as arrows – of which can save or spiritually destroy the enemies in the gate, people of the world, or city. The happy man, mother, and father of their children – "will not be ashamed" – because their children will not fail in their hope or expectation. They place their confidence in God Almighty.

"But the mercy of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children; to such as keep his covenant, and to those that remember his commandments and do them." Psalm 103:17&18. "Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will teach you the fear of the LORD; Psalm 34:11. In the fear of the LORD is strong confidence [trust]: and his children shall have a place of refuge [shelter of falsehood]" Proverbs 14:26.

"The Just man walketh in his integrity: his children are blessed after him;" Proverbs 20:7

1st Thessalonians 2:1-2
Paul's Example of Godly Vindication

1 Thessalonians 2:1-2 "For you yourselves know, brethren, that our coming to you was not in vain. (2) But even after we had suffered before and were spitefully treated at Philippi, as you know, we were bold in our God to speak to you the gospel of God in much conflict." (NKJV)



In Chapter one Paul explains why he and those with him were so thankful. I recommend you take time to read the book of 1st Thessalonians, it is an encouragement. But here, in chapter 2 Paul begins to discuss one of the main purposes of writing this epistle. It can be described as a Godly vindication of Christian character and ministry. It begins with an understanding of the very first word, Gar translated "for" in the English Bible actually creates a literary bridge between the chapters. Chapter 2:1-16 is an expansion of chapter 1:5-10, and chapter 2:1-12 looks into Paul's arrival in Thessalonica and his conduct there. While 2:13-16 describes the Thessalonian's response.

But, chapter two doesn't just repeat chapter one, while chapter one shows the Thessalonians' knowledge and the response to their election, and chapter two builds upon the same theme to set down Paul's defense against insinuations about him having ulterior motives in ministry and Christian service.

We don't have specific names of Paul's accusers. I'm certain if names were important, the Lord would have provided them. It's enough that we know Paul faced not only physical but verbal and social persecution. The thesis we find here is a proper defense when we find ourselves wrongly attacked. Whether our attackers come from religious or secular foundations. Paul corrected heretics, Judaizers, spiritualists, Gnostics, and Jews, he confronted government officials, religious leaders, and the worldly, all sought his life because of the gospel he preached.

The strength and encouragement we find in the first two verses of 1st Thessalonians two comes from God and ultimately leads back to His glory. Paul first tells the Thessalonians they (he and his companions) are not there in vain, in other words, there is no immoral or evil intent in their coming. Many were opposing Paul and his companions and they were spread among many cities, each one trying to destroy reputation and character before the Apostle and his preachers arrive. Then Paul reminds them of his previous treatment and suffering at Phillipi. He didn't want sympathy. Paul wanted the Thessalonians to know, despite the attempted discouragement, physical assault, wrongful accusations, and character assignation he was not hindered in preaching the gospel. Paul uses the word parrēsiázomai, translated bold in the English Bible, to describe his approach in proclaiming the gospel even during conflict.

I titled the article "Paul's example of godly vindication" because every truly born-again Christian will face persecution, to some degree or another, from inside the church and outside the church. When we do, how we approach it will determine how we are remembered. Paul could have fought fire with fire and had a following of people to help him, but God's plan for Paul would have been injured. Instead, Paul vindicated himself and his companions with the gospel. He boldly led a godly life and preached the gospel. We cannot lead a godly life and not preach a godly gospel. Neighbors, when you need vindication against wrong let the gospel be your guide and follow it boldly.

Until we meet again, either in print or in person, may God richly bless you is my prayer.

"Lord, Why Am I Having to Wait?"

I was listening to a Christian radio station one day and happened to hear one of those call-in promos such stations do. This promo featured a woman who had called the station to voice her appreciation for the station's influence on her life. I listened as she explained how she had interviewed for



a certain job and had been forced to wait a week before finally hearing that she had gotten the job. Upon hearing that news, she had called the radio station to say a quick word about how we all need to learn to be patient and trust God. So, there I am, driving down the interstate, listening to this woman's testimony, and I'm thinking, "Wow, you had to wait a whole week, huh? I've been waiting YEARS on the fulfillment of a couple of promises that I feel that God has made to me!"

Please understand that I don't mean to devalue that woman's experience. I'm sure that to her that week seemed like an eternity. But to those of us (and you know who you are) who have been waiting a long, long, long time for God to do a certain thing, one week seems like child's play, right? Can I get an "Amen"?

The Bible stories are numerous. Abraham and Sarah waited twenty-five years to hold baby Isaac (Genesis 12:4, 21:5). Isaac and Rebekah waited twenty years to hold their twin babies, Jacob and Esau (Genesis 25:20-21,26). Joseph waited thirteen years to become a ruler in Egypt (Genesis 37:2, 41:46). Moses waited forty years in Midian before returning to Egypt to lead the Israelites (Acts 7:30). The woman with the issue of blood waited twelve years before Jesus healed her (Luke 8:43-47). The woman who was stooped over and couldn't raise herself waited eighteen years before Jesus healed her (Luke 13:10-13).

