The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the very Spirit of God, fully divine, manifested in the life of every believer from the moment of salvation. He is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His daily control.

The Bible

The Bible is the divinely inspired, authoritative, infallible, living and active Word of God to all men. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the ultimate source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. In it we find a guideline for right relationship with God and God's creation, and a blueprint for personal, emotional, and spiritual growth.

Humanity

Humanity is designed and made by God in His image. Although God designed us to have fellowship with Him, we became alienated from God through disobedience. As a result, all human beings are born with a sinful nature and choose to sin against God. We are incapable of regaining a right relationship with God through our own efforts.

Eternity & Eternal Security

Our soul, the essence of our being, was created by God to exist forever. That forever is spent in one of two places: eternally present and in union with God because of His forgiveness and salvation or eternally separated from God because of sin and unbelief. At the moment that our physical body dies, those who are saved are immediately taken to heaven. Those who have rejected God's gift of salvation will spend eternity separated from God in hell. Because God gives man eternal life through Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and eternal power of God that gives this security. (John 3:16; 5:11-13, 10:29; 1 John 2:25; Romans 6:23; Revelation 20:15; 2 Timothy 1:12; Hebrews 7:25; 10:10-14; 1 Peter 1:3-5)

Salvation

Salvation is God's gift of redemption and reconciliation to Himself and is offered freely to all who accept, by faith alone, Jesus Christ as God's only son and receive Him as Lord and Savior. We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.

A Mother's Perseverant Prayers Answered After Disastrous Twister

As his home's windows blew in, Michael Kemp didn't know if his mom was OK.

Yelling for her across the house, the two met in the main hallway while a tornado tore through their historic neighborhood in Mayfield, Kentucky, on Friday, December 10. It was one of at least 30 twisters to touch down across the Central U.S. and killed at least 90 people, ranging in ages from two months old to 98 years old.

The next few minutes would be the most terrifying of the Kemps' lives.

"Mom, what are we going to do?" Michael asked, standing in his bathrobe in the pitch black of night.

"We're going to start praying," his mom, Janet, said.

And they didn't stop.

While the twister sent debris flying overhead, tearing down the exterior walls

of the house and removing much of the roof, the Kemps laid flat on the laminate floor with their two small dogs and repeated the Lord's prayer (Matthew 6:5-13).

"That's all I knew to do," Janet recalled on Tuesday, December 14, as she talked with Greg and Vicki Fleitz, crisis-trained chaplains with the Billy Graham Rapid Response Team (BG-



RRT). The team consists of more than 2,200 chaplains, and dozens have been deployed following the catastrophic storm system.

"[Faith] is sometimes all we have," Greg said gently.

Janet agreed.

"The good Lord brought me through it with my son. It happened so fast," she said before explaining this wasn't the first house she's lost.

In 2007, a house fire reduced her belongings to ashes.

"I prayed through that," Janet said.

Two years later, her husband died.

On Tuesday, Samaritan's Purse volunteers busily milled about the house searching for valuables and loading any salvageable furniture into a trailer, like a grandfather clock and bedroom set. Here, a Christmas angel lays among the debris. It's a reminder thousands won't have a home for the holidays after surviving a storm that hit just two weeks before Christmas.

"I prayed through that," she said again.

Then, she had to file bankruptcy and lost the home her late husband built for er.

"I prayed through that," Janet repeated.

For the past 12 years, the faithful woman has lived in the greenhouse near the old downtown district.

"I ain't stopped praying, honey," she said. "It's the first thing I do every morning. I have my coffee and say my prayers."

And what happened next is evidence.

Saved Twice in the Hallway

As Michael showed Greg where he took shelter in the hallway during the storm, the chaplain mentioned how fragile life is.

They were surrounded by shattered glass, shreds of insulation, and debris wedged into the bright-colored walls.

Right after the storm, Michael said it looked "like a bomb went off." Between the flashes of lightning, "You could see rubble everywhere," he continued. "People were crying and screaming. [It was like ...] all kinds of hell."

And yet, Michael and his mom had only small cuts on their hands from the storm's treachery.

Greg asked the young adult if he hadn't made it through the twister, did he know where he'd spend eternity?

Despite his mother's faith, Michael wasn't sure. He'd pulled away from God due to issues with Christians and the church.

"Churches are full of sinners," Greg explained. "[Salvation is about] a relationship between you and God."

Pulling out a Steps to Peace With God booklet, the chaplain shared several Scripture verses with Michael, including 1 John 5:12 which states, "Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life."

In the same hallway that Michael had survived the storm four days before, he wanted to be saved once again. But this time it was for eternity.

"Never doubt His love for you," Greg assured Michael, who attested God had "been dropping pretty big hints" in his life to get his attention. "He knows I'm hardheaded," Michael explained.

A few minutes later, Greg and Vicki gathered alongside a sea of orange-shirted Samaritan's Purse volunteers to pray over the Kemp family before heading out. After asking for Michael's permission, Greg openly shared that the young man decided to follow Christ, resulting in smiles and cheers from the volunteers.

But no smile was bigger than the one on Janet's face.

"You accepted Christ?" Janet mouthed to her son.

He nodded. "You don't know how long I've been praying for this," his mother said. "Now both my kids are saved!"

This coming year Freedom Life will be participating and hosting several great events this year, so please keep up on our Facebook page and website here at the Blue Ridge Christian News.



Organization Celebrates First Graduating Class of Pilot Lifestyle Medicine Program

Morganton, NC (Dec. 15, 2021) -- C2Life, was founded by 2021 Governor's Volunteer Service Award recipient, Chasity Poteat Rice of Morganton, NC. Recently, C2Life hosted its first graduation of qualified participants from its pilot lifestyle medicine program, Food is Medicine-Burke.

The graduation celebrated the success of the 17 Burke County participants of the inaugural Food Is Medicine-Burke program. The medically-supervised program spans nine weeks and measures the effects of plant-based nutrition on chronic disease and overall health.

Participants were previously diagnosed with any combination of diabetes, hypertension, and high cholesterol, represented a diversity of age, race, social-economic levels, and health history, and were "sick and tired of being sick and tired," Rice said.

The program centers around established pillars of health, including lifestyle education, plant-based nutrition, nutrition education, and community support. Participants received daily education videos and participated in weekly Zoom meetings and completed lab tests. Rice coordinated weekly walks on the Morganton Greenway, meditation and yoga workshops hosted on the Labyrinth at Grace Episcopal Church, and Breathe Yoga & Pilates. Additionally, participants had the opportunity to experience hands-on cooking skills at the C2Life kitchen and gained confidence in properly reading nutrition labels and shopping smarter during grocery store tours hosted at Food Matters Market & Cafe.

"Our goal is to eliminate chronic disease and end hunger caused by poor nutrition," Rice said. "We created C2Life with the inspiration of getting healthy, nutritiously delicious meals and education into low socioeconomic communities. The Food is Medicine-Burke program is our first step toward measuring that effort."

Rice said the partnership with Dr. Brian Asbill of Ruckus Health, Asheville, NC, has been amazing. Dr. Asbill is caring, approachable, and is committed to bringing health and wellness to others through education and in 2017, became the first certified physician to hold the diplomate status with the American College of Lifestyle Medicine.

"Lifestyle medicine is focused on educating people about the importance of optimal nutrition, exercise, stress management, sleep, substance use, and social connection and then translating that knowledge into behavior change so that people can live longer and better", says Dr. Asbill. "Ruckus Health really is all about helping people to rediscover their innate ability to live in balance and thrive and C2Life shares that bigger vision".

Rice said the measured lab results were impressive. On average, blood pressure dropped to a normal average of 121/77 from stage 1 hypertension. Of the eight diabetic or pre-diabetic participants, six measured normal levels of blood sugar while both diabetics were successful in lowering their A1C scores with one participant improving from 9.4 to 7.0. Total cholesterol decreased 11% and inflammation markers dropped 15%. Although Food is Medicine-Burke isn't a weight loss program, participants did experience an average waist circumference reduction by three inches and recorded an average weight loss of 9.7 pounds during the nine-week program.

The achievements went beyond lab results. Graduates from the Food is Medicine-Burke program reported unanticipated benefits such as better sleep, less joint pain, the ability to quit smoking, and the confidence to embark on new journeys, such as enrolling in career and technical training.

C2Life partnered with Ruckus Health, the Good Samaritan Clinic, Burke Health Network, Burke United Christian Ministries, Roots Hummus, Food Matters Market & Cafe, Breathe Yoga & Pilates, Western Piedmont Community College, and Grace Episcopal Church. "One of my favorite quotes is an African Proverb, 'go fast, go alone - go far, go together' said Rice, I am very thankful for our coaches who volunteered their time and to our community partners who gave of their time and leveraged their relationships to make this pilot program a success."

Spirits were high on November 22, when the first graduating class gathered at the Morganton Community House to celebrate their success. Rice and Asbill, awarded certificates and special recognitions to participants and coaches.

"The group of people surrounding me on this journey has really helped me drastically when making better eating choices. Especially when my family doesn't follow the same journey," said one of the graduates, Juan Carolos D., after the ceremony.

"The good habits that we've learned have been phenomenal....The way I feel really impacts my physical presence. This program has done wonders for how I feel about myself," said another participant, Zach R.

Asbill and Rice concluded the ceremony by stressing that this was a commencement, not graduation. They hope that the 17 participants have just begun their journey in plant-based nutrition. The second Food is Medicine-Burke program is planned to launch in February 2022.

In June 2021, Rice was recognized for her dedication to the community with a 2021 Governor's Volunteer Service Award. She is a former executive director of the Burke County United Way (2015-18) and has served in leadership positions at Burke Hospice and Palliative Care. She serves on the board of directors for Burke United Christian Ministries and Burke Education Foundation Inc.

Founded in 2018, by Chasity Poteat Rice and joined a year later by Karen Teed, a 30-year entrepreneur in the catering and restaurant industry of Charlotte,



down to the river that fills the reservoir that provides the town's drinking water."



Marlene's Meditations

Victim or Victor?

Each year, the Christmas story told so magnificently in the Bible in Luke chapters one and two offers lavish treasures. Perhaps angels anticipate our unwrapping rich spiritual truths as we mine for gold and gems in the verses. Breath-taking brilliant jewels of truth shine



into the New Year—offering rich moorings with which to anchor my life. This year, the majestic jewel of a victor, in contrast to the black obsidian of the victim, caught my attention.

Often, we think of Mary as a victim of her circumstances: unwed, exiled, and uneducated. She coped with the potential attack by entrenched religious zealots and bore the stigma of pregnancy without the benefit of marriage. The iron band of Roman government utterly dominated her people, the Israelites. We sing songs that ask questions about how much she knew. But our perspectives may change when we consider another viewpoint.

