A Pastor's View

"Your Response To Christmas"

A kindergartener in England once commented on the wise men's visit to Jesus: he said they brought Him gold "but Legos would have been better"!

Matthew 2 doesn't tell us how many "wise men" (magi) there were. But it does show us three distinct responses people then had to the birth of Jesus, which people still have today. Which one of these reflects YOUR response to Christmas?

I. The Intellectual Response

:4 says when Herod heard about Jesus' birth, he asked the Jewish religious leaders where the Messiah was to be born. "They said to him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for this is what has been written by the prophet ..." These men knew this prophecy. Many Pharisees had the entire Law memorized. They KNEW the right answers — but that didn't mean that they responded rightly to the birth of Jesus. There is NO indication they ever went to Bethlehem to worship Him. Knowing the right answers was as far as it went.

Many "lifelong church members" today fall short in this same way. It's easy to think you're right with God because you know some "right answers" about the Bible. But James 2 says even demons know there is one God — but they aren't saved by that knowledge.

Knowing mere facts alone won't save you. Just because you can quote John 3:16 doesn't mean you are saved. Just because you know this Christmas story doesn't mean you are going to heaven. You can "know" all the right things and still be lost. It's been said many people will miss heaven by 18 inches -- the distance from the head to the heart! The most important question for you today is not "do you know the right things about the birth of Jesus", but have you personally repented of your sins and trusted Jesus' death on the cross to save YOU? — and are you now worshipping and serving Him? Make sure that you have more than just a mere "intellectual response" to Jesus this Christmas.

II. Herod's Hypocritical Response

In:8 King Herod said, "Go and search carefully for the Child; and when you have found Him, report to me, so that I too may come and worship Him." He made it sound like he really wanted to worship Jesus. But in reality, he had something very sinister in mind. :16 relates how later, Herod killed all the male children in and around Bethlehem. He had a selfish end in mind: to solidify his hold on the throne. His outward "worship" was hypocritical.

We can be like Herod today, and put up a facade of "worship," when we're actually more concerned with our own personal "agendas" than really worshiping God.

Cheryl & I were once at a party where we met a politician. I asked where he went to church. He told me, and then said: "You have to go to church to get elected to anything in this town." That spoke volumes! He wasn't as concerned about going to church to worship, as he was to get votes!

Ask yourself: "Why am I really in church?": to worship Jesus -- or for some personal agenda, such as to cultivate votes or business customers? Make sure you don't have the "hypocritical response" of Herod.

III. The Worshipful Response of the Magi

We don't know much about the magi, but one thing we DO know: they truly came to worship Jesus. We see several pieces of evidence of that:

A. JOY:10 says: "When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy" — literally "MEGA joy"! Joy is from the heart, which is essential for true worship. Jesus said in John 4, "Those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

Think about something you really enjoy: your grandkids, football, hunting, etc. No one has to "make" you do these things; you "delight" in them. That's how genuine religion is. When you truly love God, worship is NOT something you "have" to do; it is something you WANT to do. Real worship must begin in the heart. Are you just "going through the motions" at church, or worshipping from your heart?

B. HUMILITY Verse 11 continues: "And they fell to the ground and worshipped Him." The Bible's word for "worship" literally means to bow down and "kiss continued on page 24

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the very Spirit of God, fully divine, manifested in the life of every believer from the moment of salvation. He is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His daily control.

(2 Corinthians 3:17; John 16:7-13; 14:16-17; Acts 1:8; 1 Corinthians 2:12; 3:16; Ephesians 1:13; Galatians 5:25; Ephesians 5:18)

The Bibl

The Bible is the divinely inspired, authoritative, infallible, living and active Word of God to all men. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the ultimate source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. In it we find a guideline for right relationship with God and God's creation, and a blueprint for personal, emotional, and spiritual growth.

(2 Timothy 1:13; 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:2-21; Psalm 119:105, 160; 12:6; Proverbs 30:5)

Humanity

Humanity is designed and made by God in His image. We have been created as cognitive, moral, ethical, and physical beings and have been equipped by God for both relationship with Him and with one another. Both male and female are gifted by the Creator with characteristics which equip them for the purpose for which they have been created: relationship, dominion, and responsibility. Although God designed us to have fellowship with Him, we became alienated from God through disobedience. As a result, all human beings are born with a sinful nature and choose to sin against God. We are incapable of regaining a right relationship with God through our own efforts.

Eternity & Eternal Security

Our soul, the essence of our being, was created by God to exist forever. That forever is spent in one of two places: eternally present and in union with God because of His forgiveness and salvation or eternally separated from God because of sin and unbelief. At the moment that our physical body dies, those who are saved are immediately taken to heaven. Those who have rejected God's gift of salvation will spend eternity separated from God in hell. Because God gives man eternal life through Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and eternal power of God that gives this security. (John 3:16; 5:11-13, 10:29; 1 John 2:25; Romans 6:23; Revelation 20:15; 2 Timothy 1:12; Hebrews 7:25; 10:10-14; 1 Peter 1:3-5)

Salvation

Salvation is God's gift of redemption and reconciliation to Himself and is offered freely to all who accept, by faith alone, Jesus Christ as God's only son and receive Him as Lord and Savior. We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.

Marlene's Meditations

Anger's Achille's Heel

The air crackled with his fury as she quickly swung herself off the animal and knelt. His stare stabbed her calm, almost cracking her resolve to speak. Their swords drawn, his soldiers hesitated, stunned by the beautiful woman, alone, talking softly to their leader. They could see the tension slide away from his shoulders as she lay



prone on the rocky ground, completely vulnerable. Their swords jostling against their sides, they edged closer, listening to her quiet words as she filled their ears with her musical lilt. The miracle happening before them halted them in their tracks, horses snorting softly, the surrounding breeze and swaying green grasses slowly registering in their minds. They were frankly nervous because their leader raged out of control, and they had never experienced his anger at this level.

Curious, their gazes turned to her donkeys munching tender shoots close by. Abigail's servants had slipped the mounds of food from their backs, and the soldiers' mouths watered at the prospect of the preliminary gift that would curb their stark hunger.

Each soldier hoped for the best—food for their bellies and peace. They listened carefully, watching the interplay and praying for a solution to the standoff.

Her words slipped around his anger and gradually returned him to rational thinking as she reminded him of his royal destiny.

Diverting anger requires humility, wisdom, and quiet gentleness. In the story above, told in 1 Samuel 25, we discover how Abigail helps the future King David to avoid a fatal mistake while angry. David asked Abigail's husband, Nabal, for any food he could spare for his hungry soldiers in reciprocity for guarding Nabal's 3,000 sheep. Nabal responded by insulting David's young men, treating them churlishly, and sneering at their kindness and generosity. His narcissistic cruelty enraged David, who promised to kill Nabal and all his men. Abigail's servant told her about the crisis, and she hastily instructed them to pack several donkeys with a token supply of food—what David had requested. She rushed to meet David and his 400 soldiers as he raced to Nabal's encampment for revenge.

Why did David swear to kill dozens of men rather than simply take the food that was rightfully his? David's 600 trained men probably outnumbered Nabal's untrained servants. But, anger out of control demands more, doesn't it? David could have polluted the water or scared the sheep and made them run. He could have burned the wool or stolen it. David could also have Negotiations with the shepherds directly was an option. He could have lured Nabal's servants away or asked Abigail to intervene, but he reacted to Nabal's goading.

Abigail influenced David to change his beliefs about Nabal's rejection, thus enabling him to look beyond Nabal's evil and return to cognitive tasks. According to famed researcher Albert Ellis, "You don't get frustrated because of events, you get frustrated because of your beliefs." When Abigail helped David to look beyond Nabal's evil, she changed his beliefs about the crisis. She helped David to look beyond Nabal's temporary thwarting and dismissal of his anointing to a time when God's will would prevail. She demonstrated the truth of what modern behavioral research has discovered.

