The True Meaning Of Christmas Jesus, The Reason For The Season

Jesus – The True Meaning of Christmas – The Gift of God. Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus came into this world as a tiny infant born over 2000 years ago. The purpose of Jesus' birth was to enter into the world and become one of us to deliver us from our sins (1 Peter 2:24). Jesus' birth was unlike any other. Jesus was born of a virgin woman – He was in human form and born as a Jew. He was subject to God's law and fulfilled it perfectly. Mary was a young teenager, living in the village of Nazareth and engaged to be married to Joseph, a Jewish carpenter. God's angel Gabriel was sent to Mary to deliver the news of God's plan. Mary would become the mother of the coming Messiah. The angel told Mary she would deliver a Son by the power of the Holy Spirit and would name Him JESUS.

The birth of Jesus was a historical event. Jesus was born in Bethlehem, a small village about 5 miles southwest of Jerusalem. Jesus' birth came under the law (Galatians 4:4). Jesus is the second person of the trinity. He was born of a virgin in a lowly stable. He was wrapped in swaddling cloths and laid in a manger (a trough used for feeding cattle and livestock). The Baby Jesus was visited by humble shepherds keeping watch over their flock. Later Jesus was visited by the wise men who rejoiced with great joy, and when they saw the young child with his mother, they fell down and worshipped Him. They presented Him with gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Jesus is not just any person. He is God in the Flesh. As Jesus grew and taught, and what He did for us is tied inseparably to who He is. Jesus is fully human and fully God. Jesus took upon Himself full humanity. Jesus was the perfect sacrifice because, although He was fully human, yet He never sinned. Jesus was subjected to the same temptations and limitations that we are. God's Son entered into our world so He could display the perfection and holiness through His Work of living a perfectly sinless life and dying on the cross for us who are not perfect and living in a sinful corrupt body so that all who trust in Him would be saved from the righteous judgment of God. God did not send His Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world could be saved through Him (John3:16-17). Jesus' birthplace, Bethlehem Ephratah, was prophesied in the Old Testament (Micah 5:1-2). Jesus is preceded by a great prophet who was prophesied in the Old Testament. Esaias told people to prepare to see God work (Isaiah 40:3). John the Baptist used

these words as he challenged people to prepare for the coming Messiah (Matthew 3:3).

Christmas is the time of year when we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. The meaning of Christmas is and should be the recognition, appreciation, and honor of the Birth of Jesus, God's only Son who took possession of our sins upon Himself suffering the punishment we deserve that we could be saved by His saving grace through our faith in Him. Jesus suffered on that cross on Calvary's Hill, dying in our place for our sins which we chose to commit.

Jesus is the Reason for the Season. Jesus gives meaning to Christmas. Jesus was God in the flesh, perfect, pure, and Holy. He died on the cross and rose from the dead. The True Meaning to Christmas is the celebration of Jesus' incredible act of love (John 3:16-17). The True meaning of Christmas is the Real Story of God becoming a human being in the person of Jesus Christ. Christmas was necessary because we needed a Savior. Christmas is celebrated each year and the reason we celebrate should be out of gratitude for what God did for us. We remember Jesus' birth by worshipping Him, being conscious of the poor, and giving to those less fortunate by remembering the gift of Jesus as Jesus gave of Himself.

God loved His own and provided a way "the only way" for us to spend eternity with Him. God reached down His hand and gave His only Son to stand for our sins that we might go free. Jesus took our punishment for our sins by dying on the cross. He paid the price in FULL!!! We are free from God's condemnation when we accept God's free gift of love – Jesus Christ. Read Romans 5:8. Through God's unfolding plan we should be in Thankful appreciation for the Grace and Forgiveness that God has made available to us through His Son "Jesus Christ", our Lord and Savior. The real meaning of Christmas is rooted in the lives of God's people.


Eternity & Eternal Security

We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.

The Collapsing Global Supply Chain

"For the essence of prophecy is to give a clear witness for Jesus." Revelation 19:10 (NLT)

On November 11, a record 111 container ships were anchored off the coast of two California ports. This broke the previous record set just 20 days earlier. In response, Joe Biden promised to strengthen the resiliency of the supply chain by moving to 24/7 operations at the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach. The Biden administration is concerned about the Christmas shopping season and public opinion in an era of product shortages and rising inflation. But this is about more than just making sure shelves are fully stocked for Christmas. The problems involving bottlenecks in these ports are a symptom of a much larger systemic breakdown – a breakdown that threatens to collapse the entire global economic system

A Broken Supply Chain

Despite the optimistic forecasts of politicians, the broken supply chain won't repair itself any time soon. Its problems will carry on well into 2022 and beyond. President Biden can push for 24/7 port operations, but he knows this won't fix the problem. These promises are nothing but a public relations campaign to make voters think he's "doing something." Containers cover every square inch of these ports. Before new containers can be offloaded from ships, trucks, and trains need to move the existing containers to new locations. The nationwide shortage of truck drivers makes that a tall order. And the problem isn't confined to California ports alone. Supply chain problems and shortages plague almost every industry and factory in the world, covering a wide range of products such as bacon, semiconductors, toilet paper, aluminum, pet food, juice boxes, and a host of other items. Why is this? And what does it mean going forward?

COVID Shock

When COVID first struck in early 2020, the global economy came to an abrupt halt. We're now experiencing the trauma from that high-speed crash – and the damage is massive. The sudden collapse in global demand led to negative oil futures prices in April 2020. This caused energy producers around the world to cap production. Now that demand is returning, producers can't simply increase production overnight. So demand has increased much faster than supply. Fast forward to late 2021, and we're facing the consequences.

Natural gas prices in the United Kingdom are triple what they were just five months ago. Meanwhile, Vladimir Putin is holding much of Europe hostage as they've allowed themselves to become dependent on his energy supplies. In China, coal generates 50% of the nation's electricity, and coal is becoming harder and harder to a source. All this means one thing – higher energy prices, and higher costs for businesses and consumers. It also means energy shortages and rolling blackouts. These energy disruptions result in additional production shutdowns and manufacturing bottlenecks, further compounding global supply chain problems.

The Whole System Could Break Down

The constant disruptions from COVID shutdowns, energy disruptions, and shortages of key manufacturing inputs create a vicious feedback loop that only makes the problem worse. For example, let's take the following example: Widget A + Widget B = Widget C

What happens when an electricity blackout at an overseas factory leads to a shortage of Widget A? The answer is clear. Widget C can't be made. Since Widget A is a key component necessary to make Widget C, no one can make Widget C. Now the world has a shortage of both Widget A and Widget C. And this too makes the problem worse.

Imagine this scenario:

Widget C + Widget D = Widget E (the key component in manufacturing Widget A)

In this case, Widget E is absolutely necessary to make Widget A, and the world is experiencing a shortage of Widget A. The obvious solution is to produce more Widget A's. However, since Widget A is necessary to make Widget C, and Widget C is necessary to make Widget E, Widget E can't be made.

Can you see how the current supply chain disruptions could morph into a catastrophic failure? This type of destabilization could result in widespread shortages of everything, including food. This will lead to massive social unrest. As the old adage says, "Fear not the angry man, but the hungry man." Hungry people launch revolutions. Because of this, they're a threat to those in power. So what's the best way for politicians and heads of state to distract from such problems? History says it's war. War is often the result of trade disruptions, shortages, and/or resource scarcity. This means we live in extremely dangerous times.

The End Times Approach

For the moment, these supply chain issues may seem like minor inconveniences in your day-to-day life. But they illustrate just how fragile our global economic system is. Just-in-time delivery provides an efficient, cost-effective global supply chain system when everything works the way it's supposed to. But when unexpected events take place, the whole system falls apart.

What happens when grocery stores experience more than just a sporadic shortage of specific products? What happens when food itself is in short supply? When that happens, we'll also find out how fragile society itself is. Imagine if New York City (or any large urban area) ran out of food. How do you think people will react? What do you think politicians will do to divert attention from such a crisis?

The world is already on the verge of a major military conflict. Right now, Russia is gathering troops on the border of Ukraine. China is running daily combat exercises to prepare for an invasion of Taiwan. Israel regularly bombs targets in Syria – a nation where Russia, Turkey, and Iran all have an active military presence.

While people long for a return to "normal," it won't happen. We're in the last waning days of a dying world order. Soon, we'll have a catastrophic breakdown of the current global system. The world will erupt into war just like Europe did in 1914. When the dust settles from World War III, a new world order will emerge. What will it look like? I believe it will look like the one outlined in Chapters 6 thru 13 of the Book of Revelation.

Why? Because Jesus said so. He said when you see all the signs He and the prophets said to look for, you should look up (Luke 21:28). We see those signs now. Their convergence tells us His return is close at hand. Some of those signs are:

- Israel Back in the Land (Jeremiah 23:7-8; Ezekiel 39:28; Isaiah 11:12; Psalm 107:3; Ezekiel 20:34; Isaiah 11:11-12)
- The Jewish People in Control of Jerusalem (Luke 21:24-28)
- The Gospel Preached Throughout the World (Matthew 24:14)
- An Increase in Travel and Knowledge (Daniel 12:4)
- The arrival of the Exponential Curve (Matthew 24:3-8)
- Israel Surrounded by Enemies (Psalm 83:4; Psalm 83:12; Ezekiel 11:14-17; Ezekiel 35:10)
- Israel's Exceedingly Great Army (Ezekiel 37:10; Zechariah 12:6; Zechariah 12:8)
- The Rise of a United Europe (Daniel 2, Daniel 7, Revelation 17)
- The Rise of a Global Government (Revelation 13:7-17)
- The State of Mankind (2 Timothy 3:1-4)
- Denial of the Signs (2 Peter 3:3-4)
- And many more...

So what does this mean? It means now is the time to point out these signs to others and warn them of what's coming. If you've been waiting to share the Gospel with someone, don't wait any longer. Jesus is coming, and He's coming soon. The signs are all around us.