Recently, I listened to a sermon by a well-educated and experienced preacher who shared a thought-provoking approach to the reason Mary visited Elizabeth in Luke 1. He startled me with two questions in his sermon, and I unwrapped a powerful gem of truth. He informed us that after Gabriel's announcement to Mary of Jesus' birth, she traveled about eighty miles, (a 3-4 day journey) to visit her cousin Elizabeth. She was going south to the hill country of Judea but Bethlehem was in that area. The preacher posed this question: was she researching what the same journey would be like at full-term, nine months from then? He also asked: did Joseph use the decree by Caesar Augustus to fulfill prophecy rather than being forced to Bethlehem for taxation? If so, that makes Joseph and Mary savvy and strategic partners with the Lord in changing history and fulfilling God's plan for them. They were far from victims of their circumstances; they were victors! And therein lies the message. When we think we're the victim, we're actually the victor!

At times, thinking of ourselves as victors is difficult. Sometimes, frustration blurs our goals. And our challenge shifts from meeting goals to overcoming obstacles. This reminds me of the old saying. "It's hard to remember that your initial objective was to drain the swamp when you're up to your ears in alligators." Often, life turns worse. Being fired by a misogynist, betrayed by a husband, or blindsided by death may shackle us with a victim mentality. But, as Christians, God tucks jewels of hope within His stories like Mary's to help us transform our thinking from victim to victor.

Our weakness in forgetting our victor status may be the reason God so often reminds us in His Word about our true status as His children. Romans 8:37 reminds us that "we are more than conquerors through him that loved us." And Acts 1:8 shines light into our despondent hearts with the words, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." One of my favorites is 1 John 5:4, "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." The Bible reveals treasures that empower us to turn from victim to victor.

As 2022 shines brightly upon our horizons, may we remind ourselves that we are victors and not victims. May we focus on the Lord, setting our face, like Mary, stalwartly toward eternity, knowing that we are victorious in Christ!

Mary was able to trust God in big ways. By setting her face like a flint towards the Lord, Takeaways:

- 1. When we focus on the Word of God, as Mary did, we can fulfill His plan for us in the New Year.
- 2. We are the Victors, not the Victims.
- 3. "Go ahead, underestimate Me, this'll be fun." I've learned, in 58 years of walking with Christ, that 9 times out of 10 I've underestimated the Lord of Hosts.

Like the timelessness of pearls and diamonds, one facet of Mary's story remains—her status as the victor rather than the victim. Mary seemed to have a focus that recognized her precarious position as an unwed mother but remembered the angel Gabriel's, words. She kept them at the forefront of her mind and focused on her end goal—obeying God tenaciously.

"The quickest way to an ambulance ride is for strangers to bicycle together on roads no one in the group has ever ridden." This sage advice coupled with my personal experience of riding in groups, (most of it bad,) prompted me to habitually ride solo. As a pre-teen, riding with friends led to hitting



a telephone pole while showing off to girls. Soon afterward, I received another "reality check" by getting knocked over by a car. My attention had been focused on my riding buddy when suddenly, the bumper meets the leg, and I hit the pavement. "Kissing that car," gave me a whole new appreciation for safety in general and bicycling awareness-in-particular.

As a young adult, my bicycling continued by commuting to work, with my overall physical fitness improving because of it. Several years later my first 150-mile weekend birthed a love of intra-state cycling, a passion that endures to this day.

My desire to see America up close and personal eventually led to a three-thousand-mile cross-country bicycle adventure. I traveled with a mixed lot of mostly middle-aged folks. The majority were safety conscious, but as in any crowd, there were enough dim wits to make things dangerous for everyone. Speeding closely by a startled cyclist with no warning, following too closely when in a group, coupled with general "horseplay," soon had me pulling away and riding alone for safety's sake.

I routinely kept as far to the right as the teeth-rattling "rumble strips" allowed. Despite continual cautionary advice to the group, accidents mounted, the worse of which caused one woman to leave the ride with a fractured pelvis. From the camp full of bandaged arms and wrecked bicycles, I gained a whole new appreciation of the Holy Spirit and His attempt at guiding hardheaded people.

With our ride nearly over, and exhaustion taking a toll, two other "like-minded" men and I decided to travel together for company and to look out for each other. Wendall, a "New Englander" and Roger from Ohio proved to be competent and accident-free cyclists in the previous twenty-five hundred miles. Our riding styles complemented one another, and this bolstered my confidence in finishing the trip without injury to man or machine.

The early morning of the ride's last day started with an extended blast from one of the support truck's horns. This brought the camp awake and started a mix of revelry and riding that was a long way from safe. While first heading toward the finish of our great adventure, the three of us heard Wendall's rear tire go flat. Like the well-experienced team we were, while Wendall sprinted to the equipment truck to get a new tire, Roger and I flipped his bike, pulled off the old tire, and started inflating a new tube before he could run there and back. On the road again in less than five minutes, we habitually separated ourselves from the pack and headed to the finish line. Things went smoothly enough for around thirty miles until I spotted a sunflower field in full bloom, where I wanted to stop for a photo op. I called for my friends to pull over, which Wendall did. Roger however decided to ride ahead rather than wait and with a feeling of foreboding we snapped the picture and took off in hot pursuit.

While topping a hill, a group of riders gathered around someone on the ground suddenly loomed in front of us. In a flash of panic, it became obvious Roger had wrecked. After bailing off our bikes, we charged up to see him pretty much out of it while the welcome sound of an ambulance closed in. It turned out, the injuries, while needing surgery, were not life-threatening and our friend was out of the hospital in a few days.

In hindsight, the accident was caused by numerous things. Wendall and I should have forgone stopping and stuck together. Going against conventional wisdom, Roger made a mistake falling in with a group of exhausted bikers on an inadequately marked road. By trusting ill-suited people to "watch his back", Roger's trip was cut short thirty miles from finishing. His misfortune didn't sit well with Wendall and me, so we organized an abbreviated ride, which happened one year later, for the express purpose of peddling with Roger to the finish line. Whether struggling through any given day or peddling thousands of miles, we must make sure to travel with disciplined people strong in the faith. That way when trouble comes to our way help will be close at hand.

God is always watching and sees to it that money and/or advancement gained under false pretenses is never profitable in the long run as we always reap what we sow in the end (Romans 12:17-19; Galatians 6:7-8; Revelation 21:8).

Some examples of dishonesty He judges are:

- --lying about your income to get benefits from government programs or pay less taxes (Proverbs 10:2; Colossians 3:9).

Historians are not exactly sure just who should get credit for the poem. Originally, it was a political satire condemning the alliance between Scotland and England in the 1600's. A

pun, if you will, toward crooked politicians from both countries trying to get along despite their animosity towards one another. We can hardly deny that our world today has really gotten "crooked." Not just politicians, but from top to bottom. Everywhere we look, things are out of whack.

The author of the gospel that bears his name, Luke, tells of an incident about someone who was crooked. Crooked in the sense that she could not stand up straight. Of the 4 gospel writers, only Luke tells about a woman that could not straighten up. It happened one Sabbath as Jesus was supplying the message for the day of worship. "And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up." (Luke 13:11)

According to my mother, I was always standing crooked when I was a boy. She was always telling me to "stand up straight" or "straighten up" but here is a woman that went way beyond a slouching ten-year-old. We cannot be sure what her issue was but from the original Greek language, we see that she was "bent double." For eighteen years this woman had some chronic curvature of the spine, some spinal deformity that crippled her to the point that Luke, a physician himself, gave us a snapshot of a disease that had horribly interfered with the woman's joint and body movement. She was crooked!

I like that the woman, despite her crippleness, still came to church. Which is where she comes in contact with Jesus. "But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity. And He laid hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God." (Luke 13:12,13)

Although we may not be able to ascertain the exact malady that this woman had which had made her crooked, Jesus does tell us who caused it. "So ought this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound, think of it, for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" (Luke 13:16) Jesus blames Satan the Devil. By extension, Jesus tells us that Satan causes pandemics, Satan causes cancer, Satan causes heartaches, Satan causes pain, Satan causes death.

We live on a crooked planet that desperately needs to be put straight. And so it is that we have experienced 2021, another crooked year on a crooked planet. Praise God that there is a pre-planned answer that the Godhead put in place before the foundation of the world; an answer for mankind so that he can be loosed from Satan's clutches and we can escape our crooked lives.





ness in others, strengthening and believing in them.

As a new year has dawned, the sun rises to find this country and the world still struggling with the devastating effects of a pandemic. This month is the second anniversary of the advent of the coronavirus. Much fear and con-



fusion have been spoken and written throughout these past two years. Only one thing remains the same: Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior. The Apostle Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 2:3-10 to remind those who follow after God that there is only One who has the power to save—sovereign God Himself. Only One gives comfort through His eternal promises. Only One can offer hope for a lost and hopeless individual and world. God's grace, mercy, forgiveness, and promises are found in One person—the Lord Jesus Christ. Paul wrote in verses 9-10, "Indeed, we had the sentence of death within ourselves so that we would not trust in ourselves, but in God who raises the dead, who rescued us from so great a danger of death, and will rescue us, He on whom we have set our hope. And He will yet deliver us..."

In Christ, we have set our hope! By placing our faith in Christ, we have been given hope—an unshakable hope. Hope, of course, is usually defined as "a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen." Indeed, the feeling of hope arises every time we, who cannot see or know the future, fix our gaze upon something beyond ourselves out there in the future. Having done that often and continuously, and having experienced the squashing of hope over and over, humanity has so often found themselves giving in to despair or any number of the lies of the enemy of God. How often do we find ourselves not hoping at all? That's exactly where the deceiver wants to take us! But in God, we place our hope!

As an action verb, "hope" is an expression of "wanting something good to happen;" namely our expressed and desired outcomes for the future. There is an anticipation, an expectation, and an optimistic want or desire placed upon that outcome for which we have hoped. Hope, it appears, is when we wish for something or the desired outcome.

But for a follower of Christ, hope is much more than just a wish or a feeling. In the Word of God, hope is a constant theme that is found. And it is expressed throughout the stories of difficulty or failure; desperation or despair. The Word of God teaches us the wonderful truth that hope is the invitation of a loving God. He reaches out to His broken, alienated, and lost creation and invites us to seek after Him. And when we seek after Him, we will find Him. God calls out to us and summons us to hope in Him! Our Savior and Redeemer plead for you to place your hope in Him. In other words, He asks you and me to diligently search for and seek after what we cannot see with human eyes. He is inviting us to hope or look by faith for His answer to sin; His offering of forgiveness; His gift of salvation, peace, joy, and comfort. And all of which we are seeking after and hoping for is found in Jesus.

Let me mention that both the Hebrew and Greek words for "hope" used in the Bible carry the deep meaning of "trust." To hope is to trust! That's not wishful thinking! That's solid trust and belief in the One, true God; in His faithfulness and promises; and in His love and sovereignty. We may then say that when one has never trusted in the Lord, then that person has no real hope! But when one places their faith and trust in Christ, then we have hope. And so, any hope that you have for 2022 is really tied to your response as a believer to the promises of God! For, I "hope" you see, your hope and trust in Christ Jesus sets the stage for the remarkable outpouring of God's Spirit.