"Research suggests it is because both cognitive tasks and emotional responses make use of the same limited mental resources. That is, the resources that are used to perform a cognitive task are no longer available for emotional processes. Accordingly, people can rid themselves of unwanted feelings by engaging in a cognitive activity, such as doing math equations or playing a game of Tetris." How did Abigail redirect David's thinking to cognitive tasks? She asked him to accept her gifts, a practical cognitive task. (1 Samuel 25:27) She asked him to remember her, not Nabal, a task requiring brain power. (1 Samuel 25:31) And she reminded him to continue to work with the Lord in His plan to make David's house a "sure" house, choosing action over emotive reaction. (1 Samuel 25:28) Abigail used behavioral science eons before it was defined by modern-day scientists. She enabled David to look beyond his anger and reengage his mental resources, thus limiting his emotional responses. Abigail abolished anger's Achille's

heel, demonstrating that our brains cannot concentrate on intense emotion and cognitive tasks at the same time. She averted a bloody annihilation, saving many lives. David lived out her advice, shooting the arrow directly into his Achilles' heel of anger by following her practical advice. Did he learn valuable life lessons from her that his Psalms express?

How do we apply Abigail's advice to our situations? Like David, when we are consumed by anger at someone's malicious goading, we can recognize God's gifts of daily provision, godly counsel, and His Word. We need to practically look for ways to serve the Lord that leave little time for unbridled emotion to grab a foothold in our spirits.

I experienced a need to vent vindictively recently and then found myself creating a chocolate éclair cake for a meal. The simple mundane tasks of measuring, mixing, and creating delight offered a pause in the battle for control which allowed me to thank God for His gifts to me. Try Abigail's secret to hitting anger's Achille's heel; it works!

Marion Aglow Explores Revelation Through Dreams

Dreams, says ordained minister and author Mary Byrd Gordon, can be influenced by our natural minds, pains in our bodies, or tiredness. "I have had some of my dreams affected by spring pollen, but all those are just temporary things that are going to pass." However, "the things of the dreams from the Spirit of the Lord" are "going to be constant."



Gordon, the author of Dreams and Revelations (2015), was speaking at the November 12 fellowship of the Marion Aglow Lighthouse, at His Place Worship Center in Marion.

Our dreams can be warfare dreams, occurring "when the enemy is trying to harass or afflict us," she pointed out. However, even if we dream an alarming dream, "it doesn't mean that it's from the enemy. It may be a warning dream," requiring that we "pray and prepare for what is coming."

Pharoah's dreams in Genesis 41, for example, "were warnings so that he could prepare for what was ahead." Similar warnings in our lives can help us "make wise choices with the resources that we have."

Gordan related two scriptural dreams she had dreamed in 1989; both helped her deal with the grief that would occur in her life. The first dream depicted God's deliverance of the Hebrews when they were trapped between the Red Sea and the Egyptian chariots. "Moses is crying out, and the Lord says, 'Why are you crying out to me? Raise your staff, part the water, and come on out.'"

In a dream immediately following this dream, "the Spirit of God revealed to me that when I came through a point of a great sea of grief that He would part the waters and He would take me through." The dream "was a promise from God for my future, and . . . would happen when a time came when I had a close family member or someone who died." A few years later, her father died "and the Lord did take me through."

The second scriptural dream painted a picture of the shipwreck that occurred when Paul, as a prisoner, was on a ship bound for Rome. When a storm began tearing the ship apart, those who could swim were told to swim for shore, while those who could not swim floated to shore on planks. Through the dream, God told her "that He was going to take me through life, even though I had not had the greatest stamina If I needed to rest on a board I would rest on a board"

In the scriptures, Gordan said, houses, tents, grass, branches, and loaves of bread can represent people or groups of people (CK. Isaiah 51:12 and Judges 17).

The Christmas Downgrade

Do you love upgrades? Sometimes I question if I should upgrade my phone, computer, etc. I barely figure out my so-called 'smart devices and then the powers that be make the devices smarter. But generally speaking, we are usually ok with upgrades. A couple of times as I have traveled, I have been given an upgrade on a car rental. To be able to get something better for the same price is always a great, well, upgrade.



Maybe the best upgrade I ever received was a move from economy class (coach), to first class on a flight from New York to Atlanta. It was a business trip and another sales rep and I arrived at the counter at just the perfect moment to learn that the airline had overbooked the economy class and would the both of us mind upgrading to first class on our flight to Atlanta. Needless to say, we both jumped at the opportunity to fly first class for the price of a coach ticket. It was the only time in my life, up to this point anyway, that I have flown first class.

The seat configuration difference alone is a drastic change. The 'seat pitch' is what the airline industry refers to as the distance between rows of seats i.e., one seat behind the other. In economy class, the seat pitch distance average is 31 inches. If you haven't noticed, that is tight and basically means no personal space whatsoever. Upgrade to business class and the average seat pitch jumps up to 55 inches. But an upgrade to first class gets you on average, 70 inches between the rows of seats. Yes, my flight that afternoon from New York to Atlanta was a wonderful experience because of the upgrade I was given.

We know the event by the word, incarnation. Our word incarnation comes from a Latin word meaning 'to make flesh.' More often than not we use the word to describe what the Son of God did for the human race. He became flesh. In Paul's letter to the church at Philippi, he writes: "Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God. But made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a servant, and coming in the likeness of men." (Phillippians 2:6,7)

This is amazing because the content that makes God the Being that He falls into two basic categories. First, there is the Character of God or His Nature we might say. And then there are the abilities and powers that go along with that status of God. The Phillips Translation of the Bible does something fascinating here. It renders the idea of "no reputation" as "He laid aside His divine privileges and prerogatives." In other words, God is choosing, by the incarnation, to downgrade or to put into remission or into an inactive state, certain powers that are native to equality to God.

We usually put God's powers into three categories, omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent. He is an all-powerful, all-knowing, and present everywhere at the same time God. And according to the scriptures, Jesus downgraded and laid aside, on our behalf, these powers so that He could experience the cross. You see God as God cannot die. He cannot die in His Godness. He is not going to die of a heart attack or cancer. He cannot die of old age. So the Son of God becomes a human being so that he can taste death. We read in the Book of Hebrews this very thought. "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that He by the grace of God should taste death for every man." (Hebrews 2:9)

Every Christmas, as well as the rest of the year, we ask ourselves in amazement and say, "really, would God, did God, really accept such a downgrade?" He 'emptied' himself. And His death was not a first-class death, not even a business-class death, but the economy death, death by crucifixion. Jesus became 'nothing' so that we might have everything. The Lord's Christmas downgrade supplies us with eternal life. Eternal life, now that's what I call an upgrade!

Pondering John 3:16

As we ponder the birth of Jesus during the month of December, we would all be greatly benefited by pondering John 3:16. Herschel Hobbs called this verse, "The Gospel in Superlatives." Martin Luther said it was, "The Bible in Miniature." A.T. Robertson referred to it as, "The Little Gospel." Others have called



it, "The Mount Everest of Holy Scripture." The one I like the best is, "The Gospel in a Nutshell"

F.W. Boreham called it everybody's text. Here is a verse so profound, all the scholars of all ages could never plumb its depths. Yet, this is a verse so simple, a small child can understand its meaning. Perhaps more people have come to faith in Christ by this verse than any other.

Ponder this----"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." This verse addresses a number of "isms" in our world that could be put to rest if we would simply ponder them.

"For God" addresses ATHEISM, which says there is no God.

"So Loved" addresses FATALISM, which says God is an impersonal force.

"The World" addresses NATIONALISM, which says God loves only one people group.

"That He Gave" addresses MATERIALISM, which says it is more blessed to receive than to give.

"His Only Begotten Son" addresses MUHAMMADISM, which says God did not

"That Whosoever Believes" addresses CALVINISM, which says Christ died only for the elect.

"It Him" addresses BLUB ALISM, which says all religious are equally the says.

"In Him" addresses PLURALISM, which says all religions are equally the same. "Should Not Perish" addresses ANNIHILATIONISM, which says there is no hell.

"But Have Everlasting Life" addresses ARMINIANISM, which says God gives only conditional life.

I am in the camp of one "ism" and it is called BIBLICISM, which is wrapped up

in this one verse if we would simply ponder it. This is a verse that you cannot exhaust. The great evangelist D.L. Moody met a young preacher in England named Henry Moorhead. Moody told young Moorhead that if he ever came to America that he wanted him to preach at his church in Chicago. One day Moody received a telegram from Moorhead saying, "I have landed in New York, and I will be coming to preach for you." Moody was scheduled to be out of town and responded to the telegram telling the young preacher that he was welcome to come and preach one night at his church. When Moody returned, he was surprised to learn that Moorhead had preached several nights with large crowds and many coming to faith in Christ. Moody's wife said to him, "He's a better preacher than you. He preaches that God loves people." And he was told that Moorhead had preached every night from John 3:16. Now, here's where this story gets really interesting. Moorhead started preaching at the age of 16. He died an untimely death at 33. His text for every sermon was John 3:16. The messages were different, but the text was the same. Surely, no preacher in a lifetime could ever exhaust this text. Take some time during this month and ponder it for yourself!