What do you think? Will the current supply chain problems will get worse before they get better? What will the ultimate outcome be? 
The Orchard at Altapass

Renovation Begins at the Orchard at Altapass

Mitchell County

The renovation has begun on the Olin Hefner Pavilion at the Orchard at Altapass. The first part of our "Bringing Back the Music" project is the construction of a ramp connecting the side walkway of the red barn to the pavilion. This will eliminate walking into the N.C. state road to get from one building to the other. Also, at a width of 5', the ramp will provide



smooth wheelchair accessibility between the two venues. Kameron Combs and It'SawGood Renovation, LLC from Marion are working on this first portion of the Phase I construction.

The entire project, a two-year plan to enclose the now roofed only area and add a 10' deck on the field side, got a slow start this past year, as construction costs skyrocketed and availabilities slowed. A grant from the Community Foundation of

Western North Carolina offset the cost of the new walkway. A matching grant from the Blue Ridge National Heritage Area will allow us to begin work on the deck addition later this season. When fully completed, the pavilion will be enclosed, feature a deck across the back that will showcase the spectacular orchard views, and be connected to the red barn by the walkway.



Beth Hilton, the Orchard's

executive director, said, "The restrictions brought about by the pandemic forced us to focus our energies on our mission, to protect, preserve, and educate. The "Bringing Back the Music" project opens the red barn for more educational exhibits and activities for the entire family. It will provide a dedicated space for heritage music and other cultural events pivotal in the history of this region."

The Orchard at Altapass, 1025 Orchard Road near Spruce Pine at mm 328.3 on the Blue Ridge Parkway, is a not-for-profit working small batch heirloom apple orchard, educational, and music venue. We reopen May 2022. For information about Orchard programs and opportunities, visit www.altapassorchard.org.



When your hundreds, if not thousands of miles from home and you have an off day, what are you going to do? Lay around in a hotel room?



This same motto has now trickled over into my everyday life 10 years later but in a much different context. Instead of traveling the country on my next adventure, I'm spreading the word of Jesus on every avenue. After traveling the country for nearly a decade, I have come to realize the US is not the powerhouse Christian nation it once was and I feel it's our calling to change that, TODAY!

"Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too". (Philippians 2:4)

The US is No Longer a Christian Nation

In a 2019 Pew Research study, 65% of adults said they were Christian whereas 26% said they were unaffiliated. When you look back at the same study but from 2009, you see that 77% of American's identified as Christian and only 17% unaffiliated.

Some may read that and say "WOW", 65% is still a large number but let's also consider the false pretense that many people consider themselves Christians but are not practicing it daily. One can simply open their eyes and see how people are treated, manipulated, used, and so on to see that America is not what it says it is.

If you have children, the scariest thought is the future of Christianity in America. In 2019, a Gallup poll found that 33% of 20-year-olds in the US identified as nonreligious which is drastically up from 13% in 2002. At the same time, Gallup also found that weekly church attendance is dramatically down by 22-year-olds with 39% attendance in 2002 and now only 26% in 2019. This trend of Church attendance actually goes down with only 19% of 24-year-olds attending weekly Church in 2019 before it starts to upward trend again.

Luke and the Lost Sheep

Luke 15:1-7 is a parable in which Jesus tells us of a lost sheep to express how the Kingdom of God is accessible to all, even those who stray away from God's path. In this parable, God is a shepherd who has 100 sheep but one goes astray. In Luke 15:4 Jesus asks "What will he do? Won't he leave the 99 others in the wilderness and go to search for the one that is lost until he finds it?"

With the statistics pointed out earlier, the new mission field has changed from international missions to domestic missions. Before we can change the world, we need to change right here at home.

On September 23, 2021, the Baptist Press published an article titled "'Fill the Tanks' Brings in 1,600 Baptisms in North Carolina". 700 NC Baptist Churches committed to 'Fill the Tank' from the coast to the mountains to celebrate new life in Christ.

Hopefully, this is just the beginning and together, we can bring Christianity back to not just NC but the entire US. So, the next time you're out, make it a mission to spread the word of God to just one person, if you do this every day for an entire year, you will have touched 365 people and if just 100 of us do this, we'll touch 36,500 people in one year. How They Served Our Country—Abraham Clark By David Streater, Ph.D. Burke County

This is an American history educational moment of those who made a difference during the Revolutionary War era and how they served our Country.

Abraham Clark was born into a modest farming family on February 15, 1726. As a youth in poor health, he was not able to perform farm work. Even though Abraham had a limited education due

to his parent's meager income, he excelled in math, leading him to be a surveyor. Later, he became an attorney and took pride in representing the indigent. During the mid-1700s, Clark served as a New Jersey legislator. Afterward, he was a high sheriff for the English Crown.

Abraham replaced an incumbent congressional delegate who was against independence. Even though Clark was a patriot, he opposed the United States Constitution until the Bill of Rights was included. Regarding the Declaration of Independence and the Revolutionary War, Clark wrote, "We can die but once. It is gone so far that we must now be a free independent State or a conquered Country".

During the Revolutionary War, the British retaliated against Clark for signing the Declaration of Independence. As revenge, his two sons were incarcerated as prisoners of war in deplorable conditions while being tortured. After the War, Clark resumed practicing law and politics.

As a Congressman, Abraham recommended the word "Liberty" be on United States coins. Other legislators were in favor of having presidential pictures. As a tribute to Clark, Congress approved his idea, and to this day all United States coins have "Liberty" printed on them.

In 1794, at the age of 68, Abraham Clark died at his birthplace of Roselle, New Jersey, from a sunstroke. Because of his love for America, Clark's epitaph reads, "He loved his country, and adhered to her cause, in the darkest hours of her struggles against oppression".



Religious Exemption Letter

Several people have asked me about requesting religious exemption from the COVID vaccine. Here is an example of a letter that has been used for exemption. Be specific in your request.

To whom it may concern,

(your name and D.O.B.) is requesting an exemption from all coronavirus vaccines based on faith and reli-

gious convictions. I am requesting exemption from the vaccine just as one would request an exemption under NC G.S.130A-157. Religious exemption and the North Carolina Occupational Safety and Health Act.

If the bona fide religious beliefs of an adult or the parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis of a child are contrary to the immunization requirements contained in this Part, the adult or the child shall be exempt from the requirements. Upon submission of a written statement of the bona fide religious beliefs and opposition to the immunization requirements, the person may attend the college, university, school, or facility without presenting a certificate of immunization.

Also Under the North Carolina Occupational Safety and Health Act, employers are not authorized to mandate immunization for those who object to immunization on religious grounds, except where it is necessary for the protection of the health or safety of others.

(Individuals who are vaccinated can spread the virus to others and are not guaranteed protection from Covid 19. Therefore, the Covid vaccination could not guarantee the health or safety of others.)

(12) Nothing in this or any other provision of this Article shall be deemed to authorize or require a medical examination, immunization, or treatment for those who object thereto on religious grounds, except where such is necessary for the protection of the health or safety of others. (1973, c. 295, s. 5; 1991 (Reg. Sess., 1992), c. 1021, s. 2; 2011-366, s. 8.)

95-151. Discrimination.

No employer, employee, or any other person related to the administration of this Article shall be discriminated against in any work, procedure, or employment by reason of sex, race, ethnic origin, or by reason of religious affiliation. (1973, c. 295, s. 26.) (Article 16 Occupational Safety and Health Act North Carolina)

Please do not discriminate against me.

Not only for their own safety but for the safety and wellbeing of their family. A Christian must have a conscience without reproach before God.





Total Recall

During this season, the second chapter of Luke's Gospel is so popular that it's easy to forget about the first chapter. The opening of Luke is especially

powerful when we consider the context of what preceded it.



Every Bible character is portrayed against the backdrop of human fallibility. Abraham, Moses, David, and Elijah are heroes of our faith, but their failures are never sugarcoated. In Luke 1:5-7 we meet a couple who are described in astonishing terms, "They were both righteous before God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord." This glowing report introduces an elderly priest named Zachariah and his wife, Elizabeth.

Only descendants of Aaron, Moses' brother, could serve as priests. Zachariah's wife was also a descendant of Aaron. Despite their illustrious ancestry and blameless lives, Zachariah and Elizabeth were viewed with contempt by their community because they were childless. Deuteronomy 28:1-14 records an impressive list of blessings that accrue to those who "faithfully obey the voice of the LORD your God, being careful to do all his commandments." Verse 4 says, "Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock."

We do not grasp the significance of this blessing because we live in a culture that mostly views children as an expense, an inconvenience, and a barrier to self-actualization. This un-Godly attitude is so pervasive that we have legalized the wholesale slaughter of the unborn and the newborn. In First-Century Israel, infertility was seen as a curse. Zachariah and Elizabeth's neighbors were no doubt convinced that they were guilty of some secret sin. The Word of God says otherwise.

Zachariah was chosen by lot to burn incense inside the Temple. This was a once-in-a-lifetime privilege that many priests never experienced. Zachariah probably prayed for and thought about this moment from the time he became eligible for priestly duty at age thirty. Not in his wildest dreams, however, did his expectations include a visit by the Angel Gabriel.

The Golden Altar of Incense stood in the Holy Place of the Temple. It was next to the curtain that shielded the Holy of Holies. A priest offering incense was expected to pray for the nation while experiencing this most holy event in his life. During that prayer, Zachariah is terrified by the discovery that he is not alone.

Gabriel is one of the highest-ranking heavenly creatures. His mission was to announce one of the most significant events in history. His appearance was otherworldly. His message was inconceivable. "You and Elizabeth will have a son," says Gabriel. "He will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God, and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord a people prepared."