Paul reminded his brothers and sisters in Christ that the Holy Spirit is the source of our hope, for His power causes hope to abound. He wrote in Romans 15:13, "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Here is the good news for 2022—Our God is the God of hope! The truth is, while everything and everyone claims that designation for themselves, they cannot deliver! But God can and will accomplish and complete His promises—for He is eternal and His promises are unconditional! Faith and hope will allow you to see this and live this year in the blessed promises of eternal and loving God. May the God of all hope bless you and keep you and may His face shine upon you and give you peace and joy.

A New Leaf

This month I thought we would talk about a really cool insect. One that is so organized, and sophisticated that their colony is the second most complex society on the whole earth. Ours is ranked number one.

This colony is also farmers who grow a certain kind of fungus for their larvae to eat.

They are known as Leaf Cutter ants. They cut off leaf pieces and haul them in their mouths to their home where they use the leaves to grow fungi in their garden for their offspring to eat. Is that cool or what?

The adult ants only drink sap from the leaves for food. They work so quickly they can clear more than one tree of its leaves in less than a day! A nightmare for people who grow trees and plants for a living in the areas where leaf cutters live! Leaf cutters live in Northern Texas, South America, and Central America.

These dark red ants have a lifespan of ten to fifteen years. They are like butterflies in the fact that they go through metamorphous stages. They hatch from eggs as lava, then go through a pupa stage. They eventually reach the ant stage about 40-50 days later.

Their body structure is like other ants except for the back of the thorax has three rows of spines that look like teeth. This is so they can move things easier.

Leaf cutters belong to the ant group called Atta ants. They are also able to excrete a liquid when they find a superb food source which lets the others know to come and help gather it.

Each ant has its own special role in the colony. The largest ants, called Majors are the protectors, guardians, and heavy lifters. They also clear paths of debris so the others can get to their food source.

The second-largest ants are called Mediae. They do the majority of the cutting and carrying of leaves for the colony.

The third-smallest, the Minors protect the food and the forging path. They get to ride on the tops of the leaf pieces as they are being transported back to the nest. They do this to protect the ant that is carrying the leaf from parasitic flies. These Minors drink leaf sap on the way back home as well as inspect the health of the leaf making sure there is not a foreign fungus already growing on them. If there is, they will rid the leaf of the fungus.

The smallest ants are called Minims who work solely at home. They tend to the fungus garden and the larvae. Some of them work only as garbage collectors. Removing decayed plant matter from the garden. Once deemed a garbage collector, these ants are no longer permitted to interact with the queen or tend to the fungus garden to prevent the spread of disease. They will be garbage collectors for the rest of their life.

The name of the fungus these ants cultivate is known as Leucocoprineae. The ants care in great detail about the fungi they grow. If the leaves they bring the fungus to eat don't agree with them, they will throw them out and feed them something else. They also release an antibacterial substance from the bacterium that grows on their bodies to protect the fungus from infection. The relationship the ants have with the fungus is called symbiotic, meaning they do something to help each other survive.

Speaking of leaves, have you ever heard of turning over a new leaf? Which means changing something about yourself or something you do? One of the most common times to do this is the beginning of each New Year. Most people make New Year's resolutions in hopes to change something or better themselves. Do you make new goals for the new year? I certainly do. It's a time I think about the past year and how it went and then I think about the things I would like to improve about myself and set new goals to try to achieve within the next year. It is okay if you don't meet each goal, sometimes that happens too. But it gives you a sense of things to improve and try to meet. I love the fact, that God knew we needed a reset button, a fresh new start, or to turn a new leaf so to speak. He cares so much about us not only did He give us a New Year to do this, but He also gave us a fresh start each new day when we wake up! He is graceful and forgives us of our many mistakes and gives us infinite fresh starts each day, each time we ask for forgiveness, each new year. Sometimes something happens where the day is just horrible and I can't wait to go to bed and have a fresh start the next day! To me, this is one of the best gifts He could ever give us.

Dear Lord, we thank you for caring for us so much that you give us infinite fresh starts and the chance to turn new leaves when we ask for them. I pray that each one of us will seek the plans You have for us and that we will trust our lives to You. In Jesus's name, I pray, Amen.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

Who Will God Use in 2022?

"Paul, called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ through the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother, Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all that in every place call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs and ours: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ." – 1 Cor



Here we are at the beginning of another New Year... and many will resolve to do things like lose weight, exercise, or fulfill "bucket list" items. As fun and challenging as these things can be, how often do we consider including God in our plans for the coming year? While none of us want to be unfruitful... or unfaithful... it seems that commitment is sometimes difficult to find. It does not take very long in studying the Bible to find that God has always used His people to help accomplish His plans. It is crucial for us, as the church, to realize the importance of answering this question.

In our scripture above, Paul is addressing the church at Corinth... and it was full of problems. There were divisions, fornication, and even litigation, as well as several other issues that he would address in this letter. Even though Paul had much to say to this church before he began his letter... he saluted them. This salutation reminded them of who he was, but also reminded them of who (and whose) they were. With that in mind, consider with me this thought... "Who will God use in 2022?"

I believe that God will use the REDEEMED. Notice that instead of signing letters at the end, as we do, Paul immediately identified himself. Here Paul reminds them of his calling for he is an apostle of God...through God's will! This was not what Paul had planned for his life. It was not his will... it was God's. Not only does he remind them of his purpose, but he reminds them in v.2 that they are the church of God! They are sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be saints! There was work there for them in the church, and this is who God would use. He addressed them as "the church which is at Corinth." This word for church is ecclesia... "the set apart." Regardless of where we are serving, we are the redeemed, the saved, the blood-bought; and that is who God uses both in Paul's day as well as our day.

Second, notice that He will use the RIGHTEOUS. Even though this was a church that had its share of problems, (which Paul would address later in his letter), their position in Him is secure... "sanctified in Christ Jesus." There is no other way to be sanctified or to achieve righteousness. It is only by being sanctified in Christ Jesus that these were to be called the saints of God. At salvation, our standing changes before God, and our position changes from guilty to justified. While justification is an act, sanctification is a process, and we grow in His grace and knowledge (2 Pet 3:18) as we serve Him.

Finally, I believe that God will use the RESOLVED. Resolve means to: make a decision, or to "settle an argument." Notice in v.3 that Paul salutes them with Grace and Peace from the Father and also from the Lord, Jesus Christ. Grace was the Gentile greeting of the time, and Peace was its Jewish equivalent. By using these together, Paul was reminding them that they were all ONE in Christ! They were those, regardless of origin, who claimed Him as Lord. Many say that we claim Him as Lord.... But do we recognize Him as such? Are we resolved to know Him as Lord and allow that Lordship to guide us as we serve together?

While the apostle Paul had a unique calling, the same God that called him to be faithful enables us to do likewise as we serve Him. Who will God use in 2022? In Christ Jesus, we are the REDEEMED and the RIGHTEOUS ... But will we also be resolved? Who will God use this year... will it be you?



It was in this vein of thought that the first thing that blurted out of my mouth when my colleague mentioned this incredible scientific breakthrough was, "What if someone on earth is looking through the lens of the orbiting telescope and sees in the distance another eyeball looking back at them?"

"You mean like another being, like an alien looking at us?"

"Not quite." My mind was thinking more of God, but at that moment, I couldn't bring myself to say it out loud.

"Or maybe you mean like us looking back in time at ourselves," he said with a hint of mysticism in his voice, "Like through a wrinkle in time?"

"Perhaps," I replied, but my thoughts had already begun to turn to how amused God must be at our incessant desire to disprove his existence by hoping to look back to the beginning of time. Under my breath, I mouthed the first lines of the gospel of John to ward off any more insolence, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. When we seek what we cannot find, we lose our way. But when we seek Him, as the scriptures had said, if we knock, the door shall be opened. When we realize that all we need is merely for our asking, if only we ask, then the concept of realization of our existence begins to make sense. "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me." And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart."

If you can find nothing else in this past year for which to give thanks, believe that there is at least one thing that was there all along. You may not have turned around and caught a glimpse of that setting sun, but then again, you had to turn from your ways before it could be seen. Once our time on earth is done, there won't be any more opportunities to make restitution with God. Judgment day is at hand, and all will stand before the Lord. "But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men."

Are you ready for eternity?

Seek not things of this world, but seek that which gives life eternal, the salvation that comes only from Jesus Christ.

Thanks be to God.







The Source of Our Power

Ephesians 6:10 tells us, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might."

We are beginning a series on Battling Through Life. It is sure that we are engaged in warfare since we have been saved. We have an internal enemy called the flesh, an external enemy

we call the world (evil system around us), and an infernal enemy called the Devil. All three attempt to defeat us every day of our lives but we cannot allow them to defeat us.

They are all three formidable foes, but we are well able to overcome them, not in ourselves, but in the assistance the Lord will give to us.

Because of the flesh, our fallen Adamic nature, we are weak, but through the Lord we can be strong, facing our enemies victoriously. Our enemies are three-fold: the world (the evil system around us), the flesh (our fallen natures), and Satan himself.

The Christian life is not an easy life; however, it is the way of the transgressor that is hard and difficult. Proverbs 13:15 says, "*The way of the transgressor is hard*." Who is the transgressor? A transgressor is someone who violates a law or a command. When people go against the commands of God given in His Holy Word, they become transgressors. We are told that way is a very hard one to endure.

The Christian life is warfare, a battle between the new nature one receives at conversion and the old nature with which a person is born with at the time of physical birth. There is a battle between the two. It is evident in the life of the Apostle Paul when he wrote in Romans 7:15-25, "For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what <mark>I hate, t</mark>hat do I. If then I do that which I would not, I consent unto the law that it is good. Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is good I find not. For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do. Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.'

We will either follow the law of God or the flesh (the old Adamic nature). That choice will result in success or failure, in life or death, or victory or defeat. How we fare in the spiritual battle we face in life will be determined by whether we cater to the flesh (the old nature) or the new nature. We partook of and received a new spiritual nature when we were saved (2 Peter 1:4).

The three foes we face are the evil world system around us, the flesh or old nature within us, and the Devil, who is our external foe. They are all formidable opponents but they are enemies that can be defeated through the power of God within us.

We need some brave Christian soldiers who will stand up and be counted in these days of compromise and apostasy. It is no time to retreat in this spiritual battle!

Our Companions "My brethren"

How extremely important our companions, our fellow saints, and soldiers are in the spiritual battle that is fiercely raging. Can you imagine going to war and fighting a major battle all alone? The enemy has many warriors, thus it gives us comfort to know that some want to stand for the Lord and serve Him as we do. We have Christian friends who help us as we seek to war good warfare for our Lord.

As a brother in Christ, we are to do several things regarding our brethren and fellow soldiers. Let's think about a few of those responsibilities.