He is its father for it originates with him. "As many as believe in him, to them gave he the power to become the sons of God." (John 1:12) No one contests the last title, Prince of Peace. He stated himself, "My peace I give unto you," (John 14:27). Of the increase of his government and of peace, there will be no end. This phrase captures the universal character of the Messiah's reign and its extension at last to the whole created universe The key, of course, is in these words, to us a child is born, to us a son is given. Even though these events, both in Isaiah and in the gospels, took place thousands of years ago, when a nation (or an individual) first comes into personal contact with the Lord of Glory it seems as though he is the recipient for the first time of this wonderful gift. That is why we describe that we found the Lord, and how he came to us because it is so real in our own experience. It is to us that he came, he is born. Ring of Truth

My home county produces world-class drinking water. McDowell County water has been shipped around the globe. Excellent springs and pristine wells



abound. Yet, for reasons that I cannot grasp, most of the people I know purchase bottled drinking water. It makes no sense. Local municipal water tastes like chlorine, but everyone who lives in this county could find someone who would be happy to share from a good well or spring.

Each week, my wife and I provide water for our Sabbath fellowship meals. Everyone loves our excellent well. Good water contributes to a good life. Long before bottled water and effective filters, I learned about good water through its absence. The fetid slime from the drinking fountains in my dorm at St. Louis Christian College caused me to realize that McDowell County water has the "ring of truth."

Those three words dog my consciousness and challenge every new insight. Emotional connection to any proposition is no guarantor of validity, but one who is devoted to seeking truth arguably becomes sensitized to its presence. Unfortunately, many Christians are unable to distinguish between the "ring of truth" and the "ring of familiarity."

Our culture teaches that truth is relative. Politicians and celebrities say that everyone should proclaim "their" truth. This perspective values feelings and opinions over facts. In contrast, the Bible insists—and some of us still believe—that the Word of God is absolute truth. Truth stands undiminished by opinion, unfazed by rejection.

Because of the influence of our satan-driven culture, many who claim to follow Jesus assert that Scripture must be interpreted in light of what is popular. 2 Corinthians 5:10 is one of many verses that state that everyone will be judged according to God's standards of righteousness. "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil." Our choice is to either devote our best efforts to live in ways that honor God, or we must twist His Word to accommodate cultural fashion. Which approach has the ring of truth?

The Bible still claims that Holy God cannot abide by the presence of sin. Sin destroyed the face-to-face relationship that the first humans enjoyed with their Creator. Sin caused Adam and Eve to be banished from paradise, barred from the tree of life, and engulfed by the entropy that led to their death and decay. Every evil action is the result of sin. Sin nailed the Holy Son of God to a Roman cross. Unforgiven sin will cause the majority of humanity to die and be separated from God for eternity. Sin is the curse that confronts us.

Why is it that so few churches seem to be interested in sin? Many congregations offer programs to help mitigate the practice and consequences of certain sins such as chemical addiction and spouse abuse. Only a few churches appear to be calling their membership to strive to lead sinless lives. On the contrary, many Christian groups teach that once a person is "saved," they can live in any manner they choose, and God is somehow obligated to overlook habitual sin. That is not what the Bible teaches.

"Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap." (Galatians 6:7) "What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it?" (Romans 6:1-2) "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23) Many churches appear to believe that their primary job is providing outstanding entertainment. The Bible teaches that "church work" is defined by the Great Commission. Which of those perspectives has the ring of truth?

One of the most misunderstood concepts in Scripture involves the Fourth Commandment. "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." (Exodus 20:8) Protestant churches almost universally teach that Sabbath was replaced with something they call the Lord's Day. Few Christians know or care that Sunday worship was forced on the Church in the Fourth Century by Constantine 1 of Rome. His singular goal was to make Christianity more palatable to a culture steeped in sun god worship. This practice was carried on and enforced at the pain of death by the Roman Papacy. Unfortunately, the eventual Protestant rejection of the Roman system was only partial.

Jesus and His Apostles kept the Sabbath. So did the early Church. Not a single scripture claims that Sabbath was altered, revoked, or moved. Instead, the Bible says that Sabbath is dear to God's heart. Sabbath is the Seventh day and God expects us to observe it regardless of what is happening in our lives. Exodus 31:13 is properly translated by the ESV, "Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths." The Church teaches that Sabbath does not matter. The Bible says we must keep Sabbath before we do anything else. Where does the ring of truth lie in this debate?

Another unfortunate legacy of the Roman church is Christianity's obsession with pagan worship rituals. The Bible teaches from beginning to end that God hates paganism. Nonetheless, Christians cling to events at the winter solstice and spring equinox which venerate the sun deity and the fertility goddess of ancient Babylon. Every good encyclopedia tells the origins of the "holiday traditions." The Church loves the pagan holidays because they are "traditional." God refuses to be worshipped in the same way pagans worship their gods. Where lies the truth in this debate?

I learned about good water by being deprived of it. Amos 8:11-12 teaches that a time is coming when the Word of God will not be available. Perhaps the best way to prepare for that "drought" is to forget everything we've been taught, open the Bible to page one, and drink deeply.







Reindeer or Caribou By Christy Lowman Burke County

What do you think of when you hear the word reindeer? Christmas, hot chocolate, Santa, snow, perhaps?

Reindeer live in both North America and Europe however in North America they are called caribou. Domesticated caribou are called reindeer too.



The blood in the veins in their nose warms the air the reindeer breathes before it gets into its lungs. They have a super sense of smell that helps them sniff out lichen and other food under the snow. Their nose identifies predators and guides them on their migratory path. The reindeer's keen sense of smell helps them the most to survive.

Reindeer are herd animals. Sometimes a herd can have up to 500,000 reindeer! Reindeer choose to travel into the blowing wind to help them be able to pick up on surrounding scents. While their sense of sight and hearing are not the best, they can see ultraviolet light. This light also helps them identify predators and food

Some types of reindeer make a clicking sound when they walk. This helps them be able to hear each other so they can stay together in blizzard-like conditions. Reindeer can also swim and run up to 48 mph. Some travel up to three thousand miles each year.

These deer have the largest and heaviest antlers of all deer. Males and females

both grow antlers unlike the deer around here. Males' antlers grow up to 51 inches long while females grow up to 20 inches long. The males start growing their antlers in February and drop them in November. Females start growing their antlers in May and shed theirs the following May when they give birth.

Many people use reindeer for travel, to race, to help haul heavy things, and for meat, and milk. The reindeer's milk is considered "super milk" because it is 22 percent but-



Unfortunately, you only get 2 cups of milk from a reindeer a day instead of a gallon or so from a cow. Some people make sweet cheese from reindeer milk. Reindeer are unique, interesting animals. I had the pleasure of meeting some at a petting zoo once. Maybe one of these days I will get a chance to taste some of their sweet cheese!

December is a very busy month for many. Often our minds get occupied with presents, Santa, more presents, reindeer, and many other things. I encourage you to focus your mind on the real reason we celebrate Christmas, which is Jesus' birth. If Jesus had not been born we would not have had a savior to save us from going to hell. We would all be lost and life would be meaningless. The miracle of Jesus's birth and His story is the most important thing of all!

Also if you are able, please help other children and families that are in need this Christmas. They might not be getting a present or might need a warm meal. This has been a very hard year for many. Help them see the love of Jesus through you! Dear Lord, help us keep our hearts and mind on You this holiday season. Please show us who we can help this Christmas. From the Royal Robe to Swaddling Clothes No Regrets

It is 740 BC Uzziah has reigned as King of Judah for fifty-two years. He is a successful king who brought security and prosperity to Judah. He started following the Lord, but because of the success he has had, and the popularity he has gained, pride overtakes him. He becomes so arrogant that he goes into the Temple to



burn incense which is restricted to only the priests the sons of Aaron. While in the Temple in disobedience God strikes him with leprosy. Uzziah is isolated in a home and dies a lonely man. Like Uzziah, it is easy, if we are not careful, to turn the blessings of God in our lives and take the credit for ourselves resulting in the sin of pride and arrogance.