Keep in mind now that none of those people, as far as we know, added even one day to their waiting by way of their disobedience or lack of faith. Instead, the appointed times of their waiting were all preordained by God, and all the praying in the world wouldn't speed Him up any. His process simply had to run its course.

I often think of the Israelites and their 400 years of bondage in Egypt. They didn't do anything except mind God to get themselves into that fix, and they couldn't do anything to shorten their days of waiting on His deliverance. Whether they realized it or not, they were living under the time clock of a prophecy that God had spoken centuries earlier to Abraham, the father of their race. God had told him, "Know certainly that your descendants will be strangers in a land that is not theirs and will serve them, and they will afflict them for four hundred years" (Genesis 15:13). Really, the length of Israel's waiting in Egypt had as much to do with God delaying judgment upon the inhabitants of Canaan as it had to do with Israel (Genesis 15:16).

And so how should you apply all of this to your life as you continue to wait on God to do that certain something? Allow me to suggest two ways. First, you should consider the possibility that your waiting has more to do with others than it does you. You see, God making you wait doesn't necessarily mean that it's all your fault. It might just be that God is sorting some things out in the lives of others in your orbit.

Second, if you know that God has promised you something, hang in there with Him and keep expecting the fulfillment of that promise until you receive it. You should take encouragement from the fact that the Israelites in Egypt got no warning whatsoever that Moses was going to hit the town with their deliverance as his destiny. Nevertheless, one day there he stood with Aaron (Exodus 4:27-31). What had changed? Had the Israelites finally uttered just the right words in prayer? Nope. Had they finally managed to do everything God wanted them to do? Nope. Had they finally perfected their faith? Certainly not (as Moses would come to learn all too well). What had changed was that God's time clock had finally struck midnight and it was time to begin a new day in the nation's history.

Here's hoping that your clock is about to strike midnight like that. Who knows? Today really could be the day. So, don't give up on God, and keep trusting in His perfect timing. Yes, He does indeed miss numerous opportunities to be early, but it's also true that He never runs late.


Now we might suggest that now that we have this information, it will be the death of soda! How likely do you think that is? I do not doubt the findings of

To Know Christ is to Know the Truth

"I've always thought that the most powerful weapon in the world was the bomb, and that's why I gave it to my people, but I've come to the conclusion that the most powerful weapon in the world is not the bomb, but it's the truth." – Andrei Sakharov

Every day, we are confronted with a multitude of information that puts us at odds with our ability to focus on the word of God, the truth. This dilemma comes in one of two variations. First and probably the most obvious are those distractions which are from a variety of sources; devices, media, radio, podcasts, etc. The other, and sometimes not as obvious, are the things of this world; the very objects we use to serve Him become so tremendously immense in nature that they overpower our Spirit-led intentions. We become consumed by the weight of their responsibilities. Under a load of this forbearance, we find ourselves struggling to keep God in our minds, let alone to hinder that departure from our hearts where we have placed Him, our last bastion of safety within, sheltered

To maintain our sanity, we must filter the cloud of noise, purging the false, or more popularly referred to as "fake news," from the truth. In my grandfather's milk barn, there was the room where he kept the Separator, as it was known. In my mind, I can still picture the stainless-steel piece of equipment that stood about chest high. Grandpa Tron would pour in the whole milk, which was straight from the cow, and it would spin the cream away from the milk, where it could then be collected and used to make the other by-products of the dairy; cheese, butter, etc. It was apparent when the Separator was done. Unfortunately, cleansing the input into our mental pallet is not as easy.

In a documentary in the early 1990's Bill Moyer, an ordained minister in 1954 and a reporter for CBS and NBC News, presented a vision of the future as part of a special documentary, "A World of Ideas," whereby he predicted we would soon be living in the "Age of Information." However prophetic his words were at that time, albeit too soon for what was really to come in 1990; we now live in that time. From the traditional nightly news to the other end of the spectrum where anyone with a keyboard and access to social media can output information, be it true or false, we face a world of a constant barrage of data. Yet, more and more, unlike in what now seems ancient times, there are little to no references given, no facts to back up said purported info. Instead, there are sound bytes thrown like frisbees, tossed into the mix sometimes simply to cause a sensation; they aim to go viral, another operative of many that dwell in this spectrum.

What say you then of what Christ would say to those Jews who were on the fence of becoming believers, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." -John 8:32

To know the truth is to be the truth. "If it were only that simple," you might respond.

Winston Churchill, "Truth is the most valuable thing in the world, often it is protected by a bodyguard of lies."

Today, we struggle to resolve fact from fiction, not only in the blatant manner in which we often think but also in what is relevant to our purpose in Christ.

Churches and denominations across the globe face an attack from a force not of this world, trying to sway their leaders and congregations into softening their stand for the truth. Giving in to the world was not an option in the Apostle Paul's time. As he spoke to the church in Corinth, he was brutally honest when he told them, "For I think that God hath set forth us the apostles last, as it were appointed to death: for we are made a spectacle unto the world, and to angels, and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but ye are wise in Christ; we are weak, but ye are strong; ye are honorable, but we are despised. Even unto this present hour we both hunger, and thirst, and are naked, and are buffeted, and have no certain dwelling place; And labor, working with our own hands: being reviled, we bless; being persecuted, we suffer it: Being defamed, we entreat: we are made as the filth of the world, and are the offscouring of all things unto this day."