Four hundred years earlier, Malachi made this same prophecy. A message given to Adam, broadened through Abraham, clarified through Moses, and intensified through the prophets is finally nearing fulfillment. The one who will bear the mantle of Elijah and prepare the way for Messiah is about to be born. Zachariah's difficulty absorbing this experience provokes my heartfelt sympathy. Who among us could receive such a proclamation—even from such a source—without some incredulity?

After John is born and the time arrives for his circumcision, Zachariah regains his speech. His first utterance is one of the most profound prophecies in scripture. It clarifies the purpose of the incarnation. John 1:68-79 says that the "Horn of Salvation" from the "house of David" will fulfill the words spoken by the prophets of old. Those words were promises to save Israel from her enemies, show mercy as promised to the Patriarchs, remember the holy covenant sworn to Abraham, and enable God's people to serve Him in holiness and righteousness.

This glorious prophecy goes on to specify the role of John the Immerser. He will be a prophet of the Most High, and he will prepare for Messiah's work of bringing salvation through the removal of sin. In the end, Messiah will bring light to those who sit in the darkness of death.

The clarity of Zachariah's pronouncement is astounding. Neither Messiah nor His messenger is charged with canceling the promises made to Israel from the beginning. Neither is sent to "replace" Israel with some other entity. Neither is charged with starting some new religion. Their combined mission is to fulfill all the covenant promises and make a way for sinful humans to once again stand in the presence of Holy God.

Most Christians insist that Jesus calls His followers to forget everything that came before Him. Zachariah—whose name means "God remembered"—says that Messiah calls us to remember and implement the terms of the covenant made with Abraham. Those terms are that we who are saved by grace are obligated to live in holiness and righteousness. The only way to know what that means is to read the first five books of the Bible.



It's so important that I don't believe you can be born-again unless you embrace this Biblical doctrine. So, before Mary was physically involved with her husband Joseph, she found out she was going to have a baby. It was a supernatural miracle from God. The Holy Spirit put the baby in the womb of Mary. I say this because that is what Christmas is all about. It's not about Rudolph and Frosty even though you might enjoy watching them. It's not about holiday parties and get-togethers even though it is good to be with others. Christmas is not a holiday, it's a Holy Day. Thanksgiving is not a holiday. It too is a Holy Day when we as Christians stop and recognize just how blessed we are, and to give thanks to the One who has blessed us. So, this is not a season of holidays, it is a season of Holy Days. But some people would say, "Why do you Christians make such a big deal out of Christmas? It's just another birthday!" Oh, but it's not just another birthday. It's a big deal because there was a woman who was a virgin that had never known a man, and the Holy Spirit of the living God came upon her and planted the Son of God in her womb, and she gave birth to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I think that's a really big deal. So, let's put out some lights! Let's put up some trees! Let's put out some decorations! Let's sing! Let's worship! And let us not say happy holidays. Let us not write Merry Xmas. Let us not say season's greetings. But let us say with some joy and excitement in our voices, "Merry Christ-mas" the Christ who was virgin-born, the Christ who lived a sinless life, the Christ who died on an old rugged cross, the Christ who was buried in a tomb, the Christ who rose from the dead, and the Christ who is soon coming again to receive His church unto Himself, that's what Christmas is all about. And without Christ, we would have no Christmas at all, because Christmas is Christ!

Dust-Off the Bible and Read It

Knowing me to be a Minister, a friend recently asked me about the expression, "The Patience of Job." She said, "You know, some people will say that someone has the 'patience of Job.' Doesn't that phrase come from the Bible? What does it mean?"

I responded that it does come from the Bible, specifically the Bible book of Job. "It's a remarkable story about a man who essentially lost everything dearest

to him," I said. "But with patience, he endured his trials faithfully and kept his faith. Someone with the 'patience of Job' demonstrates an extraordinary amount of endurance and forbearance."

She said, "I find that so interesting." I replied, "Well, I have a book in my library that lists numerous commonly used expressions drawn from the Bible. If you would like, I'll share it with you." A few days later, I delivered a book titled I Didn't Know That Comes from the Bible.

The book, written by Karlen Evins, is an easy read that explains the biblical origin and meaning of interesting everyday expressions such as:

Forbidden Fruit
The Sweat of your Brow
Raising Cain
Old as Methuselah
Mess o' Pottage
'I've Been to the Mountaintop.'
Apple of My Eye
Hitting the Nail on the Head
Bringing Down the House
Man After My Own Heart
A Painted Jezebel
Old as the Hills
Out of the Mouths of Babes
At Their Wits End

These are just some of the phrases about which Evins writes in her book.

Evins said that she did the research and wrote the volume because she hoped
"the words, phrases, and stories offered" would inspire people to dust off the Bible and read it.

One of the ironies of our time is that biblical illiteracy is extensive and increasing. Yet, so much of our culture has been amazingly influenced by Scripture, not just the little sayings and terms from the Bible that often make up our conversations, but also the profound impact on the much weightier aspects of civilization.

One of my favorite books was written by Dr. D. James Kennedy and Jerry Newcombe. Its title asks a question of incredible significance, What if the Bible Had Never Been Written? The book is a well-documented and in-depth look at how the Bible has shaped morality, the law, politics, science, literature, exploration, art, education, and the founding of America.

As noted on the book's jacket: "From the Ten Commandments, which many of our laws and government are based upon, to the Golden Rule, a verse taken straight out of the New Testament, to many of today's most common phrases and expressions...there is no doubt as to the influence the Bible has on everyone, in some degree, every day."

Nowadays many people query whether the Bible offers real solutions to our pressing problems in ethics and politics. The late American Reformed theologian, R.C. Sproul, once beautifully addressed this concern. He wrote:

"We are faced with new ethical issues that make application of ongoing principles difficult in a new environment. For example, previous generations didn't have to worry about when to pull the plug of a life-support system on somebody dying in a hospital. You didn't have to worry about that ethical dilemma because you didn't have the sophisticated equipment that makes that dilemma a reality. In that sense, we have situations that previous generations did not have to struggle with ethically.

"However, the principles we draw from sacred Scripture about the sanctity of life and the dignity of death, for example, speak eloquently to those specific problems that come to us afresh in each generation. I believe that we find in Scripture not simply the insights and opinions of primitive seminomads...what we find in Scripture is transcendent truth –truth that comes to us from an eternal perspective. That means we get nothing less than the mind of the Creator, who knows and reveals to us principles of what is right, good, and beautiful, and these principles can be applied throughout the scope of human history. [T]o think that the Scriptures were no longer applicable to my society or that they were out of date and old-fashioned would be to think that God is out of date, old-fashioned, and irrelevant."

There is nothing that has affected the world for more good than the Bible, especially Western culture. It truly has no equal. It is the Word of God, without error, infallible, and always relevant. A return to faith in its sacred pages would solve many of our current difficulties of great consequence.

But even more important than the way the Bible has touched society is the way it can touch you – the way it can impact your life for good – the way it can turn everything around. If the Bible can have such a positive impact on the whole world, think of what it can do for your little world.

Perhaps it's time to dust off the Bible and read it.

But as they walk in, they see the church itself divided into three sections (Catholic, Eastern, and Russian Orthodox) because these three groups have been fighting for centuries over who should control the site. And objects are hanging from the ceiling that looks like Christmas tree ornaments in a garage sale. The scene is complete with hawkers trying to sell you cheap souvenirs. With church groups fighting and dusty relics hanging, no wonder Bethlehem appears to be disappointing.

But wait, it's perfect! He was born in a stable. I've been in them. They stink. There are cow patties everywhere which mean there are flies everywhere. But it

This brings me to my second point. Jesus came to the real world as a real man to help real people. And Bethlehem mirrors reality today. This dirty little town is one of the best-known places in the world for one reason... Jesus was there!

And so too, with you and me, Jesus comes into little people like us--people who are somewhat dusty and smelly and not at all that impressive--and he makes us great, not because of who we are, but because of whose we are. We are His.

The disciples were a good picture of this. They started as a rag-tag group of n'er-do-wells and in one short generation, they changed the whole world. The interesting thing about their ministry is that the religious leaders were astounded at them and noted that though they were unschooled, they had been with Jesus.

Jesus has a plan for all of us. We may look like Bethlehem. We may be ignorant like the disciples, but if we will spend time with Jesus there is no limit to what he can do through us.

Do you want to have an impact on the world? Then don't just know the Word, spend some time with Jesus. It's all about him.

When Jesus commissioned us to go into the world and make disciples of all the nations, He didn't leave us without instruction as to how we might accomplish that. Jesus, Himself, modeled how we should follow.

During His life on earth, Jesus was our ultimate mentor. He demonstrated how we could live in union with the Father.

His instructions were clear: "whoever listens to you listens to Me; whoever rejects you rejects Me, but whoever rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me" (Luke 10:16, NIV).

Jesus modeled what to do. As the disciples walked with Jesus, He taught them by example. They watched Him teach the masses and perform miracles. He shared stories about the Kingdom of God and modeled how to share it with others. They learned how to minister to others by watching Him. Jesus often pulled them aside to teach them further. The people we disciple need authentic role models to follow, so they can learn by example how to put what they learn into practice.

Jesus told them to multiply. Learning how to walk this Christian life isn't the end result. Jesus took His disciples one step further. He commissioned them to go, take what they had learned, and disciple others the way He had discipled them. 



The spiritual victory was in the air and everyone soon found themselves enjoying the "showers of blessings" pouring down from heaven!

The Sunday morning service was conducted in a more traditional church. While I believe the congregation enjoyed the quartet, assurance of His approval of our efforts had to be taken on faith.

Following a quick lunch, we pointed our old leaky bus south into the pouring rain. The windshield quickly fogged over and trying to keep it clear with paper towels proved futile. One of the guys had a hair blower so we taped it to the visor, pointed it forward, and put it on wide open. So, there we were, squishing every step we took in wet carpet, back to bunks while a blow dryer steadily screamed. But despite our travel arrangements, no one complained. We had seen God work in a mighty way, and any inconvenience we faced, paled in comparison.