We are to exhort. Hebrews 10:25 says, "Not forsaking the assembling of our-selves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." Since we sense the near second coming of our Lord, we should be exhorting one another. The word for exhort is the Greek N.T. word is parakalew originates from two words. The word para and kalew. The first-word para means nigh unto or near to, while kalew means to call nigh or by your side.

We are called upon to be by each other's side as we travel through this world that is unfriendly to the dedicated, devoted saints of God. The local church should be a haven for the people of God. "Exhorting" is a present participle that indicates it is an action that is to be continuing going on; it suggests continuing action.

We are to encourage. In Deuteronomy 3:28, the children of Israel were told to encourage their leaders, "encourage thou him." So many people are discouraged because of the direction our nation has taken. Since that is true of so many people, we need to assemble to encourage one another. Webster says to encourage is, "To give courage to; to give or increase the confidence of success; to inspire with courage, spirit, or strength of mind; to embolden; to animate; to incite; to inspire. How long has it been since you gave some words of encouragement to your pastor, family members, co-workers, neighbors, and others? Someone needs the encouragement you can give to them.

We are to be examples. Those who are in the local church should be a proper example for others to follow in the matter of godly living. Titus 2:7 says, "Show-

ing thyself a pattern of good works..." Younger believers should be able to live as an older saint of God and as a result, have the approval of God. I am grateful for every older, godly example the Lord has placed in my pathway through my lifetime.

Our Confidence "Be strong in the Lord"

Human strength will fail us in giving an all-out effort to be a good soldier of Jesus Christ. Jesus states in Mark 14:38, "Watch ye and pray, lest ye enter into temptation. The spirit truly is ready, but the flesh is weak." Our Lord said, "the flesh is weak." We must look beyond ourselves to find stamina and strength for the battle.

His strength is an unrivaled strength. The Lord is referred to in the Bible as the Almighty. Fifty-seven times in the Scriptures the Lord is called "the Almighty." That simply means the Lord has all power. God said to Jacob, "I am God Almighty." There is no doubt in my mind that nothing is too difficult for Him to solve. Since He is Almighty we do not have to worry about anything as long as our trust and confidence is in Him. There is an Old Testament verse that says, "Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh: is there anything too hard for me?" (Jer.32:27).

His strength is an undergirding strength. Deuteronomy 33:27 reminds us that, "The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them." When the arms that are beneath, holding up God's children are described, they are called "everlasting arms." You can do whatever you are called upon by God to do because of the strength of God's arms durable, lasting, powerful arms.

His strength is an undeniable strength. Since the Lord divided the Red Sea, making a way for Israel to cross on dry ground (Ex.14:16), it is obvious we cannot rightly deny the strength the Lord possesses. There are so many feats of what God's strength has accomplished, you cannot deny after observing the clear evidence of God's ability as revealed in the Scriptures.

Our Conquering "In the power of His might"

Our might alone is insignificant, but it is a different story when it comes to the power and might of God. The only way we can conquer is through the "power of His might." The word "might" (iscuz) is used of force. "Power" is the Greek New Testament word (kratei). It is translated in other places in the King James Version as dominion, might, and strength.

His might enables us to serve. The Apostle Paul said, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" (Phil.4:13). Through Christ, we can do what we never thought was possible for us to do. In my early years, I would never have thought I would have been a preacher of the Gospel, a Bible College president, a pastor, a radio preacher, and a writer. But, it is amazing what God can do with little when He is in it. I have done what I have done through the power of Christ that has enabled me to honor Him in many ways.

His might enables us to sing. In Psalms 59:16 the Psalmist wrote: "I will sing of thy power; yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning: for thou hast been my defense and refuge in the day of my trouble." Because of God's power and might that continually works on our behalf, we can sing when others wonder how it could be possible in our circumstances. We are not to worry because we have an Almighty God who can handle whatever would quench our song.

His might enables us to suffer. Moses made an important decision in his life when he chose—" to suffer affliction with the people of God, rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season." What moved Moses to make that choice? He was not worried about suffering because he believed God would enable Him to suffer for Him. If the Apostle Paul could suffer all he did gracefully (2 Corinthians 11:24-28), then God can surely enable us to do the same.





Fathers had been so busy—working so hard—that they suddenly realized it was too late to build a relationship with the then-grown child." (Fathers and the Empty Nest; James Dobson; July 15, 2016).

I would like to offer a few suggestions that I am trying to work through myself. First, if your children are at home, spend time with them. That work will be there tomorrow, and the lawn that needs mowing can wait. Go out and throw that baseball, sit down, and read that book, take that teenage girl shopping and out to eat. Show her how a young man should treat her. Value the trivial things saying goodnight, I love you, dinner conversations, and prayers together.

Second, provide opportunities for family gatherings. My wife does an excellent job with this. She will prepare a meal and invite everyone over to eat. When we all get together, we relive great memories and childhood adventures. Siblings laugh about who did what and "remember that time when we" and then proceed to tell a story that brings back wonderful memories. We like to take small vacations together. The larger the family gets the more difficult it becomes, but with careful planning and communication, we can usually make it happen.


Third, do not forget the "baby" of the family. If the youngest child is still at home, remember things are hard for them as well. Prepare Your Heart To Hear From God

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:" John 10:27

We don't know when God will speak directly to us, but we should prepare our hearts so that we are ready to listen at any time. We need to spiritually tune in to God's communication. So how can we tune our heart spiritually to hear more of God's voice more clearly? When our hearts and mind are not in the right place we hear incorrectly. We end up hearing what our hearts want to hear instead of what is really being told or instructed to us. We can be sure that what we think is truly God's Will and directly from God.

Put God First – At times we feel unworthy to pray, we feel we don't know Him well enough, that He won't bother with us, Or that we don't have the skills it takes to pray correctly. Other times, we are angry at what we see as injustices and hurts. These are all common feelings to us all.

We need to remember that God is much bigger than all our insecurities and doubts. Even though you may be unworthy and don't know Him as intimately as you should, even if you don't know what to say... That is how big God's love is! God is like a father, tender and compassionate to his children, although not all children have a tender and compassionate father. But you can receive God's love in your heart by the means of and through the Holy Spirit (Reference Romans 5:5). Pray to God to help you overcome these feelings, so you can hear from Him with a heart that is focused directly on Him, and not on you. Read Psalm Chapter 139. Put God First.

A Cleansed Heart – At times, the guilt of some sin may weigh us down. The Bible tells us that God does not listen to our prayers when we sin (Reference John 9:31). The only way to approach God's throne is to humbly ask for His forgiveness in the name of Jesus Christ. We should also ask the Holy Spirit to examine our hearts and convict us of any sin to which we need to confess or resolve (Reference John 16:7-8). Unless Jesus did what He came to do, there would be no Gospel, He could not remove our sins. If He did not go back to the Father the Holy Spirit would not come to us. Christ's presence on earth was limited to one place at a time. His leaving meant He could be present to the whole world through the Holy Spirit.

Three important tasks of the Holy Spirit are (1) conviction of sin and calling it to repentance. (2) Showing the standard of God's righteousness to anyone who believes. (3) Demonstrating Christ's judgment over Satan. According to Jesus, not believing in Him is sin. (Reference: John 16:9).

Your prayers are to be pleasing to God, confessing your sin, and asking the Holy Spirit to cleanse you by the blood of the Lamb. Approach God's throne and listen with a cleansed heart.

A Peaceful Heart – We are to keep our minds very still and our Spirits open to hearing from our Heavenly Father. Find a time and a place where you can remove all distractions. Block off a time in your day for a dedicated "appointment" with God. "Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth" (Psalm 46:10). Set aside the world around you, so you can hear from God with a peaceful heart.

A Trusting Heart – If we approach God's throne with our own agendas, we may miss hearing from God. If we will really listen, God will often tell or show something much bigger than what we can imagine or even plan. He may reveal Himself in ways we don't expect. Or He may remain quiet until His time is right to reveal His thoughts or plans to us. God is not limited to our views. Read Isaiah 55:8-9. Put aside your own expectations and ideas. God has the best intentions for you, so choose to listen to God with a trusting heart.

A Ready Heart – God is most pleased when we, His children, respond to His voice once He has spoken. Don't make excuses when God reveals His Will and thoughts to you. Stories are recorded in the Bible of men, women, and children of God. Our book will be made and read by God Himself! Don't be guilty of not responding to God positively when He speaks. (Read 2 Corinthians 5:10). Relinquish your self-centered attitudes at your footstool of prayer so you can hear from God with a ready heart.

God wants to communicate with His children. Christians hear from God in ways they don't expect and are blessed by being obedient to God's instruction and what they hear. God speaks to us through the Holy Spirit when reading Scripture from the Bible, a thought of someone that prompts us to pray for them, through people working around us, we are reminded to love the person but hate their sin and pray for them. We need to seek God's Will directly from God, not someone else.

Being quiet and focusing on our Savior can change the landscape of our hearts. "Be still, and know that I am God." Nothing frees our hearts like taking a few minutes to humble ourselves, confess our sins, and ask God to cleanse us. One of the most intriguing miracles of the New Testament is Jesus making His home in our hearts. Open the door of your heart. Draw near to Him for fellowship. "Be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man; that Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love," Your roots will grow down into God's love and keep you strong. (Reference: Ephesians 3:16-17).

There are ways to tend our hearts all year long. Let's make this our New Year's pledge to God.

Pour out your heart to God and tell Him how you feel. Read Psalm 34:18. You may be bearing a weary heart or maybe a long, draining year has robbed you of your strength. Whatever the case, stop a few minutes with the Shepherd of your soul to reflect on this: Read Psalm 23:2-3. Whether your heart needs to be


quieted, cleansed, healed, or renewed, God will meet that need as you draw near to Him. Set aside a few minutes each day to prepare your heart for Jesus.

How They Served Our Country—John Adams By David Streater, Ph.D. Burke County, NC

This is an American history educational moment of those who made a difference during the Revolutionary War era and how they served our Country.

John Adams was born in 1735, outside Boston, and graduated from Harvard College in 1755. He became an attorney

as he did not like teaching school. Then, Samuel Adams convinced John to become a politician opposing England's oppression and taxation on the colonists.

While Adams was a Continental Congressman, he persuaded Thomas Jefferson to author the Declaration of Independence. Adams related that, unlike himself, Jefferson was a great writer, personable, and popular. Being confrontational, Adams was known as a "principled radical." An example is Adams successfully defending British soldiers who shot into a crowd during the Boston Massacre; this made him disliked for doing the right thing.

Due to his sarcastic personality, Adams was not only a successful defense attorney and statesman, but he also had an exceptional ability to understand and resolve complex problems. These traits served Adams well in his high-level positions after the Revolution, including being the Vice-President of the United States and the second President of the United States. As President, John dealt with serious international relations and immigration issues.

Of all his accomplishments, Adams greatly cherished his off-and-on friend-ship with Thomas Jefferson, and more so, his life-long love affair with his wife, Abigail. Ironically, Adams and Jefferson died within hours of each other on July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of the United States Declaration of Independence. Could a massive new bird flu outbreak become a deadly 2022 pandemic?