Paul was making an ironic statement about the apostle's sake. These words are something that could be taken totally out of context in today's world and often are literally used against unknowing Christians, being misquoted to advance other ideologies. Thus, the lies once more surrounding the truth. Paul and the apostles



were anything but fools in Christ although, they were despised and hated by the Jews of their time. They were constantly under attack of defamation of character and literal persecution. Yet, as they would leave a town, either after a miraculous healing or neardeath torture, they would, as my newfound friend Jimmy



Clark would say, "Rejoice in their labors of the Holy Spirit."

Jimmy had been part of a mission team to South Africa a few years back. There, they were scheduled to visit a prison where the mission team was to speak to some of the prisoners as part of their mission work. On their walk to the prison facility, Jimmy said he was overcome with a message that God had given to him, so much so that he asked the others if he might be able to share his vision when they arrived, to which they agreed. He described walking back to the hotel from the prison after his sermon as it being one of the greatest feelings in his life; his rejoicing in the Spirit had begun.

Our path isn't always lit with the best of lighting.

As we strive to walk down the pathway which we feel God hath set before us, we must feel like the psalmist when he wrote the words to the 23rd Psalm, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." No matter where you are in the world, no matter where you are in your walk of faith, if you have begun, you still encounter the world in which you live. Through this perspective, we must give insight as to the physical and emotional challenges that being of the flesh entails

Although your journey may be apparent, there will be at times where you will face avalanches of problems and trials. Nothing ever comes easy when you finally find yourself walking in faith. As one of my good friends and missionary Jeffrey Canada said to me once, "You know you are going in the right direction, with regard to faith, when you feel that significant headwind in your face." Just as Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, we are buffeted, and nothing is for sure. Sometimes it feels as if you can barely hang on when another wave crashes over the bow of your ship, swamping you once more. Slowly, your grab onto the railing and pull yourself up. Taking a deep breath, you stand to your feet and take another step forward.

Do we give up?

Do we quit?

No, for we must not be vanquished. "For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us. We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed; Always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body."-2 Corinthians 4:6-10

He, Jesus Christ, is the way, the truth, the light.

Yet, in all the struggles and tests of our faith, we must not forget that once we come to know Him and truly serve, we can put our trust in Him. In this hope, for it is not simply a mystery, we have a guarantee of life eternal, that of which we cannot begin to comprehend in our earthly realm of consciousness. "But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him."-1 Corinthians 2:9

To know Christ is to know Truth.

Confess your sins to Him, seek Him, knock, and the door shall be opened. "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."-Romans 10.9

Finally, when we are left with little hope, when we have been knocked to our knees for what seems the last time, remember the words of Christ, shortly before leaving this earthly realm, when he spoke these words to his disciples, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth."

Know that through all we face, all the trials, persecutions, and adversarial relations, there is one thing we can count on; the Word of God, for it, is the ultimatum of truths, and for this, we shall ever be thankful.

"Something To Think About" -You Never Know Who's Hiding

I would say that the vast majority of us have read or heard what God says in 1 Samuel 15:22. However, not many of us take the time to really heed and follow through with what God is saying. Listen closely to what the Bible says in 1



Samuel 15:22; "So Samuel said; Has the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as He has in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed the voice of God than the fat of rams."

I read a very interesting story about a man named Stephen Grellet. Stephen was a pioneer evangelist to the lumbermen in the Rocky Mountains. He felt the Spirit of God leading him to a particular lumber camp to preach. He obeyed the voice of the Lord and went. However, when he got there, the place was absolutely deserted. (Now right here is where most of us would have turned around and gone back home) But Stephen said; "Lord, I don't understand, but I'm going to be obedient to your voice." So, he opened up his Bible and preached a full-length sermon to absolutely nobody in that camp, or at least that is what he thought. Then after he preached, he pled for people to come to Christ for salvation. Imagine pleading for people to come to Christ for salvation when nobody is there! Years later, a man walked up to him in England and said, "I was the foreman at the lumber camp. I had come back to the camp to get an ax, and I heard you preaching. I stood behind a pile of lumber and listened. As you preached, my heart was warmed, and I accepted Jesus as my Savior. I later witnessed to four other men. Now, all five of us are missionaries preaching around the world."

Obedience is better than sacrifice just as the Bible says in 1 Samuel 15:22. Do you know why we are not obeying God more than we are? It's simply because we are not hearing what God is saying. We are simply not spending enough time listening to God. We pray and we ask, but seldom do we take the time to listen to what the Spirit of God wants to say to us. That's why it is so important for us to have a quiet time with the Lord. It's so important for us to get alone with God in a nook with His great book as we read it and listen to Him.

I remember driving up the road one day while on my way to a meeting when the Spirit of God spoke to my heart and impressed upon me to go and see a man who had never accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior. I listened to the voice of the Spirit that day and made that visit. We talked about various things and we even talked about the church, but I didn't pressure him to make a decision for Jesus that day. All I did was encourage him to come to church with his wife, and with his daughter. He started coming and one Sunday morning during the time of invitation, he stepped out from the pew he was in, and with tears in his eyes, and deep conviction in his heart, he invited Jesus to be his Lord and Savior. We had a lot of shouting and praising the Lord going on that day in the house of God!