Back at work, Monday morning found myself telling those interested about the trip. One man, whom I had been witnessing to for a couple of years, had remained skeptical about Christianity and quickly pointed out flaws in those trying to serve Jesus. He was flabbergasted we had driven "all the way up there for nothing." I explained about the blessings the congregations had received and what a joy it was for us to be a part of it. Not being one to comprehend things of the Spirit, he couldn't grasp the concept of us answering our calling with no monetary gain. After letting me know how stupid we were to do that for free, he walked away shaking his head.


I don't know if he ever accepted Jesus before he died a short time later......

The Christmas Thief – Exodus 20:15 "*Thou Shalt Not Steal.*"

5 when the baby Jesus was taken from the victim's home located along the 100 block of Garland Drive, police said. The nativity scene was made and hand-painted by the victim's husband who recently passed away, according to police reports."

Most of us would never consider stealing from a Nativity scene, or from a department store, or from a friend or family member, yet we are witness to a Christmas thief that is much more prevalent than we realize. This thief may be difficult to identify, for we are all vulnerable to his assault. This thief lives inside each of us and must be guarded against during this Holiday season. In the verse above, we see that steal is the Hebrew word – ganab and it means "To steal or carry away; To take away by theft or secretly." In other words, it is to take something that belongs to somebody else, illegally or without the owner's permission. Are we guilty of being a Christmas thief? While we may not readily realize it, let us consider some things that are at risk of being stolen this season:

Consider the true meaning of Christmas; that God so loved this world that He sent to us a Savior! We become so entangled in secular Christmas stories and traditions that there is no time for the truths of Christmas. In our days of media hype and constant advertising, secular images take the main stage while the truth of the Christmas story gets neatly tucked away between the wrapping paper and the shopping bags. Let us resolve to be vigilant as we enter this season, that we do not get so immersed in traditions and legends, that we forget that God sent a Savior, our greatest need. Humanity did not need more information, they did not need more technology, or pleasure, or even earthly treasures or money. Humanity needed a way to salvation, and so God sent a Savior to the world, by way of a stable in Bethlehem, and this is what we celebrate at Christmas. To allow this great truth to be lost is to rob the world of the truth of the Christmas story!

Not only must we remember the truth of the season, but also to give this Savior the GLORY that is due Him. It is not just cliché that "JESUS IS THE REASON FOR THE SEASON!" According to our definition of stealing, to give glory to anyone or anything else is to rob that which belongs only to Christ. We read in Luke 2:13-14 "And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men." This word glory is the Greek word "doxa" and it means "a thing belonging to God or Christ, majesty. A most glorious condition, an exalted state." Friend, there is no one else on the planet or in the Heavens that is due this glory! It belongs to no one else except our Savior and Lord! The glory of Christmas is not in a mythical figure who brings gifts, nor is it found in holiday traditions, services, or gatherings. This glory that the angels sang about is only due to this child who was born to bring salvation to all mankind!

It seems at times that everywhere we look, Jesus is being taken away and Christ is being eliminated from Christmas... Would you join me in this simple prayer? "Lord help me not to be a Christmas thief and steal these things from others and from the Savior this Christmas. Would you help me to herald the truth of the Gospel and the true meaning of Christmas as I give glory to the God for His wonderful gift to me?"

(One final thought for the curious... according to Carlisle PA police, the baby Jesus that was stolen from the nativity scene was later safely returned to its owner... Merry Christmas!)



We don't hear much about that Jesus at Christmastime, do we? And yet the babe in the manger and the returning King are one and the same. So tell me, are you watching?



Bible Briefs

The Glory of the LORD

By Robert Garner Rutherford County

An interesting heavenly event of the star that the wise men (the Magus, or a Magian) followed, which they saw in the east, went before them to find the location of the young child Jesus. On a clear night, if you observe the stars in the sky above they are a great distance away, millions appear in the heavens. The star must have been quite unusual, very low in the sky, because the star was over the house pinpointing



where the young child Jesus was, Mathew 2:9-11. Also, The Glory of the LORD, the light of the star, and our gift-giving traditions at Christmas can be spiritually seen in these 3 verses.

Isaiah 9:6 is frequently quoted during the Christmas season. The beautiful Christmas account celebrating the glory and birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, is well known by Christians. We can read this Old Testament prophecy verse in the book of Isaiah; "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace". This single verse alone proves the spectacular truth of other prophesies recorded by Isaiah during his ministry and elsewhere in the Bible.

Hebrews 4:12 "The word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than two edged sword". Isaiah 49:2 "and he hath made my mouth like a sharp sword; in the shadow of his hand hath he hid me, and made me a polished shaft, in his quiver hath he hid me."

Waiting on "The Glory of the LORD", the child of God can only imagine being governed by flawless honor and reputation; perfect goodness with abundant riches in grace and truthfulness defines the word "glory"; that's only a small part of "The Glory of the LORD". "Arise, shine; for the light is come [Christ], and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee;" Isaiah 60:1.

The Glory of the LORD shone round about them and the shepherds were afraid. "The angel of the Lord said fear not, for unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the LORD; "Luke 2:9-11.

"For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea;" Habakkuk 2:14. Sadly, the next verse is a woe dealing with anyone assisting with their neighbor's [friend, companion] drunkenness; all forms of (spiritual/physical deception). "Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power;" 2 Thessalonians 1:9.

Absolute terror is experienced by Ezekiel, Joshua, and others at the brightness of the Lord's Glory; as the brightness around a rainbow; drops them to the ground with their face in the dirt. Saul describes the Lord's brightness from heaven "above the brightness of the sun"; that intensity of brightness forces him and his companions to the earth; Acts 26; 13, 14.

The first biblical record of the Glory of the Lord being seen by the children of Israel is after the Lord has brought them out from under the law of Egyptian slavery. "And in the morning, then ye shall see the glory of the Lord; for that he heareth your murmurings against the Lord: and what are we, [the LORD & Moses] that ye murmur against us?" Exodus 16:6&7.

The Glory of the Lord appears to the congregation of Israel in a cloud covering mount Sanai for six days; "And the sight of the Glory of the Lord was like devouring fire on top of the mount in the eyes of the children of Israel; Exodus" 24:17.

Moses, having received grace from the Lord, requests to see the glory of the Lord on mount Sanai before receiving the ten commandants. And Moses said, "I beseech thee, show me thy glory". And it shall come to pass, while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee in a clift, [crevice] on a rock [Christ], and will cover thee with my hand while I pass by. And I will take away my hand, and thou shall see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen; for there shall no man see me, and live;" Exodus 33:17-23. "And when Aaron saw Moses after he came down from the mount, the skin of his face shined;" Exodus 34:30.

Handel's "Messiah" a musical masterpiece containing "And the Glory of the Lord" is based on Isaiah 40:5;" And the Glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it."

This is a fantastic Christmas song for all to hear, turn up the volume! is the King of all the earth; sing ye praises with understanding; hear the song "The Glory of the LORD".



A Glimmer of Light for Veteran Depression

"I've seen 'impossible' happen so many times, it's just common to me," Robert Bailey, Jr. said as he showed me his most prized work: The Freedom Lantern. Robert's dream is to see the U.S. government gift one of these meticulously crafted pieces to every U.S. veteran. The piece is meant to serve as a "thank you" for their service from a grateful nation and as a physical reminder that "someone cares."



"You know, that's why we work with these veterans. We really like veterans, and I got to watching this veteran suicide business. It's disturbing. I've been there, and I've seen these folks. I dealt with one of them pretty close one time," Robert shared....

This particular veteran and his sister visited the showroom at the Buck Stove manufacturing plant in Spruce Pine, NC. It didn't take Robert long to realize the man had some struggles. He would only nod or grunt as a response to any communication and his sister acted as an intermediary between them. Robert soon noticed the man was attracted to a small, laser-cut flag.

After asking a few questions, Robert came to understand the gentleman and his sister were both veterans and the brother had recently attempted suicide. Robert picked up the small, metal flag and asked him, "Do you know what this is?" "Yes sir, I know what this is," the brother responded, to Robert's surprise. They were the first words he spoke since entering the showroom.

"You know, I'd really like for you to have this thing and take it home with you, and just know that somebody cares and we really appreciate your service," Robert said. "And I'm telling you, he looked at me just as straight as he could, face to face, and started talking. He talked for about 45 minutes, and we talked about all kinds of things. The three of us just had a really good conversation." Eventually, they said goodbye and Robert sent them away with the gift of a flag and a Freedom Lantern. "That lantern means we care," Robert told them.

Two weeks later Robert received a letter from the sister: Everything had changed for the better since their meeting. Robert had made a difference in the life of a fellow veteran.

You may never have heard of Robert Bailey Jr. and left to him, he would keep it that way. As the youngest child of Robert Sr. and Dorothy Bailey, it is easy to understand where his devotion first developed. Robert Bailey Sr. gave his life in service to America during World War II, three months before Robert Jr. was born, and his body remains in France. Dorothy devoted the rest of her life to their children. Raising them in a God-honoring home was primary, and the church doors

hardly opened without her little ones found in the pews. Robert gave his heart to Christ at a church revival when he was 9 years old.

Robert Jr. nobly served our country as a young medic in Vietnam. Like so many other soldiers who survived that terrible time, the atrocities Robert witnessed could not be unseen. Unknowingly suffering from PTSD, his life took a dark turn and he struggled with a destructive depression for several years.

Sustained by the faithful love of his family, including "a very good girl" who became his bride, Robert made it through to a day that changed everything. Robert's wife talked him into taking her to a Billy Graham film and afterward he rededicated his life to the Lord. "From that time on, it just changed. When I realized what kind of mess I was causing...I finally got my head on straight...and man has it been good ever since!" he said, smiling.