It is during this time of anxiety and political unrest that God calls the prophet Isaiah to deliver God's message of hope to a remnant of believers. "In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple. "Isaiah 6:1 This is significant because Isaiah sees God's Son clothed in a royal robe, the King of kings and the Lord of lords, sitting upon a throne seven hundred plus years before the birth of Christ. Jesus' name Immanuel means God with us. Jesus will reign as King on earth just as Isaiah had seen and witnessed. This experience with Christ brought comfort to Isaiah and he in turn was to comfort God's people.

In contrast to Uzziah's pride in the presence of God almighty, Isaiah humbles himself before the throne in repentance and acknowledges his sinfulness. Christ then purges Isaiah's sin taking away his iniquity with a live coal from the altar of sacrifice touching Isaiah's lips. This is a clear picture of the atoning sacrifice of our Savior Jesus Christ. That we are purged and made clean with the precious blood of Christ.

Sin is an abomination to God and God will judge us for our pride and ungodliness.

But thank the Lord, God took on flesh and came to earth. Isaiah brought a message of hope to the "house of David." Isaiah 7:13–14 "And he said, Hear ye now, O house of David; Is it a small thing for you to weary men, but will ye weary my God also? Therefore, the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, And shall call his name Immanuel. "At a time when believers had given up on God, God makes a promise that His Son is coming to earth and will be born of the virgin Mary.

The "house of David" is the remnant of believers. All believers past, present, and future can trust God's Word and God's Son Jesus Christ. What Isaiah anticipated to come in God's timing; we look back on the birth of Jesus the baby in the manger.

If we could just imagine a scene in heaven determined before the foundation of the world. God sees into eternity the plight and disease of a man wallowing in our sin and depravation. We have no hope and are doomed to despair and darkness. And God asks who will go for me and make a way for sinful man to be saved. And Jesus the Son says I will go send me. The father continues Son you will have to take on human flesh and die a sacrificial death; you will experience the pain and suffering of the flesh, and I will forsake you in your darkest hour. You will pay a sin debt and satisfy my wrath against sin. Royalty, the King of kings and the Lord of lords comes to earth wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger. God removes the royal robe in exchange for grave clothes. Thank God for Christmas.




Can't Buy Me Love







Although a house often represents a person, Gordon shared two related dreams she had had in which a man actually represented a house.

In both dreams, she married a very old man and even decided to divorce him. After study and prayer, she realized that the dreams were actually a warning against the plans she and her husband, Frank, had to renovate their old home. The cost of renovation would have resulted in a great financial loss. After prayer, she and Frank canceled renovation plans and bought a new home that "was above anything that we were asking or thinking."

It is important to take care in discerning the meaning of dreams, Gordon cautioned. "There are things that are revealed to us in the Spirit that can easily be misunderstood, and we can discount that a dream is from the Lord." It's also important to grow in the area of understanding dreams. "It's a blessing if you have a few friends or your family that you can talk with" about your dreams.

Gordon related a story of a misunderstood dream that prophetic evangelist Bobby Conner related at the 2014 funeral of Bob Jones, his fellow evangelist, prophet, and friend. Conner had experienced a disturbing dream in which he had moved away from a crowd and seated himself on a loveseat. What appeared to be a dark-skinned teenage girl began pressing herself against him. A man whom Conner thought was a fellow ministry worker Michael Morgan kept pushing the young girl closer to Conner.

The next morning, Bob Jones phoned Conner. Jones knew about the dream without being told. "You are so dumb, boy," he told Conner. "That's not a teenage girl. That's the Jewish nation. The Lord is trying to get you away from the crowds and God is moving prophetically on the Jewish nation. And that's not Michael Morgan It's Michael the Archangel that pushed you closer."

"I believe if we press in to know the Lord to honor him as holy and seek him, we might go to greater depth in our dreams," Gordon concluded. She encouraged listeners to keep a record of their dreams. "Keep a notebook or pad beside your bed and write and date what is in your dream, and that way you can ponder it." "In my dreams, I have been corrected. I have been directed. I have been called into ministry. I've been shown my future. I have experienced a sovereign intercession for the church."

Down Market

I recently wrote a Case Study on the Impact on income of purchasing an annuity after the market decline. I thought I would share it as it is very timely right now.

This is a common concern, and many people think that purchasing an annuity when the market drops is not a wise decision. I specialize in income planning and want to see what impact it would have so I created this case to look at the impact of adding a more secure income to

supplement a portfolio that has declined. The results surprised even me.

The client is a 70-year-old with \$1,500,000 in retirement assets and withdraws 4% each year to provide \$60,000 of income each year. There is a correction in the market and her portfolio is down 25%. She is considering purchasing an annuity and wants to know the impact it has on her income. Let's look at the numbers.

70 year old with \$1,500,000 portfolio living of 4% for income

Portfolio	\$ 1,500,000				
4% withdrawal	\$ 60,000				
25% market drop	\$ 1,125,000				
4% withdrawal	\$ 45,000				
Purchase annuity	\$ 750,000				
5.5% distribution*	\$ 41,250				
Portfolio	\$ 375,000				
4% withrawal	\$ 15,000				
Total Income	\$ 56,250				

Portfolio drop down 25%

Income drop with Portfolio only down 25% Adding annuity option Portfolio down 25% Income drop with Annuity option down 6.25%

*Withdrawal rate for 70 year old on SILAC Denali Annuity is 5.5%

While the portfolio is still down 25% the income is only down 6.25% instead of 25% if she continues to rely on the portfolio for income. In a perfect world she should have addressed the income part earlier, but as you can see making changes even after the market correction can have a significant impact on her income. Each person is different, but most have the same need for consistent income in retirement.

Summary

In this case, the client has \$11,250 more income and it will take less time to recover when the market recovers as it only needs to make up the \$3,750 in income instead of the \$15,000 in income. It also provides stability of income going forward and creates less reliance on the market for the needed income. With fixed index annuities there is also the opportunity to see growth and account for inflation as well as possible long-term care benefits. For this example, purchasing the annuity even after the market has declined makes sense.

towards" the object of worship.

Real worship involves humbling ourselves before God. You can either keep your pride intact or worship God – but you can't do both. Jesus said, "*No man can serve two masters*" – you can't serve your pride, and worship God.

When's the last time you humbled yourself in worship — the last time you got down on your knees, went to the altar, or raised your hands? These things aren't "requirements," but they are ways you can humble yourself. Genuine worship involves humbling yourself before your King!

C. Giving. :11b "Then, opening their treasures, they presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Thus began our tradition of giving Christmas presents. Giving is a basic part of worship. When you love someone, you want to give them gifts.

After one of the first times Cheryl & I went Christmas shopping for our grand-babies, Cheryl said, "If you want to get in the Christmas spirit, go shopping for kids in a toy store!" We bought little soccer balls, a toy laptop, and little metal pots & pans. Nobody made us do that; we WANTED to!

When you really love, you want to give. That's why when we don't give to God as we should, it's an important spiritual indicator. If a person is not eager to give to the Lord, it's one of the biggest giveaway signs that something is not right in their heart. Christianity is not all about money, as some assert, but the fact is that money really IS a "thermometer" that reveals your "spiritual temperature." If that's so, what's your "temperature"? Giving is an integral part of genuine worship.

D. Obedience. :12 says, "And having been warned by God in a dream not to return to Herod, the magi left for their own country by another way." This is perhaps the best sign of genuine worship: when the magi left Jesus, they DID what God instructed them to do! They were warned by Him in a dream not to return to Herod – and they didn't! They obeyed the Lord.

Jesus said in Luke 6:46, "Why do you call Me, 'Lord, Lord', but do not DO what I say?" Your obedience shows how much you really worship Him.

St. Augustine wrote: "A girl might say to her lover, 'Don't wear that sort of cloak': he won't. If she tells him in winter: 'I like you best in your short tunic,' he would rather shiver than offend her." (Augustine, Brown, p. 243) Augustine's point was, if we truly love someone, we'll want to please them.

That's how it is with the Lord too. If we really worship Him, then we'll do what pleases Him. Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." What we do in church doesn't show our love for God, as much as how well we obey Him after we leave! Obedience is one of the best signs of genuine worship.

Which of Matthew 2's characters do YOU resemble the most: -- The religious leaders' "intellectual" response?

- -- Herod's hypocritical response?
- -- Or the magi's heartfelt worship, evidenced by their humility, giving, and obedience?