So, even if it doesn't make any sense at that precise moment. Even if it is in the middle of the night and the Spirit of God says to go and see someone. Obey the Spirit of God and God will do some great and awesome things in your life and the life of others. Just ask Stephen Grellet. You never know whose hiding and that's something for all of us to really think about!


Focusing on him makes the simplest of tasks sacred. Moments to be seized, to ponder and treasure. Selah

We all know that you get out of something what you put into something. You put a little



effort little gain, you put a lot of effort you get a greater gain. Pain is not anything that people want or like to experience. The reason being you have no true control over pain. Whether it is Physical, Mental, or Spiritual pain it is out of our hands. Yes, I know that you can take medicine for physical and even mental pains but for spiritual pain, you must work through or plow through it. So in reality they are all out of our hands.

We all want a pain-free life. Even in Paul's life, we know that he had a thorn in the flesh and he asked 3 times for it to be removed and we know that it wasn't. The Lord told Paul: 2 Corinthians 12:9 "And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me." I want you to know that I'm allergic to pain because it hurts. If I were to announce to my church congregation that for the next several weeks we will all be coming together to practice and experience pain and suffering I doubt seriously that I would have very many people to show up, if any. C.S. Lewis wrote: "God Whispers to us in our Pleasures, Speaks in our Conscience, but Shouts in our Pains: it is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world." And it's sad to say many Christians have become hard of hearing.

May I ask you what motivates you to make changes in your life? Think back to a time when you made a change in your life and ask the question, "What motivated me to make that change?" The greatest motivator that I've seen in my life and for other people to take action and to bring change into their lives is Pain. Now if I have hunger pains, I'm motivated to find something to eat. If I am experiencing the pain of no money, I soon get motivated to get a job. If I experience enough physical pain, I am motivated to see a doctor. Pain is unpleasant, but it is a strong motivator and can be a call to take action in our lives.

In my life, I have experienced pain due to sins that I have committed. And when we sin we experience discipline. Discipline is painful. However, later on, that pain produces something good for those that have experienced it, like righteousness and peace. The Bible says in 1 Peter 4:12-13 "Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful trial you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ." So pain and suffering are normal! But you know what? I want to avoid pain at all costs. How about You? But you know what the Bible Says in James 1:2-4 "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; (Pain) 3 Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. 4 But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing." In other words, if I want to be mature as a Christian Disciple, which should be all Christians goals, then I need to not run away from my pains and problems, but I need to use them to develop my faith. Borrow your own money?

Dear Dave

I have a question about self-banking with whole term life insurance. The way I understand it, you can accrue a cash balance, borrow against it, and then pay interest to yourself. Is this worth it, or should I stay away from it and continue using a bank? Kunal



Dear Kunal,

Actually, it's a whole life policy, not a term policy. And it's an absolute scam. Basically, with your whole life, you pay about 20 times more for the same amount of insurance that you would with a term policy. The extra money goes into a savings account, and you earn next to nothing on it, even after you finally start to build it up. One of the ways they're pitching it now is the self-banking concept, where you can use your own money. It's nothing magical or anything because with a regular checking account you use your own money.

My advice is to stay away from the company that's offering it and anything else they have. It's a really bad product, and it's a scummy way to sell whole life insurance—which is an awful product, to begin with. No one, except for folks in that business, believes in it or talks positively about it anymore.

Being able to borrow your own money? Really? Why on earth would anyone want to borrow their own money? It's ridiculous! - Dave

Should I tithe on my business?

Dear Dave

My wife and I are Christians, and we own a successful small business in our town. Should businesses tithe? Barker

Dear Barker.

This is a good question. Giving is never a bad idea unless you do it irresponsibly and to the point of putting your family in financial danger. To the best of my knowledge, the Bible only addresses the topic of tithing by individuals—not businesses

Personally, I don't give a tenth of my business gross or net until I receive my paycheck. When that happens—meaning it's profit that I'm going to pay taxes on, or it's salaried income out of my business—I tithe on the profits.

So, I can't tell you I've found Biblical instruction to give a tenth of your business. Hope this helps!



Founding Fathers and Influencing Citizens. How They Served Our Country—Nancy Morgan Hart

Around 1735, Nancy Morgan Hart was born in either Pennsylvania or North Carolina. Nancy grew to become physically agile with a commanding personality and an American patriot. Even though Nancy was illiterate, she was a survivalist living off the land, as a sharpshooter, and a farmer. She

and Benjamin Hart married had six children and raised their family in Georgia.

Being a lady of legend, some tales are more credible than are others. As a spy, Nancy dressed as a man and went into a British camp. Acting bizarre to keep others at bay, she was able to gather information and pass it to the patriots. Tories often harassed the Harts. On a particular home visit, the Tories killed Nancy's only turkey, and then demanded she cook it for them. Patronizing them, Nancy cooked the bird and served them liquor while secretly sending her daughter to summon help. Nancy was caught hiding their guns—she was able to kill one and the others surrendered. When Benjamin and their neighbors responded, they suggested the Tories be shot. Nancy objected, and reportedly said, "Shooting was too good for them". Nancy demanded they be hung. In 1912, archaeological evidence supported this event. Hart was described as, "a honey of a patriot, but the devil of a wife".