There is much I should be writing about today. For example, a massive new bird flu outbreak in Israel is raising fears of another global pandemic if the virus, which causes 50 percent mortality in humans, is becoming more infectious to us. "There could be a mutation that also infects people and turns into a massive disaster," an Israeli expert warns.

Meanwhile, the global pandemic we are already facing continues to dominate the news. The omicron variant is fueling a massive surge in COVID-19 cases in the US. Flight disruptions are continuing; cities around the world are canceling New Year's Eve celebrations as hospitalizations rise with an increase in hospitalized children as well.

Why, then, would I devote today's Daily Article to a person many of you may not know beyond his name and his most famous achievement?

The death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu made global headlines Sunday evening. I mentioned his death in yesterday's Daily Article with deep gratitude for his fight against apartheid. However, I need to say much more about his life and his beliefs, since the former was so winsome while the latter has become both popular and deeply problematic in our culture.

When I heard Desmond Tutu speak Let's begin with the positive.

Desmond Tutu was born in 1931 in South Africa. A brilliant student, he obtained an honors degree from Kings College in London with a focus on Hebrew, completed a Master's degree with a focus on Islam, and studied Arabic and Greek in Jerusalem. He rose through Anglican leadership ranks to become general secretary of the South African Council of Churches, working courageously in this capacity against apartheid and receiving the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize as a result.

He was appointed Archbishop of Cape Town in 1986, serving in this role until his retirement in 1996. He remained active in social and international affairs for many years afterward.

Upon hearing of the archbishop's death, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, called Tutu a "pioneer" and said his death was "a great loss." The present Archbishop of Cape Town, Thabo Makgoba, stated: "He wanted every human being on Earth to experience the freedom, the peace, and the joy that all of us could enjoy if we truly respected one another as people created in the image of God."

While Desmond Tutu was a man of fearless courage, he couched that courage in genuine humility, winsome graciousness, and quick wit. I heard him speak in Dallas many years ago and still remember his kindness and gentle humor. I have never heard of a more likable speaker.

Church officials in South Africa are planning a weeklong send-off for the archbishop that will include a lying in state ceremony, an ecumenical service, and a requiem mass.

"I would not worship a God who is homophobic"

In 2013, Archbishop Tutu stated while campaigning for gay rights: "I would refuse to go to a homophobic heaven. No, I would say sorry, I mean I would much rather go to the other place. I would not worship a God who is homophobic." In 2015, his daughter Mpho Tutu married a woman in the Netherlands. Tutu attended and blessed the proceedings despite Anglican opposition to same-sex marriage.

In his 2010 book, Made for Goodness: And Why this Makes All the Difference, Tutu wrote: "The reality of heaven cannot tolerate the existence of hell. Even our worst enemies are God's beloved children. What kind of God could endure the sight of God's own children screaming in eternal pain?" He predicted that all people "will be drawn into heaven by the love of God. The power of evil will ultimately become unattractive, and we will yield to the beauty of heaven."

You can see how a person who experienced the horrors of apartheid might campaign so passionately for the value of every human and question the belief that any person could be separated eternally from God. In this sense, Desmond Tutu was a theologian for our times.

Our culture's insistence on tolerance of all people and their sexual "rights" has become all-consuming. For anyone to suggest that some of these "rights" are immoral is to be homophobic. The claim that Christ is the only way to heaven and

that those who reject Him will be separated from Him in hell is branded as intolerant in the extreme.

The danger of tolerance

It is therefore alluring to embrace humanity as the archbishop did, with goodnatured acceptance of all people as they are. Unsurprisingly, many are rejecting biblical orthodoxy in their claim to be "spiritual but not religious" while others are "changing their minds" about some of the essential doctrines of historic Christianity.

But is it possible for tolerance to harm the objects of tolerance? Can good parents tolerate that which injures their child? Could good friends allow their friends to persist in behavior that is injurious to them?

As cultural commentator Mary Eberstadt has clearly and powerfully documented, the rise of secularism and the so-called sexual revolution has produced six decades of "unprecedented rates of divorce, cohabitation, abortion, and fatherlessness."

She adds: "The modern diminutions of family and faith exact a civilizational toll. It's hard to believe we are better off in a world where many men will never know the joy and spiritual deepening of fatherhood; where many women reach middle age without ever having held a baby, let alone having loved and nurtured one from birth to adulthood; and where growing swaths of the population will never encounter many of the greatest treasures of the human patrimony—i.e., the art and literature and philosophy of Judeo-Christianity."

There's No One Better

I grew up in a small town and there weren't a lot of things for kids to do. One of the activities my Dad signed me up for was karate. He had been going for a few months and enjoyed it because of the good exercise, character building, and peace of mind that he could defend himself.

defend himself.

My Dad taught me an important lesson while I was in

karate: there's always someone better than you. In karate, you might work hard to advance up the levels and earn higher "degrees" of belts (green, orange, black, etc.). However, a core teaching of karate is humility and respect because no matter how good you think you are, there is always someone out there better than you. In other words, there's always someone else that can hurt you and defeat you.

But when it comes to Christ, He is the best. There is no one better, more perfect, or more amazing. No one can claim to be God-like Him. There is no one better than Jesus.

The author of Hebrews tells us that God "spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways" (Hebrews 1:1, NASB). The fathers that He's talking about here are the revered and respected forefathers of the Israelites of the Old Testament. The prophets describe the many parts of Israel's history such as their laws, institutions, ceremonies, kings, judges, and priests. Bible teacher and author J. Vernon McGee comments on Hebrews 1:1-2, "Christ is superior to all the Old Testament writers, because the revelation is filled up in Him. He fulfills all of the Old Testament, and He Himself gives God's final word to man."

The author continues saying that Christ is the "heir of all things . . . made the world" and is the "radiance" of God's "glory and the exact representation of His nature" that He "upholds all things by the word of His power" and that Christ "made purification of sins" (Hebrews 1:2-3).

Just like I was taught in karate, there is always someone better, and He is Christ!

The author of Hebrews finishes his opening remarks of his letter saying that Jesus is "*much better than the angels*" (Hebrews 1:4). The author begins this argument that Jesus is "better than" and continues throughout the rest of the thirteen chapters of this magnificent book. Hebrews describes how Jesus is better than the prophets (Hebrews 1:1-4), the angels (Hebrews 1:5-2:18), Moses (Hebrews 3:1-6), Melchizedek (Hebrews 7:1-3), the priests (Hebrews 9:1-10), and the Old Testament legendary saints (Hebrews 11:3-40).

Like my Dad taught me many years ago, there is always someone better. But when it comes to our Christian faith, no one is better than Jesus.

The Holy Spirit will reveal the secrets of the Kingdom of God; the mysteries of heaven. He will never leave us or forsake us. We can be confident that every promise of God is Yes and Amen through Christ. Last, but not least, the Holy Spirit within us is the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead. In His presence, we are infused with the confidence of our eternal destiny; our future inheritance in heaven. Do you want to experience the power of the Presence of God?

Position yourself! Get into the secret place and open your spirit, soul, and body to all that your Father desires to bestow upon you. Release anything that hinders the complete filling of the Spirit. Spending time alone at the feet of Jesus will guarantee a life that moves from glory to glory; a life that will never be the same!

There is, even more, to say about keeping



them. Keeping any plan, commitment, promise or resolution requires that we embrace with our heart what is necessary to fulfill the expectations placed upon our lives. Let's talk about that for a little while.

Every year we make promises with the fullest intention of keeping them. Maybe we're going to drop a few pounds or quit smoking or get away from immorality. Maybe we're going to get back in church or quit drinking or doing drugs. Too often you keep falling short, year in and year out. With it comes the feeling of being a failure. You let yourself down, maybe even your family, friends, or spouse. Why? Why do you fail? I have the answer, I also have some words of encouragement for you, please keep reading!

First, understand that you do not have what it takes to overcome the pitfalls of life. The pitfalls of life come from sin and within each one of us is a sin nature. Maybe you have never heard of that. Simply put we are born separated from God because of the sin of Adam and Eve. We are told in Romans 3:10 "As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one:" and again in Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God," we cannot within ourselves overcome the sin nature within us.

Second, there is a consequence or penalty that comes with sin. Every one of us is headed for this penalty. Commendeth is an old English word that simply means God shows or displays, in this case, His love. Fourth, how does Jesus remedy our sinful nature? I'm glad you ask! Your Bible tells you in Romans 10:9-10 "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. (10) For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." Simply put, confess, and believe! Confess that Jesus and only Jesus can save you. There is no other person who can take the place of Jesus Christ as your savior. You must be willing to confess that. Witnessing Begins with Prayer

Who would you like to see give their lives to Jesus this year? A family member? A friend? Or perhaps the people you work with or those who live in your community? Whoever they are, you can be a part of introducing them to Christ by committing to pray for them every day.



We often say, at EE, that witnessing without prayer is presumption. The truth is, we cannot effectively share Jesus with others unless we begin with prayer. Prayer invites the Holy Spirit to go with us and lead the conversation. He's the One who gives us the words to say. He's the One who speaks to and ultimately changes hearts. Without Him, we go alone.

There's no time better to begin praying for someone than today. You can even begin right now.

Make a list. Write down the names of people you would like to see give their hearts to Christ. Be specific. Don't just write "my family" or "my neighborhood." List them by name. If you only know their first name, that's okay. Write that down. God knows who they are.

Post it. Put it somewhere visible where you will see it. You don't have to put it somewhere where your whole family will see it, but don't hide it in the back of your Bible either. Post it where you will see every single day as a reminder to pray.

Make time to pray. Set aside a specific time each day to pray for the people on your list. Pray for them by name. Ask the Holy Spirit to work in their hearts and send believers to share the Gospel with them. Pray that God will use you! Ask Him to open doors for you to share your testimony and even introduce them to Jesus.

Look for opportunities. As you pray, look for doors that God may be opening. We often don't notice the opportunities that God is giving us to share our faith because we simply aren't paying attention.

Continue to pray. Prayer doesn't stop when a Gospel conversation begins. Continue praying before, during, and after the conversation. People rarely come to faith in Jesus Christ in a single moment in time. It's a process. It takes time. Be patient and continue to meet with the people you share with, even after they commit.

Prayer is critical in sharing our faith with others. Not only does prayer change the hearts of the people we know around us, but it also changes our hearts as well. It draws us closer to God. It helps us see the world through His eyes and heart. And, it increases our passion to reach the lost with the Good News. So, who will you start praying for today?



Raspberries and Copper Coins

"Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." (Mark 12:43-44)

The New England Holocaust Memorial was built to pay tribute to the six million killed and to honor the survivors. Located



In each tower, superimposed on the troubling lists of numbers, are brief personal statements made by selected death camp survivors. One was from Gerda Weissman Klein who was deported from Germany as a teenager and later married the U.S. Army soldier who led the troops that rescued her. "Ilse, a childhood friend of mine, once found a raspberry in the camp and carried it in her pocket all day to present to me that night on a leaf. Imagine a world in which your entire possession is one raspberry and you give it to your friend."