What will YOUR response be to Jesus this Christmas?




Mary Had a Little Lamb

Luke 2:16-17 "And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger. And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child."

In Luke's account of the Christmas story, the Bible tells us that the shepherds journeyed to Bethlehem to see this thing "which the Lord hath made known unto us."



This Lamb was the PROMISED one. He was promised to Mary by an angel and had been prophesied about in the Old Testament. Truly, this Lamb was the promised Messiah...the anointed one. And every creature which is in heaven, and on the earth, and under the earth, and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, heard I saying, Blessing, and honour, and glory, and power, be unto him that sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb for ever and ever."

Many times, we only remember Jesus as Mary's Lamb at Christmas, but may our hearts turn to Him as we worship the promised, proclaimed, and prevailing Lamb of God!

Ready For Anything (Non-Fiction)

One of my friends recently lost her husband unexpectedly. Last year she and her husband retired from their jobs and moved to a new state. They left their family and friends in California to pursue a new retired life in Colorado where they didn't know anyone. But after ten months she is now a widow and alone in a new town.



Does she wonder why God would have moved her to Colorado to be alone? Is she able to continue? At times she has confessed she feels like she cannot. But she knows that God is with her and she's said she feels Him helping her every day.

The author of Hebrews reminds us, "Now the God of peace, who brought up from the dead the great Shepherd of the sheep through the blood of the eternal covenant, even Jesus our Lord, equip you in every good thing to do His will, working in us that which is pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen." (Hebrews 13:20-21, NASB)

When the author of Hebrews tells us that God will "equip you in every good thing to do His will" it reminds us that God gives us what we need to endure life. Through struggling marriages, disobedient children, layoffs from jobs, environmental disasters that damage our property, or when our family members pass away, God equips us to handle it. The word for "equip" here is the Greek word katartisai which was used by trainers to adjust parts of the body, "put into proper condition."

In other words, God will "equip" us to handle anything that comes our way. He'll adjust us so that we can endure what we are going through. Yes, it will feel like we can't handle it. And we probably couldn't handle it without God. But God will stick with us through it. He equips us in "every good thing to do His will." And He is "working in us that which is pleasing in His sight."

So when we do something that betrays our friend's trust and we wonder how we will earn his trust back, God will help us do what we need to do. When we make an error at work and it fumbles up a project and costs the company money, God will equip us to make it right. When we lose a family member and don't know how to go on, God will comfort us and walk with us each step of the way.

On December 22, it will be 12 years since the day we found out our precious Lexie Anne had gone to be with the Lord. I was so devastated and crushed the morning we found out she had no heartbeat. My husband and I had gone to Boone that morning for a regular prenatal doctor's visit. I was almost 20 weeks pregnant. It was close



to Christmas with lots of excitement and we had family coming to visit. I had no idea anything was wrong. The doctor went to listen to the baby's heartbeat. I knew something was strange when she seemed to be struggling to find it. There were no sounds. I became concerned but thought maybe our baby was just not in the right position. This had never happened before with our other children. We were moved to another room where a different doctor confirmed through ultrasound that our baby had passed. There was no life and no heartbeat. Devastation and loss hit us like a ton of bricks. We went over to the hospital and I was induced that morning. I delivered our lifeless baby girl that evening. I went from a heart full of joy to a heart full of sadness and loss that morning. I cried uncontrollably. I couldn't make sense of it all. I had delivered 4 healthy babies before this pregnancy. Why God? A few days later after Christmas, we went to visit our family in Sanford. My mom gave me a Christmas decoration of Santa sitting in a chair holding a baby. She had bought it weeks before to give it to me for Christmas. I always place it on a table each Christmas in memory of our little girl. Psalm 147:3 says, 'He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds." I had to give my broken heart to Jesus, dear friend. He is our only hope in such difficult times of hurt, pain, and loss. When there were no answers, I had to turn to God. Matthew 5:4 says, "Blessed are those who mourn: for they shall be comforted." I found much comfort, hope, and healing resting in the arms of Jesus. I didn't have all the answers, but our sovereign God did. Several years later in 2018, God revealed to me how He wanted Lexie Anne's life to be honored through Anne Ministries. He had a purpose and a plan for her life when He created her. God is now taking this painful day to purpose in the life of the ministry. Anne Ministries reaches out to those that are hurting from pregnancy loss such as miscarriage, stillbirth, and infant loss. We offer one on one Bible study and group support to women and families grieving the loss of their babies. When I look at this Christmas decoration I think about my sweet Lexie Anne being held in the arms of Jesus. She is in His presence and she always has been from the moment the Lord took her home and one day... Yes, one glorious day, I have the hope and promise I will see her in our heavenly home! Thank you, Jesus!



Bible Briefs

Joy Unspeakable

"Joy Unspeakable", is found in only one Bible Scripture verse. 1Peter 1:8, "Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with Joy Unspeakable and full of glory".

Explaining the Spirit of God, with its human heart-touched emotion of "Joy Unspeakable", experienced by many Christians is quite difficult. Perhaps this is near

impossible (un-utterable) to clarify with the words of men. This is very different than the emotional joy we have for the love of individuals within our family.

Christians who have had this Joy Unspeakable miracle arise in their hearts, which is given by the Holy Spirit, will most likely have it happen during a personal Bible Study of the Scriptures. John 14:26, "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, He shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said to you".

Joy Unspeakable erupts with a sudden weeping of tears. At the same time, along comes the perfect conviction of spiritual love, truth, and mercy; found only in Jesus Christ, our LORD, and Savior. This is Christ's glorious wave of heartinspired, Joy Unspeakable. These are tears of joy, a conviction of Christ's perfect work of faith for the salvation of His elect people.

Our personal family tree of individuals within it, we love dearly. That symbolic family tree has broken branches for many of us. Christ's Sword (His Word, the Gospel) brings various uncomfortable scripture truths. Mathew 10:36,37 "and a man's foes shall be they of his own household. He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worth of me".

We begin to see that "Joy Unspeakable", the perfect love Jesus has for us, is on the highest plane of perfection, unattainable love by mankind. No reference or comparison to the love we have for our family members can compare. 1 John 4:18, "there is no fear in love; perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love". (Summarizing Isaiah 55:8,9); The Lord saith, "my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways. As the heavens are higher than the earth, my ways and thoughts are higher than yours".

At various times, Jesus Christ reveals His glorious, Joy Unspeakable presence in our lives through His word in Scripture. Psalm 16:11, "Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore".

We must always be alert to the deception of Satan who can give only short-term power, pride, glory, joy, and treasure of man-made earthly riches. Proverbs 10:7, "the memory of the just is blessed: but the name of the wicked shall rot". Satan comes as a transformed angel of light, a false minister of righteousness (2 Co 11:14,15), to confuse and corrupt the word of God.

Don't be fooled that Joy Unspeakable, eternal treasures found only in God's word, can be given by Satan. 1 Co 14:33, "God Almighty is not the author of confusion". "We have this treasure in earthen vessels (our body), that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us", 2 Corinthians 4:7. "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also", Luke 12:34.

Only the knowledge of God's words, and searching the scriptures, make it somewhat possible for Christians to understand "Joy Unspeakable". Isaiah 26:3, "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee".

Reviewing part of the verse again 1 Peter 1:8, "Whom having not seen, ye love, though now ye see him not, yet believing"; how beautiful are the words of God in this verse! All of your hope for eternal life, given by the Spirit of God; conviction of salvation, sudden overwhelming tears of joy, the forgiveness of our sins, and the perfect belief of Christ's love for you; all in one moment of un-seen spiritual time. "Knowing, brethren beloved, your election of God", 1Thessalonians 1:4.

Romans 8:24,25,26 "For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it? Likewise, the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered".