Since the American Revolution, Georgia memorialized her heroism by naming a militia, county, school, highway, and other entities after her. As was true of other frontierswomen, she was a fierce patriot safeguarding her country and preserving memories of the War of Independence that continues to echo today.

As a widow, Nancy retired to Kentucky to be near her son and lived to be around ninety-three. During her funeral, there was "a total eclipse of the sun". Eyes on the Prize

Wes Strickland and I recently exchanged greetings while I bought electrical supplies where he works. He said he was well, and then he added, "I keep my eyes on the prize." I laughed and responded, "That's good. Not many of



us recognize the prize." I left the store wondering if I am among those few. I reject the popular notion that "truth" is subjective, but no rational person could argue that we are not each responsible for defining "the prize." While attempting to articulate my definition, I recalled a Bible lesson from my col-

lege days. The core of Professor Boatman's lesson was, "To obey is better than sacrifice."

1 Samuel 15 tells of a special task given by God to King Saul. The instructions were specific. Saul decided that it was okay for him to obey some of his assignments. The result of his partial obedience was catastrophic. God tore the kingship away from Saul, transferred leadership to a ruddy-faced shepherd boy named David, and condemned Saul and most of his sons to die in battle.

The task God gave to Saul is repugnant to modern sensibilities. Israel's first king was told to destroy the nation of Amalek. Every person and animal was to be slain. All of Amalek's cities and their possessions were to be destroyed by fire. He was specifically told to kill King Agag.

Saul's actions are summarized in verse 9, "But Saul and the people spared Agag as well as the best of the sheep, the cattle, even the fatlings and the lambs, and all that was good, since they were not willing to utterly destroy them..." When Samuel confronted Saul about this disobedience, his primary excuse was that the people wanted to sacrifice the good animals to God. That's when Samuel delivered the powerful lesson found in verse 22.

Tom Bradford writes extensively on this chapter. He explains the Hebrew word Herem: the ban, or holy war. Saul's assignment to destroy Amalek was not a geopolitical war, or border dispute, or excursion to capture spoil or slaves, or a preemptive strike against a potential aggressor. It was an act of divine judgment against a nation that God deemed deserving of annihilation.

Modern Christians often conclude that unity or tolerance is more important than clear, Biblical instruction. King Saul decided that God was being "way harsh." Replacement theologians often teach that holy war is one of many aspects of Unchanging God that was "nailed to the cross." The only way to reach such an un-Biblical perspective is to ignore the Book of Revelation.

Scripture teaches that the Jezreel Valley will one day be filled with the blood of God's enemies to the depth of a horse's bridle. Some claim that this image from Revelation 14:20 is figurative language, but I am unable to conceive of any plausible, figurative interpretation. God will destroy those described in Revelation 9:20-21. "The rest of mankind, those not killed by these plagues, did not repent and turn away from the works of their hands—they would not stop worshiping demons and the idols of gold and silver and stone and wood, which cannot see or hear or walk. And they did not repent and turn away from their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their stealing.'

God is loving, but He is not tolerant. He desires that none should perish. He wants all to come to Him in repentance seeking forgiveness. Salvation is a free gift by grace through faith in Jesus, but God expects those who are blessed with that gift to respond by living life on His terms. Those terms are expressed in many places. John 14:15 says. "If you love me, keep my commandments."

Bradford says, "King Saul would have made a good Christian. He just could not bring himself to fully obey God's Word." Many Christians believe the lie that a different Saul, aka Paul of Tarsus, revoked God's instructions for living. Both the Father and the Son claim that Torah will be in full effect until the end of the age. The modern Church tends to disregard every portion of God's Word that seems inconvenient or irrational.

The Bible is either entirely true, or it is all deception. God is either the same yesterday, today, and forever, or He changes at whim. His instructions for living are either binding for all generations, or they have a secret expiration date. God either saves us from sin so that we may live in righteousness, or He is happy for us to continue sinning. The Law and The Prophets will either be in full force for as long as heaven and earth remain, or Jesus is a liar. King Saul's story is proof that, though we cannot earn salvation through obedience, we can lose it through disobedience. How else do we explain the deaths of Ananias and Sapphira?

Samuel told Saul that obedience is better than sacrifice, but he did not say that sacrifice is abolished. We are required to sacrifice. Jesus' death makes animal sacrifice a moot issue, but Romans 12:1 states that "we are called to present our bodies as a living sacrifice." When writers of the so-called New Testament say that salvation is a free gift through faith, they do not mean that obedience is now optional. Grace does not nullify righteousness.

Only those who know what is most valuable can focus on the prize. I was pleased to discover that it was easy to articulate my definition—a life well-lived that leads to eternity well spent. Scripture makes it clear that such a reward is only available to those who love God by serving Him in faithful obedience.