Robert has witnessed many "impossible" events happen in his life since that day. Four years after he and Alvin Barrier opened Minpro Supply, a humble, country store in Spruce Pine, NC, Mr. Carol Buckner walked into their business. After a couple of visits, Carol cut a deal with Robert and Alvin to sell an item he had recently developed, the Buck Stove. The rest is history. Today, these beautifully crafted stoves provide heat to over one million homes.

The impossibilities do not end there, however: Gloria Houston, the author of "The Year of the Perfect Christmas Tree," asked Robert if his company could produce several lanterns made in the likeness of the one illustrated on her book cover. Robert agreed and the New Buck corporation soon began a venture in lantern manufacturing. The lanterns evolved into personalized lanterns for special occasions, and eventually The Freedom Lantern.

This led Robert to the ultimate expression of his life's work: The development of the Freedom Lantern Project. His goal is to see a Freedom Lantern in the hands of every U.S. veteran as a gift from a grateful nation to honor their service. Many have purchased these lanterns and Robert has given many as a gift to veterans he has met. Many people would certainly support this endeavor on a funding platform, but Robert strongly believes our government is the appropriate entity to back this project. He scoffs at the word "impossible."

Unfortunately, though the U.S. government is no stranger to wasting billions of tax-payer dollars on underwriting private corporations such as Solyndra and Tonopah Solar Energy, elected officials from both sides of the aisle have refused to support The Freedom Lantern Project. Robert has written letters to presidents and various government officials to no avail.

Don't our servicemembers deserve an heirloom-quality lantern that says, "Thank you?" I believe so and I trust you do too, so our call to action is this: Reach out to every senator, representative, star, and influencer possible. It will only cost a few moments of your time to send letters, tweets, make phone calls, and social media posts. Tell them to back Robert Bailey Jr. and The Freedom Lantern Project. "Impossible" is a target to destroy.





The Word "God"

The word "God" is found four thousand, four hundred and forty-six times in the King James Version Bible. This number could vary with other versions.

You might be surprised to learn that two books in the bible do not have the word "God" in them or mention God at all. These are the books of Esther and Song of Solomon.



The book of Esther is a historical book about a young Jewish girl. After Queen Vashti displeases the King, he selects Esther for his Queen. Esther risks her life to prevent an act of genocide against the Jewish people. Esther is a story of human action, and the Song of Solomon focuses on human love.

Why are there no direct words from God in these two books? The other books of the Old Testament mention God or prophets who speak on God's behalf. Neither of these two books includes any spokesperson for God. Also, there are no recorded miracles by God's prophet. When God does something out of the ordinary, we read it in the bible.

Even though these two books don't mention God specifically, we should read them in the context of God's covenant with Israel. There is an important message and teaching to us in both books. In the book of Esther, we recognize faith throughout the book, and The Song of Solomon describes the bliss of married love. God sees his relationship to Israel as one of marriage, even though Israel is a terrible bride to Him.

Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Hosea all use marriage to describe God's covenant to Israel, usually portraying a picture of Israel's sin. When we read the beginning of Ezekiel 16, we find the kind of generous, passionate love God has for Israel, and it sounds similar to what we see in the Song of Solomon. Even though these two books don't mention God, they teach us a lot about God's relationship with his people.

These two books would not be in the Bible unless God had some purpose in them. 2 Timothy 3:16 tells us that "*All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine.*" Take time to read Esther and Song of Solomon as you receive a blessing from understanding God's word.

Raspberries and Copper Coins
By Tracy Jessup

"Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." (Mark



The New England Holocaust Memorial was built to pay tribute to the six million killed and to honor the survivors. Located on Boston's historic Freedom Trail, the memorial "is designed around six luminous glass towers, each reaching 54 feet high, and each lit internally from top to bottom. The number six has many meanings here: the millions of Jews killed in the Holocaust; the names of the six main death camps; a row of memorial candles; and the six years, 1939-1945, during which the infamous 'Final Solution,' the most deadly phase of the Holocaust, took place. In addition, millions of numbers are etched in the glass, representing the infamous tattoos inflicted on many of the victims' arms."

In each tower, superimposed on the troubling lists of numbers, are brief personal statements made by selected death camp survivors. One was from Gerda Weissman Klein who was deported from Germany as a teenager and later married the U.S. Army soldier who led the troops that rescued her. "Ilse, a childhood friend of mine, once found a raspberry in the camp and carried it in her pocket all day to present to me that night on a leaf. Imagine a world in which your entire possession is one raspberry and you give it to your friend."

The context of today's passage is that of a warning Jesus gives to "beware of the scribes" (v. 38a). Why this warning? Because of their desire to be noticed and held in high esteem (they "like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets!... and for the sake of appearance say long prayers"). The scribes also made it a practice to exploit others, particularly widows ("They devour widows' houses...).

Many commentators have noted that the widow, who in her poverty gave her all, may represent the many widows whose houses have been devoured. With this in mind, Jesus simply is continuing his condemnation of the scribes, who instead of caring for widows as the law directed them to do are taking advantage of them. While this most likely is an accurate observation, it must not be overlooked that Jesus does in fact commend the sacrificial action of the widow. "For all of them [many rich people] have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had..."

John Ortberg writes, "The Lord of the Gift is very wise. He knew exactly what he was doing when he created you. He is well-pleased that you exist. He has entrusted to you everything you need to fulfill the purpose for which you were created. At the end of the day, God will not ask...What did you do with what you didn't have? Though, he will ask, What did you do with what you had? (If You Want to Walk on Water, You've Got to Get Out of the Boat, p. 43).

Prayer: Lord, thank you for the generosity seen in raspberries and copper coins, and for the example of "Jesus, who though he was rich, yet for our sakes became poor, so that by his poverty we might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9).


POEM

Peace Like a River

Singing hymns has allowed me to express worship and provided a strong foundation for my faith. One such hymn is, "It Is Well with My Soul." The lyrics speak of God's help in troubling times.



When peace like a river attendeth my way When sorrows like sea billows roll Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say It is well, it is well with my soul.

As I have aged, "peace like a river" has become more important to me. Some people call it "peace of mind" which means to have an overall sense of contentment or acceptance in certain situations. Words like still, calm, and satisfied can be used to describe feelings of peace. When a river flows, it goes either around or over obstacles. It flows without stopping. Peace like a river is a peace that flows in our lives despite troubles or turmoil.

Our culture today seems to be one of tribulation. Unrest causes stress and frustration. An aging adult recently told me: "The past year was tough. Sometimes I feel like giving up and want to feel and think nothing for a few minutes, to rest a bit." In other words, "the sea billows roll" in this person's life. The Bible portrays the sea as the source of storms. Storms in our lives cause us to feel restless and helpless.

Having "peace like a river" starts with knowing Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. God's Word is filled with verses that bring peace amid struggles. John 14:27 reads "My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

Peace is a gift from God; all we have to do is accept it. Finding peace like a river allows us to sing the refrain of this hymn over and over: "It is well, it is well with my soul."




A Pastor's View

"He Will Save His People From Their Sins" (Matthew 1:21)

C.S. Lewis wrote of a funny experience his brother Warnie had while riding on an English double-decker bus one day during the Christmas season. The bus passed a church with a manger scene outside of it, and Warnie overhead a woman exclaim: "'Lor', they're dragging religion into everything these



What is the significance of this saying? The name "Jesus" (or "Yeshua") means "Yahweh is salvation," an indication that God was saving His people through Him. But the angel specifically said that He would save His people "from their sins." What

The basic meaning of the word "sins" in Matthew 1:21 is "to miss the mark" — but not in the way many of us would think of it: like an archer, who was trying to hit the right target, but just couldn't do it. No, this word means "to miss the mark" of the standards God set for us regarding the way that we should live:

- -- God commanded us to love Him with all our hearts and souls, but we didn't; we "missed the mark," and chose to love other things in His place.
- -- God commanded us to love our neighbors as ourselves, but instead we "missed the mark," and chose to be selfish and self-centered in our decisions.

We could go down the list of all the commandments, and see that we have all continually fallen short of them. Romans 3:23 summarizes this when it says: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

And because we have sinned, we must pay the penalty for our sins. One of the clearest, most consistent messages of the Bible is that there are consequences for our sins:

- -- God told Adam & Eve regarding the Tree of the Knowledge of Good & Evil, "The day you eat from it, you shall surely die." (Genesis 2:17)
- -- "the wages of sin is death," Romans 6:23 says.
- -- Ephesians 5:6, speaking of sins, says: "because of these things, the wrath of God rightly comes upon the sons of disobedience."

But the Bible tells us here that Jesus came "to save His people from their sins." The baby Jesus grew up to die on the cross as the sacrifice which paid the penalty for our



BMC Senior Combines Love Of Dirt Bikes With Christmas Project For Kids By Cheryl Shuffler Burke County

Burke Middle College senior Jackson Crump went outside the box to create a service project that combines his love of dirt bikes with a desire to help less fortunate children. Jackson spent two Saturdays in late October collecting boxes for Samaritan's Purse Operation

Christmas Child shoebox drive. He called his project "Dirt Bikes for Tikes."

Jackson said, "I am a competitive dirt bike rider and have learned to network with other people in this sport, so I decided this past summer that I wanted to organize an event that would combine my two passions. I came up with 'Dirt Bikes for Tikes,' a day where I would encourage others to pay kindness forward."

Jackson's first step was to provide 50 fellow dirt bike enthusiasts who visited a popular mountain trail with Samaritan's Purse shoeboxes. Jackson had filled the shoeboxes with chicken biscuits Chick-fil-A donated, as well as a granola bar, pack of crackers, chocolate chip cookies, water, and a soda. Also included was a flier explaining how the recipient could take the box of goodies for themselves and turn it into something good for others. The information asked the bikers to take their box, pack it with things such as crayons, coloring books, flip-flops, hygiene items, socks, and craft items and return it the next Saturday.