The context of today's passage is that of a warning Jesus gives to "beware of the scribes" (v. 38a). Why this warning? Because of their desire to be noticed and held in high esteem (they "like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets!... and for the sake of appearance say long prayers"). The scribes also made it a practice to exploit others, particularly widows ("They devour widows' houses...).

Many commentators have noted that the widow, who in her poverty gave her all, may represent the many widows whose houses have been devoured. With this in mind, Jesus simply is continuing his condemnation of the scribes, who instead of caring for widows as the law directed them to do are taking advantage of them. While this most likely is an accurate observation, it must not be overlooked that Jesus does in fact commend the sacrificial action of the widow. "For all of them [many rich people] have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had…"

John Ortberg writes, "The Lord of the Gift is very wise. He knew exactly what he was doing when he created you. He is well-pleased that you exist. He has entrusted to you everything you need to fulfill the purpose for which you were created. At the end of the day, God will not ask...What did you do with what you didn't have? Though, he will ask, What did you do with what you had? (If You Want to Walk on Water, You've Got to Get Out of the Boat, p. 43).

Prayer: Lord, thank you for the generosity seen in raspberries and copper coins, and for the example of Jesus, who thought he was rich, yet for our sakes became poor, so that by His poverty we might become rich (2 Corinthians 8:9).


Don't Shepherd Yourself

Wouldn't it be wonderful if there was one book that had proven itself over time? Wouldn't it be helpful to know people who actually testify




I know a man who continually points to a particular book, the people of the book, and, especially, the author of the book as the reason his life has turned around completely – for the better. And I have known many others to say the same.

It's Later Than It's Ever Been Before By Dr. Mark Creech

America's beloved comedian, the late Milton Berle, once told this story:

"The Emersons lived down the block from the church. At two in the morning one time, the church bells went crazy. Instead of ringing twice to denote the hour, they kept ringing. They finally stopped at the hundredth ring. Mr. Emerson nudged his wife. 'We'd better get up dear,' he said. 'It's later than it's ever been before."



Berle's words were said in jest. Nevertheless, there is a sense in which they possess a harsh reality. Here it is, and we're already on the threshold of 2022. If the truth is told, it's later than it's ever been before.

Benjamin Franklin used to say there was nothing more precious than time.

"If time be of all things the most precious, wasting time must be, as Poor Richard says, the greatest Prodigality; since, as he elsewhere tells us, lost time is never found again," said Franklin

The world, unlike ever before, seems to be swiftly moving toward an ultimate end. Jesus warned, "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:37).

What was it like during the days of Noah, before the flood of God's judgment came and destroyed the world?

In The Genesis Record, Henry Morris shared the following characteristics of that era, which is so much like our own. It's not that these types of things haven't happened throughout history, but not until lately have they happened simultaneously and with the same intensity as in Noah's day.

- Rapid advances in technology (Genesis. 4:22)
- Grossly materialistic attitudes and interests (Luke 17:28)
- Uniformitarian philosophies (Hebrews 11:7)
- Inordinate devotion to pleasure and comfort (Genesis 4:21)
- No concern for God in either belief or conduct (II Peter 2:5; Jude 15)
- Disregard for the sacredness of the marriage relation (Matthew 24:38).
- Rejection of the inspired Word of God (I Peter 3:19)
- Widespread violence (Genesis 6:11, 13)
- Corruption throughout society (Genesis 6:12)
- Preoccupation with illicit sex activity (Genesis 4:19; 6:2)
- Widespread words and thoughts of blasphemy (Jude 15)
- Promulgation of systems and movements of abnormal depravity (Genesis 6:15, 12)

"These conditions prevailed in the days of Noah and they are all rapidly growing again today," says Morris. "There is good reason, therefore, to believe that these present times are those which immediately precede the return of the Lord Jesus Christ."

But what if the coming again of Christ is still years, decades, even centuries away? Although this seems highly unlikely, even so, there still isn't much time to prepare for eternity.

In his epistle, James speaks of the brevity of life, saying, "What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes" (James 4:14).

We may deny it. We may easily dismiss it. However, one thing is sure: each of us is quickly running out of time.

In Field of Hope, Brett Butler, a former Major League Baseball centerfielder for the L.A.

Dodgers and current outfield coach for the Miami Marlins, tells about sharing his faith in Christ with a fellow ballplayer.

"It's time to get your life in order," Brett told his friend. "You should turn your life over to Christ."

The ballplayer responded he knew that Brett was right, but added, "Brett, I'm only thirty-one years old. I've got my whole life in front of me. Maybe I'll do that later. I'm going to enjoy life first."

A few months later, Brett heard about a boating accident that took the life of two ballplayers. One of them was the one with whom he had shared the Gospel. The same person who had put off that decision and said, "I've got my whole life in front of me. Maybe, I'll do that later"

It's almost always later than we think.

In If the Dead Could Speak, Paul Powell talks about an insurance company that produced an intriguing commercial that pictured a couple in their easy chairs, talking. It's Christmas time, and the wife asks the husband, "Honey, have you taken care of our insurance yet?"

The husband responds, "No, but I'll do it after Christmas."

The next scene shows the same two people in the same room. A view through the window shows the flowers and trees blooming. So, it's obviously Springtime. The wife asks, "Honey, have you taken care of our insurance yet?"

"No," he answers, "I'll take care of it just as soon as I pay our income tax."

The next scene shows the same people in the same room a third time. This time the setting is Summer. The wife again addresses her husband, "Honey, have you taken care of the insurance yet?"

"No," he responds, "I'll take care of it as soon as we get back from vacation."

The final scene shows the same room and chairs except now; only the wife is there. The husband's chair is empty. The husband has died. Through the window, the snow can be seen falling. And then a voice says, "You may not run out of excuses, but you will run out of time."

There is no good excuse for not turning to Christ. The year 2022 is upon us, and time is running out. It's high time to make matters right with God. When it's high time, there's no time to spare. The Scriptures admonish, "Now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation." (2 Corinthians 6:2). Now is the only time promised to any of us.

Won't you turn away from your sins and receive Christ by faith as your Savior and Lord today? When you're out of time, you're out. And it's later than it's ever been before.

New Dimensions School

January is School Board Appreciation Month, and the New Dimensions Charter School wants to say, "thank you" to all our board members who do so much for our school. New Dimensions is represented by eleven dedicated board members who devote countless hours to make sure our students are served in the best way possible. Chair Regina Rhodes, Vice-Chair Jamie Smith,



Secretary Shanna Wall, Treasurer David Martin, Pamela Harrison, Tracy Jones, Dorie Evans, Casey Kinard (ex-officio member), Chris Beam, Laura Gratton, and Isaac Crouch are true advocates for the students of New Dimensions, developing policies and making decisions that help shape the future of our school. Our school board oversees more than 470 students, 67 employees, and an annual budget of over \$4,000,000. I am proud to work with our board, and I congratulate them on their excellent leadership and vision for the students of New Dimensions.

I also want to remind our school community of the anonymous tip line, Say Something, that our middle school students and staff currently have available to them. New Dimensions joins schools around the nation in users of this program. Say Something is a school safety program for students – developed by Sandy Hook Promise – that enables students to anonymously report tips about school safety concerns via a mobile app along with a phone call. The tips will be received by school administrators and law enforcement, who will respond appropriately based on the type of tip.

We want to be sure our students have a voice when it comes to feeling safe at school, and that's why we are a part of this program. This app gives students the ability to remain anonymous while reporting instances of bullying or fighting involving themselves or others, or if they've seen a weapon at school, with assurances that their tip will be seen and investigated. The Say Something mobile app allows users (who can include students, teachers, and parents) to provide tips in categories that include bullying, illegal drug and alcohol use, fighting, weapons, and a report category for all other types of tips. Students can submit digital photos or videos along with text information from their cell phones directly to the school administrative team and school resource officer. The app allows students, if they choose, to bookmark a tip so that they can follow up on the status of their tip, or anonymously text back and forth with administrators to provide additional information. Additionally, if a student has a suicide or mental health concern, they can reach out to trained professionals by using the app. The app is available for download from the Android Marketplace and the Apple App Store.

Open enrollment at New Dimensions begins on Monday, January 3, and ends on Thursday, March 31 at 4 p.m. Applications for the upcoming year will be posted on our website and will be available at the school beginning on January 3. Virtual tours will be developed and posted in January. Just give us a call (828-437-5753) or email me at dburleson@ndschool.org if you have questions about our school.

At the end of the enrollment period, it will be determined if there are more applications than spaces available for each grade. If the number of applicants for a particular grade does not exceed the number of available spaces for that grade level, all students who have applied by the deadline will be accepted. If the number of applicants for a particular grade level exceeds available spaces for that grade level, a lottery system will determine admission eligibility. The lottery for New Dimensions will be held on Friday, April 1. The time will be determined. Students who are not offered enrollment will be placed on a waitlist. After all spaces for a grade level are filled, the lottery will continue until all applying students have been assigned a priority number on the wait list. The wait list will not carry into the next school year.

As parents and guardians, the decision about where our children go to school is an important one. With the availability of charter schools, parents and guardians have more choices about their child's education than ever before. To make the most appropriate decision for our children, it is important to have all the facts. Here are some important facts about New Dimensions.

New Dimensions is a North Carolina Public Charter School. Many of you may still wonder "What is a public charter school and how are they different from the traditional public schools?". Charter schools are public schools of choice that are authorized by the State Board of Education and operated by independent, non-profit boards of directors. State and local tax dollars are the primary funding sources for charter schools, which have open enrollment and cannot discriminate in admissions, associate with any religion or religious group, or charge tuition. Charter schools operate with freedom from many of the regulations that govern district schools, but charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system.

What makes New Dimensions special?



A poll conducted by the Center for Excellence in Polling revealed that the vast majority of likely voters surveyed oppose the use of private money from individuals, corporations, and special interest groups in the operation of elections. During the 2020 election, Mark Zuckerberg and his wife donated \$350 million to the Center for Technology and Civic Life intending to help manage elections across the country. Carolina Journal recently reported that \$4.3 million of these "Zuckerbucks" went to 34 North Carolina cities and counties, in addition to a \$1 million grant to the state board of elections.

To address the problem of outside money influencing elections in our state, I sponsored SB 725 - Prohibit Private Money in Elections Admin. This bill would have prohibited the State Board of Elections, county boards of elections, and county boards of commissioners from accepting private monetary donations, directly or indirectly, for conducting elections or employing individuals temporarily. This bill passed the Senate and the House in November and was presented to Gov. Roy Cooper on December 1. However, Gov. Cooper vetoed this common-sense measure on December 9.