It's no secret that Gov. Roy Cooper fundamentally disagrees with the Republican-led General Assembly on many issues. In fact, The Carolina Journal recently reported that Gov. Cooper has vetoed more legislation passed by the General Assembly than all the other North Carolina governors before him combined. He's vetoed bills designed to reopen our schools, to get folks back into the workforce, and even to fund major priorities in our state. Cooper's total number of vetoes? 57.

In fact, near the end of June, the Governor vetoed a Senate-led bill, which I cosponsored, allowing folks with a valid permit to carry a concealed handgun at churches that have an affiliated school on their campus. The bill only applied to properties that are both a school and a religious gathering place, including religious schools, and it would not have applied to any properties owned by a local board of education or county commission. The Salisbury Post recently reported that "at least 19 fatal shootings have occurred at churches since [...] 1999." Senator Carl Ford, one of the main sponsors of the bill, said it best about the Governor's veto: "I guess the Governor thinks that the Second Amendment applies to everyone except people worshiping God." I agree. Gov. Cooper shouldn't be allowed to tell us where our rights can and cannot be exercised.

But perhaps the most appalling veto the Governor has issued came last month when he vetoed the Human Life Non-Discrimination Act (HB453) – a bill aimed at prohibiting abortions based on race and even the prenatal diagnosis of Down syndrome.

I find that unconscionable. No one deserves to be discriminated against because of his or her race or disability. In fact, we have several federal laws that prohibit this, including the 1964 Civil Rights Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act. Six states already prohibit abortions motivated by the race of the child and nine states prohibit abortions motivated by a child's disability. I believe North Carolina should be next on both lists.

My colleague, Senator Amy Galey, said that "with a stroke of his pen, Gov. Cooper just told North Carolinians that it's OK to discriminate based on race or disability as long as it's in the womb. This bill simply put an end to eugenics. It shouldn't be controversial to protect an unborn child with Down syndrome." And the North Carolina Values Commission stated that "children shouldn't have to pass a genetic test to earn the right to be born." They're both right. Gov. Cooper's veto suggests protecting children based on the color of their skin or a perceived disability isn't a priority and that only certain genetic traits make a human life valuable. A terrible precedent to set.

I don't expect the Governor's veto pen to run out of ink anytime soon, but you can be sure I will continue fighting for the values and freedoms of all North Carolinians.

In late June a bipartisan supermajority passed the North Carolina Senate's proposed budget with a 32-18 vote and sent it to the House of Representatives for consideration. The Senate's 2021-23 budget sets in motion a 10-year, \$12 billion cash infrastructure and capital plan, including \$3 billion in cash over the next two years for projects. For the past decade, North Carolina Republicans have enacted smart, restrained budgets. Because of that, we've seen strong budget surpluses. The Senate's 2021-23 budget proposes sweeping tax cuts and major infrastructure improvements, including funds for much-needed projects in District 46.

The Senate's budget includes a sweeping tax cut that reduces the personal income tax rate to 3.99% over five years and increases the zero-tax bracket to \$25,500 for married filers. In addition to supporting this historic tax cut and infrastructure plan, the Senate budget allocates \$74 million to help meet critical needs in District 46, such as:

- \$5 million for repairs of county courthouses;
- \$12 million to repair and renovate buildings on the NCSSM-Morganton campus;
- \$800,000 for Avery County DSS;
- \$600,000 for the renovation and relocation of Avery County's DSS;
- \$5 million for an occupational training facility in Caldwell County; and,
- \$15 million for a regional emergency services training center on the campus of WPCC.
- Fully funds the NC School of Science and Math Morganton campus so it can open in 2022.

Here are a few of the highlights of the overall Senate budget:

The total proposed budget allocation is \$25.7 billion in 2021-22 and \$26.6 billion in 2022-23. It replenishes the state's reserves, including the Rainy Day Fund.

For transportation, it allocates \$2.8 billion over the biennium for Strategic Transportation Investments, increases the General Maintenance Reserve by \$250 million over the biennium to respond to storms and conduct routine maintenance, for a total of \$1.4 billion over the biennium. It also invests more than \$1.2 billion over the biennium for road resurfacing projects, provides more than \$560 million for the Bridge Program, and over \$140 million for bridge preservation.

Tax Cuts: The budget tax package increases the zero-tax bracket to \$25,500, cuts the personal income tax rate from 5.25% to 3.99% by 2026, starting with 4.99% in 2022, and increases the child tax deduction by \$500 per child. A family of four earning the median household income would see a 37% income tax cut.


Salaries and Benefits: The Senate budget provides 3% raises over the biennium for most state employees, including teachers and UNC/community college employees. It creates a new experience-based salary schedule for correctional officers, which results in an average 7% raise that is designed to reduce or eliminate the current 20% vacancy rate in our prisons. There are also bonuses for all state employees using federal funds: \$1,500 for state employees who make less than \$75,000, and \$1,000 for state employees who make more than \$75,000. Law enforcement, correctional officers and staff, and 24-hour residential or treatment facility employees receive \$1,500.

In K-12 Education, the Senate budget spends \$10.4 billion in 2021-22 and \$10.5 billion in 2022-23, which represents an additional half-billion dollars in state dollars to public school education. Some of the highlights are \$40.9 million each year for school psychologists, which includes an additional \$9.8 million to ensure that every school district has at least one psychologist.