"Some Things to Remember This Christmas"

An old legend tells that Satan and his demons once threw a Christmas party for themselves. As the party was ending and the demons were heading out to resume their worldwide activity, one demon jokingly said to Satan, "Merry Christmas, your majesty." To that, Satan replied, "Yes, help the world



keep it merry because if they ever get serious about it we'll all be in trouble." This world certainly does make it hard to get serious about Christmas. How can we keep our focus on the holiday's important things when we are bombarded at every turn with silly things? I've never heard it put any better than Keith Ogden, the pastor of Hill Street Baptist Church in Asheville, North Carolina, put it. He called the Christmas holiday a "mixture of the reasonable with the ridiculous" and said, "Christmas today is a mixture of the sacred with the secular, the holy with the common, the holiday with the holy day, the babe in a manger with the elf in a sleigh, the shepherds in the field, watching their sheep with reindeer that know

And so, in these days leading up to Christmas, I think it would be good for us to identify a few things that we should remember this Christmas. These are things that will help us celebrate the birth of Christ in a manner that is pleasing to Him. There's nothing wrong with having Christmas, but we need to have it the right

The first thing we should remember is: Christmas is the celebration of Christ's birth. Christmas isn't about: Santa Claus, elves, reindeer, the grinch, Christmas trees, presents, eggnog, Jimmy Stewart, Bing Crosby, or Mariah Carey. It's about Jesus! You can't even spell the word "Christmas" without starting with the name "Christ." Christmas is the celebration of Christ's birth.

I once read about a family who celebrated Christmas each year by actually throwing a birthday party for Jesus. They would go so far as to set an extra chair at the table as a reminder of Christ's presence at the party. The mother would fix a cake, complete with candles, and the whole family would sing "Happy Birthday" to Jesus. One year a visitor said to the family's five-year-old daughter, "Did you get everything you wanted for Christmas?" The little girl replied, "No, but then it's not my birthday." We need more of that attitude today.

A second thing we should remember is: It is more blessed to give than to receive. In Acts 20:35, Paul says to the pastors of Ephesus: "I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.''

If your whole idea of Christmas centers around your receiving, you are missing the point of the holiday. What does John 3:16 say? "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." You see, the baby Jesus lying in that manger on that night so long ago was a gift to the world. And God expects those of us who follow Jesus to be givers.

A third thing we should remember is: Even in our giving, we can cross the line into sin. Colossians 3:17 says: "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." Did you know that Jesus wants to be the Lord of your Christmas shopping? He doesn't want you to buy anything contrary to His will. Even if an item is on clearance at a 90% discount, you'd better consult the Lord before buying it. Jesus doesn't mind you buying gifts for others, but He does want you to filter every purchase through

What passes for discerning giving these days was on display at a Wal-Mart in Long Island, New York, a few years ago. In the early morning hours of the Friday after Thanksgiving, approximately 2,000 shoppers gathered outside the doors of the mall where the Wal-Mart was located. When a thirty-four-year-old male employee opened the store's doors, he was immediately knocked to the ground by the onrushing crowd. The force of the crowd was so great that a metal portion of the door frame was crumpled like an accordion. In all the chaos, no one cared that the employee couldn't get up, so they just kept stepping all over him. Even when some of the other employees tried to fight their way through the crowd to help their coworkers, they were knocked down and trampled upon as well. After the stampede was over, the worker was rushed to a nearby hospital where he was pronounced dead around 6:00 a.m. Tell me, do you think Jesus is pleased that such crazed shopping is associated with the season of His birth?

The fourth thing we should remember is: We should always do our part to live peaceably with others. A good text here is Romans 12:18, which says: "If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men." Isn't it sad that Christmas oftentimes brings out the worst in people? This is especially true with

The 2022 mid-term election is behind us and the results overall show that North Carolina voters strongly favor successful Republican policies of lower taxes, balanced budgets, in-person academic-focused learning for students, and support for law enforcement.

In N.C. General Assembly, Republicans in the Senate and House each gained two seats. Senate Republicans won 30 seats and regained our supermajority – 30 of 50 senators. The House fell one short of regaining its supermajority, winning 71 seats when 72 were needed. However, there is always the possibility that one or more Democrats will side with the Republicans to override a veto.

While all incumbent Republican state senators who ran for reelection retained their seats, the caucus welcomed five new senators: Tim Moffitt of Henderson County, Eddie Settle of Wilkes County, Brad Overcash of Gaston County, Benton Sawrey of Johnston County, and former state senator Buck Newton of Wilson County.

In other races across the state, school boards gained a significant number of Republican seats with Republican winning 75% of seats in partisan elections. Clearly, voters are ready for the focus to return to high academic standards, along with transparency, parental involvement, and an abandonment of the disturbing woke ideologies of critical race theory and transgenderism pushed by leftist education unions.

One of the most closely watched judicial races this election was for the open seats on the N.C. Supreme Court. Republicans winning these two seats significantly changes the makeup of the N.C. Supreme from a 4-3 Democrat majority to a 5-2 Republican majority. This year, the Democrat majority court wrongly ruled that two constitutional amendments approved by voters in 2018, one for voter ID, and another for a state income tax cap, were unconstitutional because they were placed on the ballot by a racially gerrymandered legislature and so sent the case back to a lower court. Hopefully, voter ID will become a reality in the absence of an agendadriven majority Democrat state Supreme Court.

The Need for Transparency in What's Being Taught in North Carolina Classrooms

Children across the nation are facing ever-increasing exposure to radical, politicized content in K-12 classrooms. From divisive racial theories to inappropriate sexual content, to political ideology designed to cause them to view America as a negative, evil force, our children seem clearly under attack from radical leftists who have gained an iron grip on so much of our educational establishment. At the same time, such concerns have become obvious, parents are most often left unaware of actual indoctrination being imposed on their children. Thus, we badly need, I believe, more information readily and easily available to parents on what is going on in classrooms.

In 2021, I introduced legislation designed to create more transparency for parents on actual classroom academics and instruction. The bill would have provided online information to parents on exactly what instruction and materials were given to their children in classrooms. By being able to review the actual class curriculum, textbooks, and materials, parents could have a clearer understanding of what students are being taught. In turn, those parents could make more informed decisions about their children's participation in various instruction and could seek to better interact with their local schools, principals, and teachers in discussing the appropriateness of what actually occurs in a given classroom or with a given instructor. At the same time, every effort was included in the bill to make the process of providing needed information as easy as possible for classroom teachers.

Heightened awareness of what goes on in the classroom will allow parents to be more active and engaged with their children's education. Parental involvement is a known, extremely positive factor in the success of students' education. Academic transparency can help parents ensure that what is going on in our state's classrooms is both appropriate and effective in providing our students with the education they deserve and need to become patriotic, well-adjusted, and capable citizens. Most teachers are dedicated to doing the right thing for our children. However, improving academic transparency can help expose those who are engaged in efforts to radically transform our nation by radically educating our young people. Unfortunately, my bill on academic transparency, while it passed the North Carolina House, did not make it through the state Senate. Come January, I plan to introduce a similar bill to protect our students and to recognize and advance parents' rights to have a primary say in their children's education.

Radical Hospitality

Consider with me a story found in the Gospel of Luke. In this passage, Jesus is dining (along with several other guests) at the home of a "prominent Pharisee." At some point during the dinner party, Jesus says this to his host:



"...when you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back, and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." - Luke 14:12-14

Take a moment, and reflect on your life through the lens of what Jesus says here. How often do you practice hospitality? How often do you invite people into your home, into your life? And how often do you invite someone who isn't a friend, family member, or a well-respected member of your community?

When Jesus told the Pharisee to "invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind," he was describing people viewed as the most undesirable in society. The marginalized. The outsiders. When you host a dinner party, do you ever ask, who is the most undesirable person I could invite? I sure don't. Yet this is the radical hospitality that Jesus calls us to embody. To invite a stranger, a homeless person, a societal outcast, or maybe even a personal enemy into our home to break bread with us. Practicing this type of hospitality may seem daunting or even scary, but it is an essential part of what it means to participate in the upside-down kingdom of heaven that Jesus preached. It is hospitality that shows no favoritism, hospitality that affirms the full humanity and infinite value of those who society deems less than.

In her book "The Gospel Comes With a House-Key," Rosaria Butterfield describes Christian hospitality thusly:

"Radically ordinary hospitality is this: using your Christian home in a daily way that seeks to make strangers neighbors, and neighbors family of God."

Picture what it would look like if Jesus' followers everywhere began to take this seriously. Imagine if our homes were known in our neighborhoods as the homes where anyone and everyone is welcome. Homes where surprising friendships are formed and lives are changed - where a beautiful tapestry of love is woven through good food, laughter, and deep conversations.

If this vision is to become a reality, it starts with you and me, in our local communities. If you are reading this, I challenge you to take a step of faith this holiday season. Who is someone in need or neglected who you can invite into your home? But don't stop there...how can you incorporate radical hospitality into your weekly or even daily schedule? If you struggle to envision what this could look like, I recommend reading the book I quoted earlier in this article, "The Gospel Comes With A House-key".