I believe one of the most fundamental roles of government is to ensure elections are carried out effectively and securely, and that a cornerstone of our system of government – counting votes – isn't being run by outside interests. You can be sure that I will continue to look for reasonable, sound solutions to ensure voters have every confidence in our elections. Voters deserve to know that their elections are being administered fairly and securely, without the interference of outside money. Out-of-state billionaires should not be able to come in and finance aspects of our elections systems.

The Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP) is designed for small and mid-size employers that have established, implemented, and maintained exceptional workplace safety standards. SHARP is run by our Consultative Services Bureau and is one of the most elite safety awards presented by our department. Last month, I had the honor of visiting two SHARP-certified companies. Daniels and Daniels Construction Co., headquartered in Goldsboro, has participated in SHARP since 2016. For the 23rd consecutive year, NCDOL hosted a toy drive in December benefiting the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation. The effort grows each year, and our regional offices in Raleigh, Charlotte, Asheville, Winston-Salem, and Wilmington participate by donating toys and financial contributions. This year's collection event was the most successful ever, as we collected 1,296 toys and raised \$5,985 in additional monetary donations. It warms my heart to witness the generosity of our employees and to think of the hundreds of children who wake up on Christmas morning with new toys under the tree.

NC 11th Congressional District

The House of Representatives just finished its last full week of votes for the year. After my first year of serving Western North Carolina, my team and I are proud of the work we have done for the district. We have passed language expanding broadband, defending our veterans, and expanding educational opportunities throughout the country. There are still mountains of work to conquer next year and beyond and I appreciate every last one of you for following me throughout my congressional journey.

The NDAA is a series of United States federal laws specifying the annual budget for the United States Department of Defense, ensuring our troops have the training, equipment, and resources they need to carry out their missions. As you are aware, the U.S. is in global competition with China and Russia. It is imperative that we fund our military accordingly. The interconnected nature of our competition with these countries must drive how the U.S. government resources, modernize, and transform its tools to maintain leadership on the world stage.

The National Defense Authorization Act is supposed to be a largely bipartisan piece of legislation. Uniting behind the defense of the United States, Republicans and Democrats often come together on the House floor to pass this legislation into law. However, this year, the original draft of the NDAA included egregious provisions like red flag laws, draft our daughters' language, and dishonorable discharges for military members who refuse to take the COVID vaccine. It was disappointing that Democrats would choose to inject their agenda items into a bill that normally passes with large bipartisan support. However, after speaking with Republicans in the Senate, I along with many of my colleagues knew the language would be stripped out of the legislation once the House passed the bill to the other chamber. Voting for the bill to go to the Senate was not an endorsement of those radical priorities – it was a legislative procedure to allow for those provisions to be removed. Once that language was stripped out, it would return to the House of Representatives for final consideration.

There were several good provisions in the NDAA too, provisions that would be left in the bill when it returned to the House of Representatives for final passage. These provisions included a pay raise for our troops, a ban on dishonorable discharges for service-members who choose not to take the COVID vaccine, and funding for the National Guard to defeat the immigration crisis on our southern border. It also included over 20 provisions to hold the Biden Administration accountable for its disastrous withdrawal from Afghanistan.

I made a promise that I would fight to ensure the egregious language was removed from the final bill while keeping intact the good provisions that benefited our extraordinary servicemembers and built up our military.

This past week, I voted for the final passage on the NDAA. This final version of the bill funds our military, gives troops a raise, bans dishonorable discharges over vaccine mandates, and has NO red flag law language, NO draft our daughters language, and NO funding for purging patriots in the military. Promises made, promises kept. All language in the NDAA that included red flag laws, drafting American women into the Armed Forces and dishonorable discharges over vaccine mandates were removed from the final text of the bill.

The 2020 elections shook the confidence of many in the integrity of America's voting system. From voter fraud to private money donations to targeted local elections boards, to foreign and big tech influence through social media and cyber spyware, it seems clear that "One person, one vote," a concept so essential to our democracy, is at risk. That is all the more true when one person casting one vote is understood as one "eligible" voter casting one "legal" vote. In response to these concerns, Republicans in North Carolina 's legislature passed legislation to make North Carolina's election process more sound and secure. Unfortunately, Democratic Governor Cooper is opposed.

Sadly, Governor Cooper vetoed two election bills approved by the Republican-led legislature that would have helped strengthen the integrity of North Carolina's election process. For starters, the governor vetoed Senate Bill 362 that would have made mail-in ballots more secure. That bill provided that mailed or absentee ballots, other than military or overseas ballots, must be in the hands of county boards of elections no later than the time polls close on election day. Without this legislation in place, mail-in ballots can be received up to three days after the election and still be counted. Such a time lag keeps an election in limbo and allows more time for fraudulent activities intended to change the outcome of the election after preliminary totals become known on election night. In other words, those who would commit fraud know how many more votes they need for their candidate to win even though behind in the election-night totals. Cooper obviously prefers to keep the election open for more votes to come in later than everyone else's.

Governor Cooper also vetoed a second bill that would have prohibited the State Board of Elections, county boards of elections, and county commissioners from accepting private monetary donations to run elections. In 2020, for example, according to the NC State Board of Elections, just over 7 million dollars was distributed to a select 30 of our 100 local boards of elections by a California group that had received \$250 million from a Zuckerberg foundation to distribute to select local boards of elections nationwide. This California group chose the 30 counties to receive its funding. Can you imagine the outrage if a Republican-allied group had pumped \$\$7 million into its chosen North Carolina counties for the 2020 elections? Surely, we should all agree that it is completely wrong to allow private money funding to county boards of elections targeted by the private donor for conducting a particular election. North Carolinians should not fear that private donors, by such huge sums, are attempting to determine election outcomes in our state. Again, sadly, Governor Cooper's veto says that he is okay with such money being used to influence our elections.

Because of the abuse, I had experienced throughout childhood, I was insecure, angry, and didn't trust anyone. But once I started seriously studying God's Word, I came to realize that He didn't want me to live this way. I could be healed and whole in my mind and emotions, and I could learn how to really enjoy my everyday life.

Now, when I say God wanted me to enjoy my everyday life, I'm talking about doing ordinary life with calm delight and a smile on my face (see John 15:11). It's about not dreading the daily responsibilities you have to do whether you like it or not, things like cleaning the house, mowing the grass, going to work, and the list goes on and on. And it's not a "working for the weekend" mentality or an attitude that says "I'll be happy when...I get to go on vacation" or "the kids are back in school" or "I get that promotion" and so on.

It seems today that most people believe they have to wait for their circumstances to change before they can enjoy life. But the truth is you can make the decision to enjoy your ordinary life and make it extraordinary, regardless of your circumstances.

Doing Life with God

One of the ways you can take ordinary life and make it extraordinary is to learn to do every single thing you do with and for God. We make a mistake when we separate our sacred life from our secular life. We can be just as close to God in the grocery store as we are at church. And He wants us to do everything we need to do WITH Him.

It actually adds an edge of excitement when we let God be involved in everything we do. He's everywhere, all the time, and He's just as interested in the routine, mundane tasks of our lives as He is in the more "spiritual" things we do.

It's amazing to realize that God wants to have fellowship with us—He wants to spend each day with us. Don't just settle for seeking Him once a week at church or when you're in a desperate situation. Decide that you are going to enjoy your everyday relationship with God!

The Truth About Real Joy

The abundant life Christ offers goes deeper in our hearts than the way we feel about things. It's an amazing thing when we learn how to have the peace and joy only God can give in every area of our lives, instead of the type of enjoyment that's just based on emotional excitement.

The joy of the Lord is much greater than simply feeling happy. It brings peace and contentment to your soul, even when your circumstances are difficult and don't make any sense. Nehemiah 8:10 says, "The joy of the Lord is your strength."

This kind of joy makes the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday routine enjoyable. And since most of life is Monday through Friday, we need to enjoy it!

The World Can't Give It to You

In John 15:11 (NIV), Jesus says, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." The Amplified translation says " that your joy and gladness may be of full measure and complete and overflowing." In the ten verses leading up to this one, Jesus is talking about abiding in Him, because that's the key to living with His joy.

Abiding means "to live, dwell and remain in"; it's not just visiting once a week at church. It's having a personal relationship with Christ, being one with Him, and doing life together. The truth is apart from Jesus, we can do nothing of real value, but with Him, we can bear much good fruit (John 15:5).

God wants to abide with you every day, throughout the day. He doesn't just want you to seek Him when you go to church or when you're desperate. He desires to have a personal relationship with you, so you can experience His presence in everything you do. That's when your everyday life is really enjoyable!



A Pastor's View

Psalm 23:5 "The Ruts of Righteousness"

Steve Jobs, the founder of the Apple computer company, was not a Christian, as some of you may know, but there are really powerful lessons, both good and bad, from his life that we can profit from. One thing he said that was very thought-provoking: that in the first half of your life, you make your habits — then in the second part of your life, your habits make YOU!



Psalm 23 is one of the best-loved passages in the Bible, as it talks about how the Lord shepherds us. But verse 5 of the Psalm has an interesting turn of phrase that can challenge us as we begin a new year this month. David says there that the Lord "leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake." That is a very familiar phrase to many of us, but it also has a deep meaning to it.

The word "paths" here, according to the venerable Brown/Driver/Briggs Hebrew lexicon, means "wagon tracks", the place where the wagons have gone before, leaving their hard, beaten-down path — we might well call them "ruts"! Many of us have been on an old dirt country road, where there were just "ruts" worn in the dirt from the cars driving on it over and over.

We often speak of "being in a rut" as a bad thing — and it can be, for sure. But the Bible shows us here that there are also some good "ruts" we can be in. When David says: "He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake," he's talking about "good ruts." Let's think about some of the good "ruts of righteousness" for a few minutes:

I. it's good to be in the "rut" of sound doctrine.

Paul repeatedly tells Timothy in II Timothy that he needs to stay in "the ruts" of the sound doctrine he has been taught:

— He says in 1:13 "Retain the standard of sound words which you have heard from me ...". He tells him in the next verse: "Guard, through the Holy Spirit who dwells in us, the treasure which has been entrusted to you."

He says, Timothy, the doctrine you have received is a treasure. Keep it. He tells him that repeatedly in this book: he says in 3:14, "You, however, continue in the things you have learned and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have learned them, and that from childhood you have known the sacred writings ..." (the Bible) and he goes on to say, "All scripture is inspired by God

So he keeps telling him: "Retain" those doctrinal standards I taught you. "Continue" in the scriptural teachings I gave you. He's telling Timothy, STAY in "the wagon tracks," the "ruts" of righteousness in your doctrine.

And that's a good word for us today, too. We must stay in the "ruts" of the true, Biblical doctrine we have been taught. As I mentioned before, our society values "creativity" and "innovation," and Americans especially want what is "newest and best": the newest and best phone; the newest and best car, and so on. But when it comes to Biblical doctrine, what is new is NOT best! There's an old saying: if you come up with some "new insight" from the Bible, after 2000 years of people reading it and studying it and teaching it, you can be pretty sure that the new insight you have, is a WRONG insight!