Following the economic turmoil and job loss created by the COVID-19 pandemic, putting North Carolinians back to work is Job #1 for the North Carolina legislature. Unfortunately, Governor Cooper vetoed the bipartisan bill, the "Put North Carolina Back to Work Act." As the economy comes back to life in North Carolina, small business owners and employers of all sizes are finding it hard to recruit workers who are still receiving weeks of COVID-enhanced unemployment payments. North Carolina Senator Chuck Edwards of Henderson County, who is also a MacDonald's franchise owner, has correctly said, "With the pandemic largely behind us, thousands of jobs are waiting to be filled, but this veto ensures that "Help Wanted" signs will remain up for months to come and more jobs will be sent to other countries where our manufacturers can find the workforce they need."

I am confident that most of you have seen the signs on what seems to be almost every small business, restaurant, both sit-down and fast-food, "Now Hiring" or "Help Wanted". Making it even tougher for employers to recruit workers, the Cooper veto also means that \$250 million in child-care assistance for eligible parents who want to return to work will not be available.

With the passage of the "Put North Carolina Back to Work Act," North Carolina would have joined 25 other states in ending the \$300 in extra weekly federal unemployment benefits. The bill also would have tightened job search requirements for those seeking to collect unemployment. Thus, to continue to receive unemployment pay, a recipient would have to accept a job if it paid at least 120% of weekly unemployment benefits. The Back to Work Act also would have required those seeking unemployment pay to respond to a job interview offer within 48 hours and to show up for job interviews. These all seem reasonable steps to encourage the return to work now that so many jobs are, in fact, going unfilled.

Scripture Calls Us to Share





The Lesson of Contentment

Culture is driven by the prominence and prestige of possessions. The more that one has, the more he is regarded as being successful. Advertising is built upon this basic appeal and attempts to create a desire or perceived need for a particular product. This desire to appear successful has created an increasing attitude of discontentment.



Hebrews 13:5-6 teaches us this source of contentment by stating, "Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. 6 So that we may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me." The writer of Hebrews admonishes us that we are to avoid a lifestyle (conversation) that constantly desires more. Such a lifestyle is not characterized by contentment; rather, it is characterized by discontentment. Rather than desiring more, we are to be content with what we currently have, regardless of how favorably or unfavorably you perceive it to be.

Naturally, you might question how such a mindset is possible when you consider what you have. To begin, I would encourage you that you are more blessed than you realize. But the attitude of contentment comes by recognizing what we have in Jesus Christ and the resulting implications. Only those who have placed their trust in Jesus Christ can claim the promise by God, "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee." What more do we need than God's presence in our lives? Until we learn that, we will never be content. The discontent person actually does not regard God's divine presence as enough. Such a mindset creates boldness in verse 6, not fearing what man can do, for the Lord is my helper.

Most believers would quickly acknowledge that God has been very good. The next time you are tempted to complain, consider what you are saying: "God, you have been good, just not good enough for me." Learn the lesson of contentment.

The Orchard at Altapass

Orchard At Altapass Looking For Volunteers

The Orchard at Altapass is looking for "a few good men" and women, teenagers, seniors—volunteers to resurrect the O's butterfly garden. A few years after the purchase of the Orchard at Altapass, co-founder Judy Carson and naturalist Elizabeth Hunter planted a butterfly garden in memory of their friend Jan McKinney Conley, who had recently died. Over the past two-plus




decades, this plot of showy flowers has seen good and bad times. When Judy died earlier this year, the garden was completely overgrown. Japanese chestnut trees shaded most of what remained of the garden, and weeds choked out the rest. In her memory, a generous outpouring of support flowed from friends and those who wanted the see the garden bloom again. And next year it will.

Marianne Cicala, landscape designer and recent transplant from her own biodynamic organic farm in Virginia, is working with the Orchard to create a sanctuary of utilitarian beauty in and around the existing butterfly garden. It will be almost twice the size and feature benches on which to sit and contemplate or watch as children frolic up and down the paths throughout, informational signage and plant identifiers, and a memorial for Judy. Each climate-friendly plant was carefully chosen for its benefit to the ecosystem, the butterflies, honeybees, and for its beauty.

"We are breathing new life into Judy's vision—through the Orchard's family of supporters to the donation of plants and trees to companies who have offered to help clear the land and remove the heavy overgrowth. What remains are volunteers, ready and willing to give of their time and energy to make it all happen," said executive director Beth Hilton. Reconstruction is scheduled to begin in August—once a week—with weeding out the old, invasive plants and preparing the soil for new and transplanted flowers. (Of the existing varieties, 10 will remain or be replanted in different garden locations.) Overgrown trees will be limbed, chipped, and the ground cleared for expansion. September will bring path definition, fencing, and delivery of new plants that will go in the ground during the cool

days of October. (Twenty-one new varieties of plants and trees will be added.) November has colder weather, installation of Judy's memorial, and completion of the butterfly garden that will blossom in spring. Volunteers must be




willing to get dirty, to make the garden happen. They'll weed and mulch, dig up and transplant existing, dig in and plant new. They'll stand for just a moment or two, shake off their gloves and shake hands with their fellow volunteers. And they'll leave each afternoon with a satisfactory smile, knowing that they are helping the Orchard and its mission to "save the good stuff."