Practicing the hospitality that Jesus asks of us is risky, but worth it. Scripture is clear: we cannot love people the way Jesus loves without risk. We must embrace the risk to follow him, and be transformed. If we embrace the risk, both our lives and others will be forever changed.

"Continue in brotherly love. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it." - Hebrews

The Shield of Faith

Ephesians 6:16 says, "Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked"

No sensible person would fight a war without the right equipment. When our soldiers go into battle they have heavy equipment like tanks, aircraft, missiles, and ships. They also

equipment like tanks, aircraft, missiles, and ships. They also have smaller weapons that are weapons of war like an M-16 rifle, hand grenades, knives, and other means of offense and defense.

We are definitely in a war with the forces of evil and Satan. It is wise to fight to win if we are going to engage in conflict. Ephesians 6 tells us how to be winners in the struggle that we find ourselves spiritually. If we follow the directions set down in God's word we will prevail over the enemy.

In this study, we come upon the subject of faith. It is so important that we exercise our faith, that the Bible says, "Above all taking the shield of faith." The words "above all" stress the utmost importance of utilizing our faith in the spiritual battle in which we are involved from day to day.

Remember that Paul was in prison and under constant guard when writing to the Ephesian church. He was forced to stare at the soldier's armor day in and day out. He had an ideal picture of the defenses needed by the Christian believer to combat the forces of evil.

Charles Ryrie says the following about the shield of faith: "The shield in a Roman soldier's attire, made of wood, was about 2 1/2' wide and 4' long. It was overlaid with linen and leather, to absorb fiery arrows. Thus, it also protected the other pieces of the armor; hence Paul used the phrase, in addition to all this. "Of faith" is a genitive of content; the shield consists of faith. The idea, then, is that a Christian's resolute faith in the Lord can stop and extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one aimed at him."

Faith is so important in living successfully for the Lord from day to day. To fail to exercise faith is a plan to fail. Here is what the Scripture says about faith in 1 John 5:4 which says: "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith."

Initial Faith is of the Utmost Importance

When one repents of his or her sins and puts their faith in Christ to save them from their sins, many wonderful things happen.

Our sins are forgiven through faith. Romans 3:25 says, "Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God."

We are justified by our faith. To "justify" is to "declare as righteous" in the sight of God. Romans 5:1 declares, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Without faith, we would still be unrighteous and in our sins, facing all the undesirable consequences of them.

We have spiritual life through faith. John 20:31 tells us: "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name."

We have eternal life through faith. John 3:16 reminds us: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." The best part of it all is that eternal life will be enjoyed in Heaven and not in Hell. Those who go to Hell will live there forever in torment and judgment.

We have spiritual light through faith. Here are a couple of Scriptures that underscore the giving of spiritual light through faith. We can see what we could not see before we exerted saving faith in Christ. John 12:36: "While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light. These things spake Jesus, and departed, and did hide himself from them." John 12:46: "I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness." My faith is in Christ, so I am not living in a condition of darkness but one of light.

We have access to God through faith. Romans 5:2 substantiates this wonderful truth: "By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." Ephesians 3:12 stresses faith: "In whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of him."

Battling Faith is of the Utmost Importance

This is in line with the context of Ephesians 6. The main thrust of it all is warfare. Faith is not an option but rather a necessity to conquer our spiritual foes. It might be wise to take a few moments to see what faith really is. It is defined

well in Hebrews 11:1: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

The keywords are "substance" and "evidence." First, the word "substance" is the Greek New Testament word "hupostasis" which speaks of assurance or confidence. Faith in Christ gives us confidence and assurance that God will keep all of the promises the Lord has made to Israel and his New Testament church.

The word "evidence" is the Greek word "elegchos" which has the idea of proof. We do not have to put everything in a test tube to believe it. Faith convinces us to embrace unseen hopes and realities. Through faith, we are convinced about what we cannot see without human eyes. The unseen is just as real to us as what we see with our eyes. Someone said, "It is our handle on what we cannot visualize." It makes real what we cannot see.

1 Timothy 1:18-19 promotes good warfare: "This charge I commit unto thee, son Timothy, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare; Holding faith, and a good conscience; which some having put away concerning faith have made shipwreck."

1 Timothy 6:12 continues this promotion by stating the following: "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses."

It is great that we are called upon to worship the Lord and to love others but at the same time according to the preceding two verses we are to "war a good warfare" and to "fight the good fight of faith."

One who is a warrior in human warfare or the spiritual realm must have the right weapons. If we have them, it is then and only then that we can be victorious warriors, bringing glory and honor to our Savior.

Unwavering Faith is of the Utmost Importance

James 1:6-7 qualifies the importance of unwavering faith: "But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord."

Keeping those two verses in mind, consider our text again. If we take the shield of faith, it is promise to us that: "Ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked"

Warren Wiersbe has an excellent summary of the fiery darts from Satan that we can extinguish if we have unwavering faith: "In Paul's day, arrows, dipped in some inflammable substance and ignited, were shot at the enemy. Satan shoots "fiery darts" at our hearts and minds: lies, blasphemous thoughts, hateful thoughts about others, doubts, and burning desires for sin. If we do not by faith quench these darts, they will light a fire within and we will disobey God. We never know when Satan will shoot a dart at us, so we must always walk by faith and use the shield of faith."

Do not allow anyone to convince you that faith is a non-essential matter in the Christian life. One old song God's church has sung for many years has the following lyrics: "Living by faith in Jesus above, trusting confiding in His great love, safe from all harm, in His sheltering arms, I'm living by faith and I feel no alarm."

I could give you many instances in my life when I wondered how I could ever overcome what I was facing. I look back over the many years God has allowed me to live and readily confess that faith has won me victory after victory, as I have lived on my Christian journey through this world of sin and unbelief.

Let faith be your defensive shield, your means of protection as you live for God from day to day. Remember that faith is the victory that overcomes the world.



months later and Ashley is doing well and has both her boys in her life! She now has her own place to live as well as her own car. Her kids are involved in the community and sports. Ashley is working full-time at a restaurant. She would like to be a full-time peer support specialist in her life career, in moving toward that goal she is a mentor at the McDowell county jail. Ashley has just received her certification as a peer support specialist through Vaya Health and graduated from the Freedom Life Program on November 18th.

At Freedom Life, we see so many clients who want to return to help others. We believe there is a powerful movement happening when formerly incarcerated clients have a calling to help others out of the same trench. The is a calling and purpose in this powerful movement of recovery.

Mercy (Otis) Warren

This is an American history educational moment of those who made a difference during the Revolutionary War era and how they

Mercy (Otis) Warren was born on September 14, 1728, in Barnstable, Massachusetts, and was the third of 13 children. Mercy and James Warren married in 1754 and had five sons. Mercy came from a family of wealth and prominence. Men in her nuclear and extended families were powerful in the justice, military, and political communities. In addition, her family connections gave Mercy singular access to relatives and others in influential positions.

Because of social and family mores during the Revolutionary War era, girls were not afforded an education. Nonetheless, Mercy's privileged social status allowed her to be tutored at home by her father, brothers, and others who were Harvard and Yale University, graduates. Mercy was taught critical thinking by her family's questioning the divine rights of royals and studying the philosophy of Locke, Hume, and Kant. She also developed a curiosity for civics, ancient history, and classical literature.

Mrs. Warren was clever and had a strong wit. Using her talents, she wrote plays, poems, and political discourse. Mercy's satirical sonnets and dramas were an open indictment of her political friends and foes. Even her confidants did not escape her opinions and censure. Because of her sharp wit and criticisms, Mercy ruined her husband's political career.

Mercy had a canny ability to write on topics that were characterized by reasoning and logic. She acquired her brother's political work after he was severely battered into submission by a British officer, causing permanent mental incapacity. Mrs. Warren's talents helped form the Committee of Correspondence that opposed Parliament. She also provided insight and purposes for establishing the United States Constitution and other government constructs. As was true of others, Mercy opposed the Constitution until various legal rights were addressed.

Many agreed with Mrs. Warren's views, ideas, and political beliefs, although others opposed them. Also, Mercy's outlook was recognized as the advent of women's rights and dubbed the "Conscience of the American Revolution." Mrs. Warren's last act of nationalism was in the early 1800s when she published a scholarly anthology, History of the Rise, Progress, and Termination of the American Revolution.