I remember years ago when televangelist Benny Hinn made a big splash on a religious to show, saying that God had told him that not only was there a Trinity, consisting of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but he said, "there are actually nine of them": that each member of the Trinity also had a trinity — and then he proudly said something like: "I bet you haven't heard that before!" NO; no one had ever heard that before — because it was WRONG! The Bible doesn't teach that at all, and what he claimed was a "divine revelation" was actually a heresy. (And to his credit, in later years I understand he was confronted about this, and he corrected his error.)

But this is just an example: when it comes to theology, "new" is not good. I understand we like new things: new songs, new movies, new books, and so on — and sometimes it can be tempting for us to want something new in our Bible teaching and doctrine as well. Something may sound "new and exciting" to you when you hear it — but be careful of that. New is not good when it comes to theology. Stay in "the wagon tracks of righteousness," in "the ruts of righteousness" when it comes to your doctrine.

II. It's good to be in some "ruts" for daily prayer and Bible study.

— Jesus said in Matthew 4:4 that "man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." We need God's word more than we do our daily food.

— Colossians 4:2 says "Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it."

Getting into God's word and prayer every day is one of THE most important habits we can get into in our lives. We need to get in that "rut" and STAY in it! God will speak to us if we will present ourselves before Him in His word; He will fill us with His Holy Spirit and pour out His power and answer prayers if we will pray — but He won't do these things if we do not. We've got to get in, and stay in, the "ruts of righteousness" in God's word and prayer.

My wife Cheryl has one of THE most consistent Bible reading and prayer times of anybody I have ever known. And our kids have seen that. One day when he was very young, our son Michael toddled into the living room where I was sitting, and for some reason pointed to the blue chair in the living room and said "That's where Mama reads her Bible." He knew that was her habit, her routine, her "rut" — a GOOD rut!

One of THE best "ruts" you can be in is the "rut" of meeting God every day in His word and prayer. Make sure you stay in that "rut" in 2022!

III. There are many OTHER "ruts of righteousness":

A. It's good to be in the "rut" of going to church.

Hebrews 10:25 says we are not to forsake our assembling together, as is the habit of some. That verse says that some people have gotten into the "habit," the "rut" of not attending worship with other believers.

We're seeing that in America today. I read one survey some time ago that said that the decline in church attendance is not because so many fewer people are attending — in fact, it said the total number of people who attend church is roughly the same as it has always been. But it said the difference is that the people who DO attend church, are attending less regularly than they used to. Maybe they used to go 3 or 4 times a month, but now it is only 1 or 2. Add that up over millions of people and that's a lot of empty spaces in churches. And of course, COVID over the past couple of years has complicated that too.

And I understand taking reasonable precautions; we've said repeatedly we need to let people make the decisions they feel led by God to make in their response to COVID, and don't judge others about it. But IN all that, let's be sure we don't get out of the "rut" of going to church. And I'm afraid that HAS happened, all over the country.

It is so important that we stay in that "rut" of going to church. We need it personally, and those we worship with need it from us a well. Hebrews 10:25 goes on to say, don't forsake your assembling like some do, "but ENCOURAGE one another" — it says you need to go to church, both to be encouraged — AND to encourage other people. It's not just about YOU: it encourages OTHER people when they see you there in church. And consequently, it can DIScourage other people when they do NOT see you there. It's just such an important "rut" to be in, of attending church regularly. I hope we will all make it our goal to be in the "good rut" of going to church every Sunday morning.

B. It's good to be in a "rut" of tithing and giving to the Lord.

Proverbs 3:9 says "Honor the LORD from your wealth, And from the first of all your produce." Taking the first 10% of what God gives you, and giving that back to Him, is a really good "rut" to be in.

One of our sons is in his first year in a new job, and he is in the process of learning to budget and spend his money. I was thrilled the other day when he called to check in with Cheryl & me (which is another good "rut of righteousness" for kids to be in by the way!), and along the way, he mentioned that he had set an automatic payment to be made to his church from his paycheck every month. I was excited to hear that. It is so easy NOT to give to the Lord, so it is great if you can get into a "good rut" in it, whether it is an automatic payment like he did, or just the habit of making out your first check every month to the Lord to show that He is first, or however you want to do it. But there is a great blessing in being in the "rut" of tithing and giving to the Lord.

C. It's good to be in the "rut" of family time

Ephesians 5 says, "Husbands, love your wives." Someone said you spell love, "T.I.M.E." Quality time means time. One of the best things Cheryl & I committed to when we first began ministry was to set aside Fridays to spend together. Sometimes people will say something like, "I know Friday is your day off Bro. Shawn," and Cheryl will say, "Uh-uh, it's not his day off, it's his FAMILY day." I don't go off and play golf by myself on Fridays, we go and do something and spend time together that day. We need that.

But this isn't just for pastors. Every marriage needs this. You need to keep "dating" your spouse. You need to have regular, consistent time that you spend together.

Let me say this: in all my years as a pastor, in talking with various couples about difficulties in their marriages, I have never yet talked to a single couple who was having problems, who said that they had set aside a regular time to date or spend together. I think that says a lot. Get in the "rut" of spending time regularly with your spouse. It's one the best "ruts" you can be in.

And we could go on and on with examples and applications. There are lots of "good ruts" we can get in. Ask God's Spirit to show you some of the "good ruts" you need to get into this year.

IV. Getting BACK into a "rut of righteousness"

But let me add this: what happens if you DO get out of a good rut? What should you do? Get back in! You were in that "rut" once and you got out of it — well with God's help you can get back in it again too. God's Spirit will help you do that.

Several years back I started translating a verse in Psalms every day from the Hebrew Bible, just one verse, but I did it every day, and over time this took me about a third of the way through the Book of Psalms. I remember I even said something about it to someone: "This is one of the best habits I ever got into!", and it was.

But you know — and this is another good lesson for us — it only takes ONE day that you miss, to begin to stop a habit. And then you add just another day, then just another day — and soon you don't have that habit anymore. You're "out of the rut." And that's what happened to me with translating those Psalms. I don't even know when it happened, but I do remember that one day I looked up and thought: "Hey, I'm not translating a verse in Hebrew from Psalms every day anymore!" I couldn't recall the particular moment it happened, but one day it did — and then it became the next and the next, and I got out of the "rut" and routine of doing it, and I was out of that really good "rut" for probably a couple of years I guess. Then this last year I thought: "You know, translating those verses in Psalms was one of the best things I ever did. I need to get back to doing that again." And so one day last year I started it up again. And I am enjoying it so much every day; it is so rich. But the thing is, I had gotten OUT of that "rut of righteousness," but





The New Order

norance is that we attempt to interpret the last fourth of the Bible-Matthew-Revelation—in a vacuum. It is impossible to understand the part many call the "new testament" without knowing the patterns and procedures established in Torah.

Christians tend to think of the Temple rituals and sacrifices as "Jewish" worship. "Judah," the source of the word "Jew," was one of Twelve Tribes of Israel. The Levitical Priesthood led worship for all Israelites. Priests had to be members of the Tribe of Levi and the Clan of Aaron. Any direct descendant of Aaron could serve as priest, but the High Priesthood was intended to pass from father to son in unbroken line beginning with Aaron.

Decades before the incarnation, Rome turned the High Priesthood into a political appointment. Both of the men mentioned as holders of that office in the Gospel accounts, Annas and Caiaphas, were Roman appointees. Political appointment always results in political obligation. These men were not charged with leading in worship or fulfilling their Torah-specified role of mediating between sinful mankind and Holy God. Their job was to maintain political stability. As long as they did so, Rome allowed them to use both the priesthood and the Temple for personal

The Bible does not state that John the Immerser was the legitimate High Priest at the beginning of Jesus' ministry, but he held appropriate credentials. He was of the tribe of Levi. Both his parents were direct descendants of Aaron. He was so significant to God's plan that his birth was announced by the Angel Gabriel. Gabriel also foretold that John would minister in the power and spirit of Elijah. (Luke 1:17) Elijah was the undisputed head of the priests. In contrast to Rome's appointed High Priests, John was both righteous and filled with God's Spirit from the womb. The strongest Biblical evidence that John was the true High Priest is the fact that Jesus asked him to perform a necessary High Priestly duty.

Since few modern Christians understand the role of immersion in the salvation process, most also fail to recognize the significance of Jesus' baptism. The Bible does not teach that water immersion is optional or merely symbolic. Instead, it makes an ironclad case that water immersion is required. In Mark 16:16, Jesus says that whoever believes and is immersed will be saved. In Acts 2:38, Peter states that water immersion is necessary for the forgiveness of sins and receiving the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. In Acts 22:16, Ananias urged Paul to immediately be immersed to wash away his sins. In Romans 6:3-4, Paul states that through immersion we are joined to Christ and to His death. In Galatians 3:27, Paul says that only those who have been immersed into Christ are joined to Him. In 1 Peter 3:21, the Apostle states flatly that immersion saves us. Every conversion detailed in Acts includes immediate baptism. Numerous, man-made doctrines claim that water immersion is not required for salvation, but they ignore clear, Biblical teaching.

Jesus did not need forgiveness. He was immersed because He is our pattern. We who claim to love and serve Him must follow His example in all things. 1 John 3:6 says, "Whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked." John protested when Jesus requested baptism. Jesus responded that His immersion was necessary to "fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). It is no accident that the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus immediately after His immersion. This is God's pattern.

In addition to showing us what we should do, Jesus' immersion had a second

The Book of Hebrews is focused on the corruption of the Levitical Priesthood. Part of the glorious message of that book is that we now have a High Priest who can "sympathize with our weaknesses" because He "has been tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Hebrews 4:14-15). The High Priesthood was a crucial office established in Torah. He alone could enter the Holy of Holies on the Day of Atonement to sprinkle the blood of an animal sacrifice on the Ark of the Covenant. This action foreshadowed the work of Messiah in offering His own blood—the only perfect sacrifice—on our behalf. Because of His "obedience unto death," Jesus qualified as a new type of High Priest, not following the line of Aaron, but in the order of Melchizedek. Discussion of that Order requires separate treatment.

Before Aaron became High Priest, Moses served as the mediator between God and Man. Leviticus chapter eight details the process by which Aaron and his sons were ordained to the priesthood. Verse six says, "And Moses brought Aaron and his sons and washed them with water." From that time, the serving High Priest washed those who were being installed as priests. By immersing Jesus, John fulfilled this High Priestly role.

One of the clear lessons of Scripture is those sinful humans cannot approach Holy God without a mediator. Jesus now administers a High Priesthood that can never be corrupted. Under His leadership, every believer is a priest with direct access to Messiah. This is true "freedom in Christ." That freedom, however, does not convey a license to sin so that "grace may abound." He calls us to "hunger and thirst after righteousness" and to offer our bodies as "living sacrifices." If we love Him, we will yearn to follow His commandments (John 14:15). Those commandments are found in Genesis through Deuteronomy.