"This rebirth of the garden is such an important addition to the Orchard, not only by providing enjoyment for visitors but by adding a significant layer of plant diversity that will expand the pollinator's benefit in the Orchard," added Cicala. James 1:12 (NIV) says, "Blessed is the one who perserveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him."

I've learned through my own journey in life that you can't have a testimony of God's goodness and fulfill your God-given potential without first having a test. Being abused by my father for so many years was very painful and difficult, but God has redeemed my pain and now He's using it for His greater good. And I want to encourage you that if you let Him, He will do the same for you. Emmanuel, God with Us

In our tough times, it's easy to feel like we've been abandoned. But it's important to remember that one of the many names of God, Emmanuel, literally means "God with us."

When going through a test, I often turn to Psalm 139:7-8 (NIV) for comfort. It says, "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there."

God is always with us...everywhere we are, at all times. And He will never leave us, nor forsake us (see Deuteronomy 31:6). God doesn't promise to instantly deliver us from everything when we want to be delivered from it, but He does promise to be with us in it.

If you're hurting right now—if you've lost a loved one, if you've lost your job, if you're struggling financially, if you're heartbroken over a breakup, if you're sick and experiencing physical pain—no matter what you're going through, God understands. God knows right where you are, and He feels everything that you feel.

The God of Redemption

When we're going through a test, it's easy to forget we have a Savior who took on human form. He suffered the same trials and temptations that we face and He understands what you're going through today.

While He doesn't promise to take away all of your problems, if you invite Him into your life, He will redeem them and do something good through them. In fact, God takes what the world would throw away and turns it into something beautiful. He promises to give us His "beauty instead of ashes...joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair" (Isaiah 61:3 NIV)

Matthew 19:26 says that God is able to redeem any difficult situation, including yours.

The Purpose in Your Times of Testing

Tests are good because they bring out our weaknesses and show us where we need to improve. And we can only be prepared to move on to better things after we've passed them.

When God spoke to me more than 40 years ago and said, "You're going to go all over the world and teach My Word," I thought for sure I'd be on my way the next day. But there were many years when God had to work in my life, preparing me for that ministry through a variety of tests before it could come to pass.

If you're going through a test, ask God to help you persevere, do what's right, and continue to trust that it's leading you to something better for your life. You can be sure God will use you, whatever your situation may be. *Tests Increase Your Faith*

James 1:2-3 (NIV) says, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perserverance."

God is faithful and the more experience you have with Him, little by little, the more you learn to trust Him. So each time you pass a test, your faith gets a little bit stronger.

I remember when God spoke to my heart and said, "Joyce, I always want you to remember this: However many people I let you help, that's how many people you can hurt." At that moment, I realized I had no business being in a position of leadership until I passed my tests, grew in my relationship with Jesus, and developed the character to love others the way God loves me.

I want to encourage you today to allow the tests in your life to do the same thing for you. You may be hurting right now, but God is working for your good and He is with you every step of the way.

GriefShare

The COVID19 pandemic has brought innumerable changes to our lives in so many areas, and the Western Carolina Church GriefShare ministry was not exempt from these changes. The last time GriefShare met in person was in November 2019. Plans were being made for



the Spring cycle of 2020 when all public gatherings were shut down, but just as quickly, GriefShare began working on offering virtual meetings. Despite mounting losses of life due to COVID and other causes, throughout 2020 no meetings were held, either in-person or virtually. I just could not imagine how effective a virtual GriefShare meeting would be. Because of multiple requests, despite my reluctance, I made plans to have a 2021 Spring cycle. I was not prepared for how God answered prayer and used that cycle to begin the healing process for the four women who participated. One of the benefits of virtual meetings is they allowed people outside our local community to join the meetings. One participant was from Virginia!

WCC GriefShare Fall 2021 cycle will begin on Thursday, August 19, 2021, at 6:00 pm and continue each Thursday. In-person meetings will be held at Western Carolina Church, with a virtual option through Zoom available for each session. Interested persons can register online at www.griefshare.org, or call Western Carolina Church@828-765-4633. The cost for the workbook is \$15, and scholarships are available if there is a need.

For those who are unfamiliar with the GriefShare Ministry, it is an international organization under the umbrella ministry of Church Initiative, based right here in Raleigh, NC. In 2007 after I lost my husband, Jimm, in a car accident, I participated in GriefShare in Boone. I knew this was something that was greatly needed in Mitchell County, and in 2008 our first meeting was held. Since then, GriefShare has become established in Mitchell County as a ministry of Western Carolina Church. All GriefShare ministries are required by Church Initiative to be associated with a church.

GriefShare meetings usually last $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours and use a format of video viewing, discussion, and the workbook. Groups are usually small, no more than 10, and confidentiality is well respected among participants. No one is required to speak, although participation is encouraged. Tears and silence are common appropriate responses.

There is hope and healing found in GriefShare. Over the last 15 years over 100 persons have sought support from the program itself and others who are participating in a second and even third cycle. If you would like more information, please call Carolyn Dotts@828-467-1433.