Jackson is well on his way to meeting his goal of collecting 50 boxes and delivering them to Samaritan's Purse later this month. In addition to the Chick-fil-A donation, he also received an anonymous donation of \$500 for his project, which will help pay the \$9 shipping fee for each box. He said, "My hope is that somehow this contribution will give some kid a sparkle of that Christmas joy."

Jackson said one particular Christmas morning when he was younger was the inspiration for his project. He wrote in an essay about the project, "Every kid feels that tingle of excitement Christmas morning. The smell of the tree. The twinkling lights. The aroma of cookies drifts through the house. And most



importantly to any kid, the mountain of presents under the tree. Growing up, I felt all of those, too, until one morning when I didn't. As I looked at the presents, I felt an overwhelming sadness. A sadness for all of those kids in the world that did not have what I did on Christmas Day. I sat down and cried. I was seven years old. You see, my mother always taught us the importance of giving to others, especially when we have been blessed. Every year she took my sister and me to shop for kids like ourselves who didn't have the pile of presents or maybe even socks for their feet. Every year, my sister and I would fill the Samaritan Purse Shoeboxes with crayons, toothbrushes, Matchbox cars, pencils, and toys--hoping that our choices would bring that little bit of Christmas joy to another kid somewhere in the world."

Jackson is currently looking into colleges and is interested in the engineering schools at NC State University or UNC Charlotte and wants to be a mechanical engineer.


Pause...and Consider

3 Secrets to Finding Mary's Treasures By Marlene Houk

Luke 1:46-55

"And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord, And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden: for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. For he that is mighty hath done to me great things; and holy is his name. And his mercy is on them that fear



him from generation to generation. He hath shewed strength with his arm; he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seats, and exalted them of low degree. He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away. He hath helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy; As he spake to our fathers, to Abraham, and to his seed for ever."

When you lose a treasure, do you pray for its discovery? My friend and I dropped by her doctor for a visit, and, in the process, my right earring slipped from my ear and disappeared. I retraced my busy day, returning to the office and digging into their sofa, searching the fluff of my scarf, and scouring the car. Nothing. The copper earring with its brilliant chips circling the outside held importance as a Christmas gift from my husband the year before. I prayed, asking the Lord to show mercy by revealing the missing piece.

Several days passed. I repeated my prayer occasionally, having experienced amazing answers in the past to lost items. Five days later, my friend texted and I called her. She answered and a welcome voice warmed my chilly winter day with the news that a patient had found my earring in the parking lot and carried it to the office. What an unexpected pleasure to reunite the two earrings! My face lit with delight, and I enjoyed a rush of glee at finding my valued piece of jewelry.

My loss and recovery prompted me to reread Mary's song in Luke 1:46-55. Her words glow with joy after Gabriel's news that she would birth Emmanuel. She is in awe of God's amazing favor, and, in her words, decodes an elusive message



to finding the treasures of joy. I realized that recovering my earring reminded me of Mary's story. And I found Mary's three secrets to the riches of gratitude.

The first secret is to tell others, in detail, about your experience. I was impressed with the office staff for showing kindness. I told others the details, shared my happiness at their solicitude, and recalled their efforts to help me. Mary, the mother of Jesus, shared with others the joy and delight of her Son's love and sacrifice. She magnified her Savior, bringing His divine might and power up close so that others could know Him. Like a magnifying glass, Mary pointed others to Jesus with her life, her love for Him, and her legacy. The details of His love and care for Mary clear up our confusion and grief, thousands of years later. Likewise, we, like Mary, revel in the luxuries of joy as we magnify Jesus so others see Him up close.

The second secret is allowing your life to lead others to the Lord. The office staff was simply there—doing their jobs, fulfilling their training and duties. And, in the course of their career, God used them to point me to Jesus' abundant care for me, even in the little stuff. Mary knew God's might in her life. She joined Esther in knowing that God would include her in His plan to rescue people from sin. She surrendered to His plan for her, and God's might flowed through her like spiritual adrenaline. She focused on His might in Luke 2:49 and her spirit overflowed with joy. Like the surge of strength when others help push a car, Mary felt God work in her life as she lived, moved, and had her being in Him. (Acts 17:28) The third secret is showing compassion to others. The office staff busied themselves with their obligations, but they took time to listen and remember my needs. Mary experienced God's mercy, and she spoke of His tender loving care, inviting us, through her divinely-told story, to experience His grace for ourselves. As a mother wraps her newborn babe in mercy, so we gently enclose others with compassion as we share Jesus' gift of salvation.

I gifted the office staff with flowers and an Italian crème cake, small tokens of my gratitude for their thoughtfulness. And, like Mary, I discovered that to magnify the Lord, allow His might to flow through me, and show mercy to others would uncover a fountain of joy.



Walking By Faith

2 Corinthians 5:7 says, "We walk by faith, not by sight." The Christian walk is one of faith and not of sight. Hebrews 11 contains quite a list of people who walked by faith. Several heroes of faith are mentioned in that interesting chapter. Faith never failed; it always worked in the lives of those who have possessed and exercised it.



The word for faith is the Greek word (pistis) comes from the word (pitho). The word "pitho" is translated several ways in the KJV. It is translated in other places as assure, believe, have confidence, or trust and in other ways as well. When we see how the word is used in other places in our King James Bibles it gives us a very good picture of what the word is meant to convey to us.

The only way to have a successful Christian walk is to put confidence in the Lord and believe, even when we do not see at times when things do not seem to be going well in life.

It is through faith we see our way through the dark, discouraging times of life and come out living in victory, even though we may face some of the worst times. What does faith do in our lives?

Faith Gets Us In

The Christian life begins with a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. We are saved by grace through faith in Christ. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." If a person could go to Heaven by living a good life, doing good deeds, or any other way but Christ, then our Lord would not have had to go to Calvary to shed His precious blood for our sins. Calvary would not have been necessary if that would have been the case.

Acts 16:31 tells us, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." That word "believe" is translated in John 2:24 as "commit." There the Bible says, "Jesus did not commit himself unto them, because he knew all men." The time had not yet come for Jesus to die, so He did not put confidence in or trust those men to whom He was speaking. Thus, to believe in someone is to commit yourself to them or to trust them.

Faith is more than an easy belief-ism or some brief emotional experience. It is a commitment of your life and your eternal destiny to the Lord Jesus Christ. In one moment of faith the believer is made a born-again child of God; he instantaneously has a guarantee of Heaven at the end of this earthly journey.

Faith Enables Us to Stand

We can stand against the wiles (deceit or trickery) of the Devil. The word "wiles" is (methodeia), from which we get our word methods. Satan approaches people in many different ways and through many different channels. Between him and his demon buddies, they know what your weaknesses are and will try to make an inroad to your life by exploring and taking advantage of them. If you give Satan an inch, he will take a mile. The Bible exhorts us to "Neither give place to the devil" (Ephesians 4:27). We need to make sure we do not give Satan any elbow room or a beachhead from which to operate in our lives.

Faith gives strength to our lives. No one can stand in a spiritual battle without divine strength. God promises to give us all the stamina we need to not give in to evil or give up in the fiercest of battles. In Isaiah 41:10 the Lord settles us by saying, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness."

Faith Can Grow

Romans 10:17 tells us, "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Your faith may be small but it can grow. The more time you spend in reading and taking in the Word of God, the stronger your faith will be. Don't let the development of your faith slow down. Keep on reading the Bible daily because it will produce benefits that will add to and enhance your life. When you neglect your Bible, you are starving your faith. All of our faith is based upon what the Word of God says. Without it, we would have no reliable foundation for our faith. Faith Shields Us

Ephesians 6:16 states, "Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked." Faith acts as a shield; it is a means of protection. Ancient warriors often used shields to protect them from the arrows, spears, and swords of the enemy. Because we represent the Savior who they have rejected, they do not like what and who we stand for each day. This is a dangerous world and we have many foes, so be wise and take the weapons to which God has given us access. The Devil is relentless, he never gives up. However, Satan's fiery darts are of no avail, they are ineffective if we hold up the shield of faith.

Faith Settles Us

Faith relieves fear and anxiety. Do you remember what Jesus said to the disciples on the stormy sea? Jesus said to those disciples, "Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then he arose and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm" (Matt. 8:26). When we put our faith and trust in the Lord tempestuous seas become calm waters. Life has many turbulent seas we must cross, so that is why we must have faith, and our confidence in God, to settle us as we sail through life. Faith says, "I trust God to do what is right because He is all-wise, all-knowing, and all-powerful." Faith says, "When I can not see the way, I will still trust God." Job of old said, "Though God slay me, yet will I trust Him" (Job 13:15). Job also said, "And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God." (Job 19:26)

Faith Commends Us

"First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of throughout the whole world" (Romans 1:8). The church in Rome had such a great faith that it was spoken of around the world. There is nothing that should commend you more than when your faith is so evident, that other people speak about the clear manifestation of it.

One commentator wrote, "The readiness with which the Romans had embraced the gospel, the firmness with which they held to it, was so remarkable that it was known and celebrated everywhere."

Sometimes the word "world" has a limited scope in the Bible. Here it means the places throughout the Roman Empire where churches were established. Faith is something that makes itself known through human lives and human tongues.

Hebrews 11:6 "But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." You can receive more good things from God when you please Him than when you are in a state of displeasing the Lord.

On November 18th, Gov. Roy Cooper signed the first state budget into law in nearly three years. North Carolina Republicans had spent months negotiating in good faith with the Governor. As a Senate budget chair, I am glad to see this budget was finally signed into law. For the past decade, Republicans in the General Assembly have enacted smart, fiscally conservative spending plans. It's our responsibility to spend North Carolinians' dollars wisely and this year's budget builds on that with sweeping tax cuts and major infrastructure improvements across the state.