At 86, Mercy died in her Plymouth, Massachusetts home on October 19, 1814. Mrs. Warren did not fight the Revolutionary War with guns and swords. Instead, Mercy Otis Warren was courageous and demonstrated American patriotism and devotion using her intellect and powerful writing.



The Church of Laodicea and Today's Times

In the Gospel of Luke chapter 18, verses 1 through 8, Jesus teaches a parable concerning persistence in prayer. Verse one states, "Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up." The word translated "give up" here is the Greek verb ekkakeo which means: "to be utterly spiritless, wearied out, exhausted, to



lose courage." This same word was also used in 2 Thessalonians 3:13 when the apostle Paul admonished the church at Thessalonica to "...never tire of doing what is good." This Greek verb is comprised of two additional words: ek, which means "out" or "from" and kakos which refers to "that which is evil in the sense of THINKING." In other words, to "give up" first and foremost begins in our minds and our patterns of thinking. It is when our thinking begins to lean in the direction of what is wrong, of a bad nature, troublesome, injurious, or destructive (the only other word used for "evil" in Greek is poneros which refers to evil motives or intentions)! Daniel 7:25 has a connection to this principle of evil thinking believe it or not! This passage states – which is pointing to a time in the future where the antichrist would reign upon the earth - "He (the horn, representative of the antichrist) will speak against the Most High and oppress his holy people and try to change the set times and the laws. The holy people will be delivered into his hands for a time, times, and half a time." There are several things we should notice that this entity will utilize as tactics: (1) A hatred of God ("He will speak against the Most High), (2) Spiritual warfare ("...and oppress his holy people"), and (3) Have a huge degree of influence in government and legislation ("...and try to change the set times and the laws"). Although this entity of the antichrist has not yet been revealed to reign upon the earth, the spirit OF the antichrist is already at work in the earth (1 John 4:2-6). We see this spirit that has created a culture that hates God and rejects the things of God, wages spiritual warfare against the people of God (particularly in the MIND), and has tremendous influence in the governmental systems of not just this country, but across the world! It is this spirit that begins to oppress the THINKING of individuals (INCLUDING BELIEVERS), to direct their lives in an evil and GodLESS direction! Now jumping to verses 7 and 8 in Luke 18 which state, "7 And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? 8 I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" Now you may ask, "What do these verses have to do with what you've just said?" My answer: THESE VERSES GO HAND IN HAND!

There is a direct connection in verse 1 regarding our crying out to God (in prayer) and the Parousia or the coming of the Lord. The word "cry" signifies speaking in a strong voice that is aggressive and continual. What does this have to do with the return of our Lord? Although God promises swift justice when we continually cry out to Him, He also knows that the spirit of the antichrist described in Daniel 7:25 can cause the believer to FAINT and affect the FAITH of many! This proves to be a key aspect of today in that many cry out regarding justice for social ills and shortcomings of our legal system. Like the children of Israel, some have judged God as "unjust" (Ezekiel 18:25) and have since turned away from faith in Christ and to teachings that promote retaliation, ethnocentrism, and "self-love." Faith just doesn't refer to the belief in the existence of God, but a full confidence in His righteous character and a lifestyle demonstrative of such confidence! In this hour, the enemy will stop at nothing to hinder our crying out to God. Part of the departure from the faith in these last times isn't only a turning away from God (thereby turning to an alternative), but also an ABANDONMENT of the PERSISTENCE of crying out in prayer, and subsequently the HOPE and FAITH of many! Christian author Bob Sorge once stated, "God loves it when we cry out to Him, day and night without ceasing. Why? Because He reckons unrelenting prayer to be an expression of faith. He sees it as a concrete representation of the confidence we have in His intervention. And if there's anything that pleases God, its faith (Heb 11:6)." Adding to this very principle are the words from Romans 14:23, "...everything that does not come from faith is SIN!"

For the believer, we must realize that for the Church of Jesus Christ, this spirit seeks to infiltrate our ranks and create a Laodicean-like environment (yes Laodicean is a word in Webster's Dictionary)! Most commonly we refer to the church of Laodicea in Revelation 3:14-22 as the "lukewarm church." To provide a base here, when Jesus reprimanded the church regarding their spiritual state in verse 15 saying, "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other!" he was NOT talking about being spiritually warm verses being spiritually cold (as commonly taught)! This is where we must investigate the historical context of the scripture text itself! The ancient city of Laodicea – located in present-day Turkey – was a city of great productivity. It was known for being a very wealthy city with a thriving financial sector, a textile industry, and even a medical school! In other words, it was very self-sufficient and on the cutting edge of finance, industry, and medicine (sound familiar????). However, the location of this city posed a problem for its water supply. As a result, water had to be piped in through the main aqueduct pipe (being there was no DIRECT source of water). To the north of Laodicea was the city of Hierapolis, known for its lush hot springs (warm water), while to the south was the city of Colossae known for its refreshingly cool water (cold water). By the time the water was drawn from the aqueduct pipe (fed from a spring known today as Baspinar), it had acquired a great deal of mineral content causing the aqueduct pipe to sometimes clog due to the build-up. The results? Lukewarm water that often-caused residents to experience a sour stomach, resulting in vomiting (hence

Jesus' reference to spewing the church out of his mouth!). In Jesus' rebuke of verse 15, he was imploring this church to NOT be conformed to the Laodicean culture, thereby diluting the influence of the Spirit. This compares to the church of today! We have situated ourselves NEAR the water supply (aka the power of the HOLY SPIRIT) but have not positioned ourselves for DIRECT and FULL ACCESS to the water supply! We have been guilty of using man-made controlled methods (just like an aqueduct) to "funnel in" the Holy Spirit rather than allowing Him a sovereign course! This has resulted in our works being found neither spiritually zealous (hot water) nor a source of true spiritual refreshment (cold water) because we have a watered-down revelation of the Father and the POWER of His Spirit! We find ourselves only NEAR the source when we neglect and undermine the FULL Gospel which teaches the importance of the baptism of the Holy Spirit with FIRE! Furthermore, this has led the church of today to conform to the culture of "Laodicea" by trusting in our material wealth, ingenuity, and even the prioritization of the physical above the spiritual! We have prioritized our racial and political cultures ABOVE the authority of God's Kingdom! This my brothers and sisters is lukewarmness! Where lukewarmness abounds, the spirit of the antichrist is attracted and can produce a tremendous influence. Where lukewarmness abounds, there comes a gradual turning away from the person and character of Christ! Where lukewarmness abounds, the desire to WATCH as well as PRAY decreases, allowing us to succumb to demonic distractions, doctrines, and other various strongholds! When we allow the enemy to steal our "cry" of prayer, it isn't long before our thinking begins to take a downward spiral towards the realm of the antichrist (literally AGAINST Christ: several key examples include believers who do not uphold the authority of scripture nor believe in corporate fellowship at a local assembly or deliberately choose to live immoral lifestyles!!!). The solution? We must REPENT of ways we have personally and corporately allowed this antichrist spirit to influence our thinking! Then, we must purpose as Ephesians 5:18 states to "Be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but BE FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT." We must be baptized in the power of the Holy Ghost in this hour that we would have DIRECT access to the mind of God and the POWER of God, lest we buy into the distractions and deception that is so rampant! We must also purpose to become STUDENTS of God's Word as never before! It isn't enough to just have a casual reading of scripture as we would a piece of literature! We must study, meditate upon, speak, and apply the principles of God's Word! Finally, we must purpose to pray without ceasing! I'm not talking about any kind of prayer! I am talking about prayer influenced by the Holy Spirit where we pray and declare the Word of God (which is the will of God) or even prayer that involves the prayer language given through the baptism of the Holy Spirit (see Romans 8:26, 1 Corinthians 14:4, Jude 1:20).

There is a wave of God's glory that is about to hit this planet with the tangible presence and power of the Holy Ghost that will bring salvation, deliverance, transformation, and healing (physically and emotionally) and make DISCIPLES of all nations. I do want to emphasize this point: The individuals that God will use in this hour to usher in this wave are those considered "unknown" or "non-influential" in the eyes of culture! In other words, if you have been looking at individuals who have a major platform to usher in revival, I'd strongly encourage you to look again and hear out of the realm of the Spirit!!!

Father help us in this hour to take heed to what you are saying and simply be your ambassadors on the earth by operating in the ministry of reconciliation! In Jesus' name...AMEN!