In addition to the many capital projects we have funded this year, the budget also includes provisions to rein in the Governor's emergency powers. Specifically, we have revised the Emergency Management Act to require a vote of the Council of State for the Governor to extend a statewide emergency beyond 30 days. Gov. Cooper has kept North Carolina in a "state of emergency" for nearly two years. This cannot continue. I believe it is critical that no one person should have the power to unilaterally shut down the entire state. This provision ensures that going forward by requiring the Council of State to vote on a declared emergency within 30 days, and the legislature to vote on it within 60 days. With the Governor signing the budget into law, that provision will become effective Jan. 1, 2023.

The legislature has also taken action to prohibit the type of secretive settlement deal that Attorney General Josh Stein struck with politically allied lawyers to change election law. During the last election, Attorney General Stein secretly negotiated with the Democratic Party's top lawyer, Marc Elias, to change the rules of the 2020 election after voting had already begun. This type of action undermines confidence in our elections. As such, the budget prohibits the Attorney General from negotiating secret settlement deals with political allies ever again by requiring the General Assembly to sign off before any settlements are reached. I believe this is imperative to ensure North Carolinians can trust our electoral process.

I believe our budget will be transformative for the state of North Carolina, not just with the many investments we have made in critical infrastructure projects, but also from the perspective of limiting the overreach of government. You can be sure I will continue fighting in the North Carolina Senate to make sure your tax dollars are spent wisely, and your rights are not infringed.

I hope your family enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday. My family and I have much to be grateful for, and I try to remember that every day of the year – not just Thanksgiving Day.

The month of November flew by in the blink of an eye. With the successful and safe county fair season behind us, we turned our attention to the last few safety awards banquets. I visited Albemarle, Roxboro, and Creedmoor in November to present safety awards to businesses in those communities. In total, we presented more than 2,600 safety awards around the state between August and November. Congratulations again to all of our recipients! Be on the lookout for next year's safety awards letter and application, set to go out in a few weeks.

In early November, I attended the North Carolina Electric Cooperatives 17th Biennial Pole Top Rescue Competition at Nash Community College. The competition showcased the skills of linemen around the state who demonstrated their expertise in rescuing a fellow lineman from atop a utility pole. I was able to observe firsthand the importance of workplace safety for the women and men who work hard to keep the power on for our communities' electric cooperative members.

On Nov. 4, the Biden administration released its COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) vaccine or testing mandate for private employers with 100 or more employees. I immediately released a statement opposing the mandate for several reasons. First, this mandate would place an unnecessary burden on employers already facing an unprecedented worker shortage. Second, the Biden administration did not provide one additional dollar to my department to enforce this mandate. Our compliance officers are already overworked, and it is irresponsible to add this responsibility to our plates without adding any additional resources. Finally, I think it is fundamentally unfair to make a person choose between receiving a vaccine or keeping a job that provides for their family. Fortunately, as of today, the federal appeals court has temporarily ruled that the Biden administration cannot enforce the mandate. However, I believe that this matter will ultimately be decided by the U.S. Supreme Court. To be clear – I support vaccines, I received the COVID-19 vaccine and I encourage my family and employees to get the vaccine. But I do not believe the federal government should force this decision upon employers and employees.

Closing on a positive note, the North Carolina General Assembly adopted a biennial state budget last week, and Governor Cooper signed it shortly thereafter. For the first time in several years, the state finally has a new budget in place. I'm happy to report that the budget, while not perfect, includes many items that will ultimately benefit North Carolinians. All state employees will receive at least a five percent pay increase over the next two years, and my department received much-needed operational funding and support for two new positions.

Friends, I would like to offer Christmas greetings from my wife, Lydia, and me at the beginning of this wonderful holiday season. It has once again been my privilege to represent District 46 (Avery, Burke, and Caldwell Counties) in the NC General Assembly. The most significant accomplishment of this legislative session is our compromise 2021-2022 budget being passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in both chambers. Governor Cooper then signed it into law on November 17th. This budget continues the Republican-led legislature's decade-long commitment to low taxes and responsible spending. Because of that, we've seen healthy budget surpluses year after year. This year's budget builds on that by providing major tax relief to families and major infrastructure improvements, including \$128 million for our district. The state budget sets in motion a 10-year, \$16.1 billion cash infrastructure and capital plan. It includes a sweeping tax cut that reduces the personal income tax rate to 3.99% over six years and increases the zero-tax bracket to \$25,500 for married filers. It increases the child tax deduction by \$500 per child and eliminates the state income tax on military pensions. The state budget includes \$100 million in recurring funds for a new state-funded teacher salary supplement for lower-wealth counties to help them recruit and retain high-quality teachers. Avery, Burke, and Caldwell Counties are set to receive \$1,458, \$1,199, and \$1,269 respectively per teacher to supplement the counties' portion of the teacher's pay. The budget also includes a provision to rein in the executive branch's emergency powers and prohibits the type of secretive settlement deal that Attorney General Josh Stein struck with politically allied lawyers to change election law after voting began in 2020. Our team successfully advocated for funds for community colleges, Soil, and Water Districts, the North Carolina School of Science and Math-Morganton, trails, parks, and several other projects that are important to NC Senate District 46.

As we begin this holiday season, let us not forget to continue to look out for friends and others that may have had a difficult year. Christmas is a wonderful time to focus on the 2nd great commandment that Jesus gave, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Remember the reason for the season is God's greatest gift, Jesus Christ. May God bless you all during this most wonderful time of the year.



sins. I Peter 2:24 says "He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross." Jesus paid the penalty for our sins so that we could be reconciled back to God.

A few years ago there was a judge in Great Britain, who had a homeless man before his court on a charge of stealing two Christmas cards. The man had clearly stolen them; he was guilty. The judge was compelled to be just and uphold the law. But he also felt compassion for the penniless, homeless man. So after finding the man guilty, the judge then reached into his own pocket, and took out the money that was required, and paid the man's fine for him.

This is what the God of the Universe has done for us. He is a just Judge, who could by no means just ignore our sins. But He also loved us and wanted to forgive our sins. So He made the only payment that would suffice to atone for them: a payment which only He could make, by dying on the cross for our sins. And when He did, He completely paid the penalty for our sins. When Jesus died on the cross, He cried out, "It is finished" — in the original Bible language a commercial expression which means that a debt was "paid in full." Jesus was declaring that the penalty for our sins was paid in full by His death on the cross.

Many people think of religion as doing enough good religious deeds to make yourself right with God. The problem is, the Bible tells us we can never do enough good works to save ourselves. Instead, it teaches that salvation is a GIFT bought by Jesus for us on the cross. If you will repent of your sins and receive Jesus as your Lord & Savior, you can be made right with God – NOT because of the good deeds you have done, but by what HE did for you on the cross.

I was in a restaurant with my wife Cheryl one time, and when we were about to leave I looked around and didn't see a check, so I asked the waiter for it. He said it has already been taken care of. I asked, what do you mean? He said someone else has already paid the bill! So we could walk out of that restaurant -- fully justified in doing so – because the price had been paid for us. There was no need for me to pull out my wallet, and get some cash or a credit card, or to offer to do the dishes, or anything else.

That would have been totally unnecessary on my part because the price had already been paid.

This is how it is with us and God. You don't have to try to perform a multitude of religious works to atone for all of your sins and make you right with God. Jesus has already paid the price. If you will repent of your sins, and receive His sacrifice, He will "save you from your sins" and make you right with God. Romans 8:1 says: "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Jesus came to pay the penalty for our sins. If you will trust Him as your Lord & Savior, then you can say with the old hymn:

"My sin, o the bliss of this glorious thought;

my sin not in part but the whole,
Is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no

Praise the Lord, Praise the Lord, O my soul!"

This is what we celebrate this Christmas season: that Jesus came to "save His people from their sins"!



Favored by God (A Christmas Devotional)

Luke 1:26-38

Luke 1:30-31 "And the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus'".



After nearly 400 years of silence, God sent his angel Gabriel to a priest named Zacharias. He and his wife Elizabeth were well past the age of child-bearing. However, this angel announced that not only would Elizabeth bear a son, but this child would be the forerunner to the long-awaited Messiah. Zacharias insulted Gabriel by questioning his prophetic word. This would result in 9 months of silence for this priest because he did not receive the word of the Lord by faith. Six months later, Gabriel found himself in the small village of Nazareth with another profound word from the Lord. The recipient was not a priest, but a young virgin named Mary who was engaged to a carpenter by the name of Joseph. Both were descendants of King David. Gabriel appeared before Mary and spoke these words: "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you". The word 'favored' is translated from the Greek word, 'karin' which could also be translated 'grace'. For a young Jewish woman, these words were beyond comprehension. The Presence of God resided at the Temple in the Holy of Holies, between the two seraphim. How could He be with her? What had she done to receive God's favor? Nothing could have prepared Mary for Gabriel's announcement and her demeanor must have testified to her shock and fear. Quickly, the angel eased her mind with these comforting words, "Do not be afraid, Mary for you have found favor with God..." Just as quickly, her confusion and wonder would have returned as he continued... "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus". More details followed concerning the child she would bear. Despite this sudden interruption of news which made no sense in the natural, Mary asked only one simple question. "How can this be, since I am a virgin"? Unlike Zacharias, Mary seemed prepared to receive this seemingly impossible message, although she questioned the process. Zacharias had essentially doubted the word from the Lord by asking, 'How can I be sure your words are true, Gabriel'? Often, the disappointment of unanswered prayers, the loss of opportunities, or the oppression of the enemy can result in a spirit of hopelessness. Although Zacharias was a righteous man of God, he had experienced too many years of priestly service without a fresh word from the Lord. He and Elizabeth had prayed too many years for a child without an answer. Scholars agree that Mary was only 14-15 years of age, therefore, she lacked the many difficult life experiences which commonly weaken our faith. Her hope in the Lord was fresh and her heart pliable. Mary received the word of the Lord and opened her mouth in agreement: "Be it to me according to your word". The favor of God is upon His children and we must guard our hearts and minds against believing otherwise. Our faith is in the grace of our God. When the word of the Lord comes with a holy assignment, recognize and receive it, for nothing shall be impossible with God.



Giving Forgiveness At Christmas

"What do you think, Christopher?" a notoriously divisive family member asked me. I would not take the bait this time. I had been down this path with her in previous family gatherings. She's nice and cordial in conversation, but when you share your contrary opinion with her, the boxing bell dings and she's ready to fight.



So I shared my opinion, which was contrary to hers, most nicely and politely as possible. But I should have known better. Here came the hammer to crush my feelings and tell me I was wrong, super wrong.

My mom and dad were in the room when the conversation took a harsh turn. They knew what she said and how she said it was inappropriate and harsh. Later both tried to console me and encourage me it was okay.

To their surprise, I wasn't shaken by the interaction. Why? Receiving Jesus's forgiveness means I forgive others. Jesus came to earth and forgave my wrongs. What a gift!

Christmas time is the best time to give forgiveness. Christmas is the celebration of when Jesus came to earth—when God gave His Son to the world—to forgive all people of their sins.

Paul told us, "In all this I have given you an example that by such work we must support the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, for he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than receive'" (Acts 20:34, NRSV).

Paul's short letter—Philemon—reminds me about forgiveness. In this letter, I see Paul living out what Jesus had said in Acts 20:34. Onesimus had wronged Philemon, but Paul asked Philemon to take Onesimus back and welcome him as if Philemon was welcoming Paul (v. 17).

Why such a plead for reconciliation? Why would Paul ask Philemon to welcome Onesimus back?

Because God did this first, "through him [Jesus] God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven" (Col 1:20, NRSV). Christ did it. He paid the ultimate price.

Last year I gave forgiveness to that family member for the harsh words spoken to me near Christmas. And this Christmas I will do the same for another family member. I do so from an abundance, "It is more blessed to give than receive" (Acts 20:34, NRSV). I have been forgiven by Christ, but I know it's more blessed to give than receive. So this Christmas, I plan to give forgiveness to family members, again.




Tim's Treasures

Pause now for a moment and sip on a cup of your favorite hot beverage as you read the tale below. May your heart be blessed by the journey within.

The ominous clouds hung low over the mountains. To most, it was a warning, but to Arden, it was just another obstacle through which he must push. The dust from the Civil War had yet to settle. It was 1871, and there was still great poverty throughout the South. The roads which were little more than wagon ruts were filled with weary travelers seeking a better place. At night, the bandits preyed upon the weak. It was a bleak time.

Arden was finally heading home after another grueling trip to livestock trading posts in North Carolina. There, he had taken some of his family's Quarter horse colts to sell. The Carolina markets paid much more than those on the edge of the frontier, so it was worth the dangerous journey. Besides, Arden Edwards wasn't just a horse trader; he was the last of a dying breed – a frontiersman.

The farther west he traveled after turning off the Trading Path route toward the mountains, the darker the sky became. Finally, it was as if the heavens couldn't withhold their bounty any longer. The snow began fluttering down in large goosedown-sized flakes. It was beautiful and foreboding at the same time. A chill ran across the seasoned trapper's spine. There were many miles to travel before he could rest. Nothing felt right about this. Storm clouds only meant that his arduous journey would become even more difficult. The rugged mountains slowly being blanketed by a cover of whiteness depicted an eerie peace. Arden's horse Jeb blew breaths of clouds of labor before him as they climbed the Eastern Divide. All around them, the sound was washed from the air as a calm flowed over Arden's soul. Something made him pause, looking out over the vastness of the earth, slowly turning white. It was as if he was seeing a place to which he had never known, a distant place beyond the clouds. "Will I ever know something greater than this," he thought to himself as he gritted his teeth against the biting cold. Flashes of the war coursed through his mind, and he winced at the scenes. Angrily, he nudged his spurs against Jeb's side, and they pressed onward.

Arden was originally from Orange County, not far from what we know today as Chapel-Hill. But now, his home was in a tiny village in the southern Illinois territory, out on the edge of the prairie. It would someday be known as the village of Maunie. After the war, he headed west like so many survivors. He had met a young woman and settled down near her family on the banks of the Wabash River. There, Arden fell in love with a pretty young maiden; her name was Nellie Jane. They married, and he found himself working horses with her family. Before long, her family chose Arden to take the yearlings east for the market. It was only natural, seeing as he had connections back east and was familiar with the open road. So, with trepidation, he headed off in hopes of returning as quickly as possible. But most importantly, his young bride was with child, so there was an even greater urgency to make it back before Christmas.

As horse and rider pushed through the deepening snow, he thought of his mission. His pouch was full of valuable payment for the stock he had sold. These funds would support his and his wife's family for many months. Yet, Arden knew that carrying such a rich purse meant he was an even greater target. Bandits and thieves were an ever-present danger, but he was no greenhorn to the perils of traveling the Trading Path trail. At one time in his life, he had carried bundles of hides to Raleigh to trade in some of the more affluent markets in his fur trading days.

That was before the war, before Nellie. It was as if an eternity had passed. Arden's horse, Jeb, was a hearty breed from good Quarter Horse stock, one that could make such a journey. His gun, a Colt army model .45 caliber, a relic from the war, was snuggled against his side just inside his thick fur coat. It had served him well through many battles, and he knew how to use it if needed. He realized that if he could just make it through the mountains the most challenging part of the journey would be behind him.

However, before Arden had cleared the deep passes of the Blueridge, the gentle flakes had become a howling blizzard. Undeterred, he pressed onward. The warrior fought against the cold and hunger, fearing that he might risk freezing or being robbed if he stopped for the night. So, with unprecedented determination, he fought against all of his instincts to stop. Fording across the French Broad, his feet froze to the stirrups, but still, he pushed onward. By the time he reached the Kentucky territory, his body had lost all feeling. The temperatures continued to plummet. Soon the blinding whiteness consumed man and horse.

Once more, the peace, an unearthly calm, passed over his being, one like never

There, only five miles from his new home, they found him and his horse, Jeb. They had fallen into a deep ravine. Arden was trapped beneath the weight of steed. His feet were still locked into the stirrups, still frozen in place. Jeb had died - frozen stiff. But buried beneath his horse, somehow barely breathing, Arden was



still alive. They later surmised that the body heat of the dying horse sustained him long enough for them to find him. They took Arden home and nursed him back from the edge of death.

When he finally awoke from his ordeal, he was at last able to see his beloved Nellie once more – his journey complete. Arden was there when his son was born a week later. But, as happy as the story may sound, there was still a price to pay.

As was often the case in those days, because of the exposure, Arden came down with pneumonia. The rattle in his lungs that lingered after his son's birth became a haunting reminder of his near-death experience. Soon, the cough became a fever that sucked the energy from his very being. Slowly, the hardened frontiersman found himself bedridden. Nellie and her family tried all they could to save him, but there was a distance in Arden's eyes. He no longer had the fire within but instead seemed to be looking at a distant place beyond the walls of their meager cabin. Nellie sat on the edge of the bed, cradling their newborn son in one arm while reading scripture to Arden as he listened with eyes closed.

In her prayers, Nellie begged God to open her beloved's eyes, to save his soul before it was too late. Time was not on their side.

The family all whispered the inevitable out of reach of Nellie's hearing. Deep inside, everyone knew it wouldn't be long.

But there, confined to his bed, Arden began to realize something that before had only been a distant notion. God had been with him all along. Through those dangerous trading trails, through all of the bloody battles, and even through the freezing blizzard, He had been there. Arden had never stopped long enough to really seek Him. But now, as Nellie would read the Bible, he found himself yearning to know Christ more than ever before. From one struggle to the next, all through his life he had pushed his body, not thinking of the soul within. He had never slowed down long enough to think about eternity - not until now as he stood on the edge of life and faced it. Here, now in this time that God had allowed, he was given one more chance to realize what he had never sought but had been there all along for his taking.

Then one evening, before the sunset on the distant horizon, Arden knew he had finally found Jesus. Like the last rays of daylight, his life was almost gone; he had found Him before the darkness came. The scene from his recent journey returned to his mind. There standing on the precipice in the mountains, he looked out upon the vastness of creation. There before him were no more storms, nor more scenes of horrific battles, but a sea of gentle calmness. Arden's mind could finally see the world with eyes made new, and he silently whispered to himself, "There was much more to this life." In Christ's arms, he could now rest, knowing that his family would be in God's hands, not his.

Arden continued to fight the sickness in his lungs, but his life had become like water, slipping through his fingers. With each passing day, he faded away a little further. Nellie could see him struggling with each breath, and her heart panged to watch him suffer, but there was nothing left to do - nothing but to pray for comfort. Then one night, as the full moon crossed over the river, like a spirit coming to beckon him home, he passed away, lying in the arms of his beloved Nellie Jane.

Arden's journey was finally complete.

They buried Arden Thomas Edwards on Christmas Eve, in the year of our Lord,

As the last hymn was sung at the graveside, the snow began to fall once more. There in the anguish of death, Nellie felt a warmth, like a comforting arm wrapping around her. The snowflakes fell onto her eyelashes as her tears melted them into the heartache within. Before her, the casket was soon covered with a blanket of white, as if God had come to tuck Arden into bed for his final rest. Yet, she knew he was long departed of this world, and for a moment, realized that she was not alone. Arden was with the Lord, and the Lord was with her.

As the entourage of mourning departed, the snowflakes continued to fall, and silently, as tender as a feather upon the cheek, all the sound was once more washed from the world – and there was peace on earth.

Whatever obstacles you face this Christmas, don't let them hinder you from seeking the most important thing in this life - God. For without him, we strive for all the wrong things. As Arden found, he had lived his life only trying to make ends meet. It wasn't until he was forced to face eternity that he realized there had always been so much more, if only he had just taken time to notice.

In all things, no matter what gifts you did or did not receive this Christmas, realize that the gift of life in eternity with God is the most precious gift of all.
